The enclosed notice was given me by Mr Morrison before he left the Falklands last May and it is intended to apply to the shipment arriving shortly. He told me yesterday that he hoped that the horses would be shipped by the next boat, but was not sure if they would arrive by it or the following one.

2. I also enclose a notice received yesterday from Mr A.I. Fleuret.

3. AS there is no foot and mouth disease now in Chile or Argentine I do not consider that the horses need quarantining.

4. Formerly when horses arrived on a cargo boat they were landed by the Falkland Islands Company in their lighters and I think as long as there is no quarantine necessary this is the best plan .

Extract from Minutes of Meeting of Executive Council held on
the 20th January, 1923.

"Council decided that the horses imported from Punta Arenas should undergo a disinfectant footbath on landing and be kept under observation in the Naval Wireless Paddock for one week, provided the permission of the Officer-in-Charge was obtained. The Horses imported from Bahia Blanca should undergo similar treatment at the port of landing."
