VCS Facts are one dog ^{was} quarantined at Happer's Hill outpost from 3rd May to 9th July one dog at Arrow Point ~~from~~ Outpost from 27th June until 27th June & another at Charles point from 4th July is still in quarantine. Before quarantining at these outposts ^{were made} inquiries from the officer in charge of the outposts. No dogs have been ~~with~~ observed near the outposts since they have been established. The shepherd at the Murrel was advised by phone that a dog was quarantined at Arrow & Charles Point & asked replied that he rarely looks his dogs in that direction & would see they did not approach the outposts. There has been no lastly in the quarantine & the time of quarantine has been extended in two cases by 50% of that specified in the regulations & by 1/3 in the remaining case. The quarantine was in accordance with the act & duly quarantined ^{quarantined} the dog have not made contact with any other dogs.

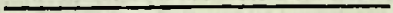

I am directed by the Governor to request that you will be good enough to bring to the notice of all shepherds and others working on your station the provisions of the 'Dogs Ordinance', No 6 of 1930, which reads as follows :-

No person shall take any dog between the first day of August and the last day of November of each year upon or across any station without the permission of the owner of such station previously obtained.

Any person who acts in contravention of the preceding section shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable on conviction to a fine not exceeding fifty pounds or to imprisonment, with or without hard labour, for a period not exceeding six months or to both such fine and imprisonment.
