This tree known as Transparente thrives in sand and has stopped the drift of sand where planted.


I enclose some papers and photographs for your perusal which kindly return.



I should be glad if you would collaborate in the following which seems to be of sufficient general interest to merit our assistance.

In June during the visit of Mr. Young of the Falkland Islands Trading Company to this country he agreed to accept 100 samples of shrubs known as *Transparente* which was presumably capable of growth in the Colony according to the information given him. Samples were sent shortly afterwards thanks to Doctor Algorta ex President Rural Federation Uruguay who has called on me and makes an excellent personal impression. He has received no information as to progress of experiments or even acknowledgment.

Could you urge Young to write to Algorta and inform me by cable briefly as to the question and whether Company would be prepared to pay only expenses of visit of Uruguayan Forestry expert stated to be of unusual capacity who has made a life study of these shrubs.



With reference to your letter No. 175/34 dated 1st instant. You will doubtless recollect that 50 Transparente plants were sent to the Government House gardener and I should be pleased if you will kindly let me know how they are thriving. Of those planted by me a number died but several which survived appear to be doing well, though it is too early to say how they will suit this climate. On receipt of your reply I will write to Montevideo.

As regards the question of Don Miguel Jaureguiberry visiting the Colony, I should be pleased to make a concession in the fare if Government consider his visit would be of value and would arrange for his entertainment here. Perhaps this matter might interest the Governor Designate when he passes through Montevideo in February next.



I am directed by the Acting Governor to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 9th of January, 1935, on the subject of the shrubs "Transparente" planted in Government House Gardens, and to inform you that of the 50 shrubs planted three only failed to take root. It is too early to state how the plants will suit the climate particularly during the winter; at present however they appear to be making good progress.

2. With regard to the suggestion that a Uruguayan Forestry Expert should visit the Colony in this connection, I am to say that His Excellency does not consider such a visit to be justified at present.


