BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of the Falkland Islands, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:-

Enacting Clause.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the "Dogs Ordinance, 1930."

Short Title.

2. No person shall take any dog between the first day of August and the last day of November of each year upon or across any station without the permission of the owner of such station previously obtained.

Dogs not to be taken through stations during breeding season.

3. Any person who acts in contravention of the preceding section shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable on conviction to a fine not exceeding fifty pounds or to imprisonment, with or without hard labour, for a period not exceeding six months or to both such fine and imprisonment.
