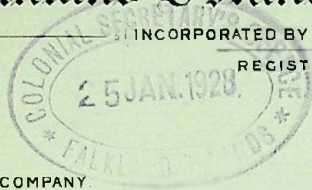


Sir,
