2. A stock of all varieties suggested in the article  
by W. Dallimore in Kew Bulletin nos 4, 1919  
was not secured as it was thought better to rely  
at outset on larger numbers of the most likely  
subjects.
3. It was not possible to secure small plants of  
*Populus trichocarpa* from Messrs Dickson. Other  
and other poplars + willows have been sent from  
Kew.
4. Seed of Scots pine, Corsican pine, Sitka spruce  
+ common spruce could not be sent in November  
they will be sent when available.
5. All the trees cutting etc have been placed  
appropriately in gardens at Gov House: arrangements  
are under consideration for taking in additional  
ground for seed beds. This matter will be dealt  
with separately.
6. Copies of 5 + 6 should be sent to Director of  
Royal Botanic Gardens Kew. I should also like  
copies of the two reports for Sir Isaac Bayley  
Balfour who takes an especial interest in the  
experiments + is anxious to have copies of all  
reports regarding the experiment which are  
sent to Kew in order that he may follow what  
is being done. Sir I. Bayley Balfour + Dr. Borthwick  
Technical Adviser to Forestry Commissioners for Scotland  
have kindly undertaken to assist later in securing  
supply of such seeds as may be required.

2,000 Alder (common) Found in a fair condition some are quite fresh, others are very dry and burned up for about 12" to 14" from the apex. The roots are quite moist and healthy.

1,000 Alnus incana. Found in a first class condition, quite fresh and buds bursting into leaf. The roots are quite fresh and moist.

1,000 Ash (common) Found in first class condition, a few are beginning to burst into leaf. The roots are fresh and moist.



500 Mountain Ash Found in first class condition and all quite fresh, some are beginning to burst into leaf. The roots quite fresh and moist.

500 Austrian Pine Found in first class condition, this lot stood journey best of all amongst the Conifers. They are all quite green and healthy. The case they were packed in was very open, and may account for their good condition.

1,000 Corsican Pine Found in fair condition a few in centre of the bundles were very dry and brown. The roots are in a very dry state.

2,000 Scots Pine Found in a very bad state, most of the plants in the centre of the bundles are quite brown and dead. Those on the extreme outside of the bundles were much fresher. The roots were very dry and shrivelled up.

2,000 Sitka Spruce Found in a very bad state, most of them having been heated, the needles of most are falling off and turning brown. Very few have a healthy appearance, the roots are very dry also.

2,000 Common Spruce. Found in a very good condition, except about 200 which were packed on the top of one of the cases these are almost dead. The others are quite fresh and look none the worse of the journey. The roots are quite damp and moist.

2,000 Sycamore . Found in a very good state, very fresh, and most of them bursting into leaf. The roots are quite fresh and moist.

2,000 Birch . Found in a good condition, quite fresh and all of them bursting into leaf. The Roots are quite fresh and moist.

1,000 English Elm Found in good fresh condition, but quite dormant no sign of buds bursting. The roots are quite damp and fresh.

1,000 Wych Elm Found in good condition and quite healthy, beginning to burst into leaf. The roots quite fresh and moist.

1,000 Black Italian Poplar . Found in first class condition, quite fresh and beginning to break growth at the bottom of the stems. The Roots are fresh and moist.

On the whole I found that the seedlings stood the journey best of all. out of 4 cases.

The conifers which were packed at the top and bottom of the cases suffered most, those in the centre near the air holes travelled best. The case that was made more open than the other 3, had the best results. The plants in the other 3 cases were nearly all heated.

The boxes of cuttings  
were opened on 6<sup>th</sup> Dec<sup>r</sup>  
after being taken to  
the warm water after  
by Mr Reid 7<sup>th</sup> Jan 1921.

The cuttings of the Poplars and the Willows stood the journey very well, and were quite fresh, some of them had growths from 1 inch to 2 inches on them. Most of them were forming a callous, and roots, and seemed to be as fresh as the day they had been cut.

---

The Acorns had all germinated and had roots about 2" to 3" and cotyledons about 1" to 2", some were quite rotten and damp, but the most were in good condition.

---

The *Phormium tenax* was in first class order, only the leaves had the misfortune to get smeared with tar the day before they were brought ashore. They were quite fresh and healthy looking, and never showed any signs of drought. The tar was washed off with luke warm water to keep it from going down to the roots.



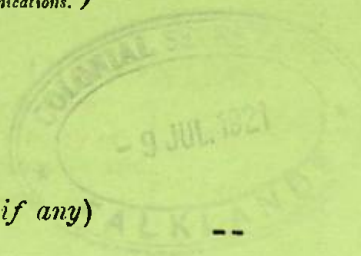

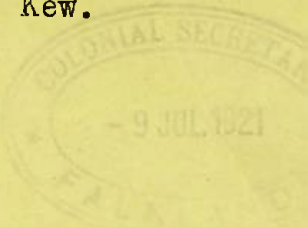
