Note:

There is now a good growth of sand binding grasses
along south shore of Peninsula from a point almost
due North of Hooker Pt towards the Lighthouse + also
at no great distance from the Lighthouse. Specimens
have been taken of different varieties which are being sent
to Kew for identification.

2. There is an accumulation of sand several feet
high (say 3 to 4) at entrance to Lighthouse house

At several different parts on North side of Peninsula the sand prop, sown in 1923, has become established & it is now necessary to thin out the rows & distribute the plants.

2. The Forest Officer has arranged for two labourers to be employed on this work & their additional assistance is required. The Colonial Engineer has been good enough to arrange for two labourers employed in P.W.D. to be detailed for this work on understanding that if weather prevents work of prop planting being done they will revert to work in P.W.D. Given good weather the work should be completed in about a week.

3. The Colonial Engineer is authorized to change wages of two P.W.D. labourers, for whom they are employed on prop planting, to Head XIV, Ann 3 Planting of prop. In absence of Chief Inspector of Stock Vouchers should be signed by O.J.C./C.S.O.
