Regarding His Excellency's marginal note at 16 I have only received two negative replies by telegram. In conversation the Farmers have been very non-committal as to their next year's requirements, requesting to know what prices they will be charged and wishing to see this year's oats arrive first.

- 2. In respect of chicken corn this is at present very expensive being 24/6 a bag, imported from Montevideo but while the present high freightage prices obtain bringing it from England would be hardly worth considering.
- Perhaps.it would be better to attack this problem by small sowings of pilot crops here such as rye, early barley, buck wheat etc. on Farm Station lands and leave the present . importing to the established trade.
- In respect of the Falkland Islands Company paying for and taking all oats recently arrived, the only reason I can see against same is that they did not actually place the order.

 At 2 Mr. Creece (Secretary of the Sheep Owners Association)
 confirms the conversation of the Hon. A.G. Barton (Joint
 Chairman of the S.O.A.) and His Excellency requesting an order





With reference to your letter No. 0779, dated the 3rd March, we have the honour to inform you that 1 cwt. of King II, Rye Seed, has been shipped in cool stowage, below water line in s.s.

EMPIRE BALFOUR which sailed on the 23rd April. We understand from the National Institute of Agriculture & Botany, that the St. John's Day seed is now completely out of cultivation, and that a letter to this effect has been despatched by the Ministry of Agriculture and Fisheries Grassland Improvement Station to the Agricultural Officer in the Falkland Islands.

A certificate of examination in respect of the King II Seed is forwarded herewith, and an extract from a recent letter from the National Institute is quoted below for information: -

This is a rye for autumn sowing and should be sown about the equivalent of October or November in this country, which would over there be somewhere around May I suppose. The seed has not been treated with an organo-mercurial dressing and I would advise them to do this prior to sowing. Also the variety can stand a good spring dressing with a Nitrogenous fertiliser.
