Drains, of 4" Concrete "Open" could be laid at "Right-angle" to lead to outlet according to level of Ground

Framing, to be of 4 1/2" x 3" "Sandy-point" wood covered outside with "Corrugated Iron"

Floors to be of 4" Concrete composed of One part Cement, to 3 of well cracked Clean Stone

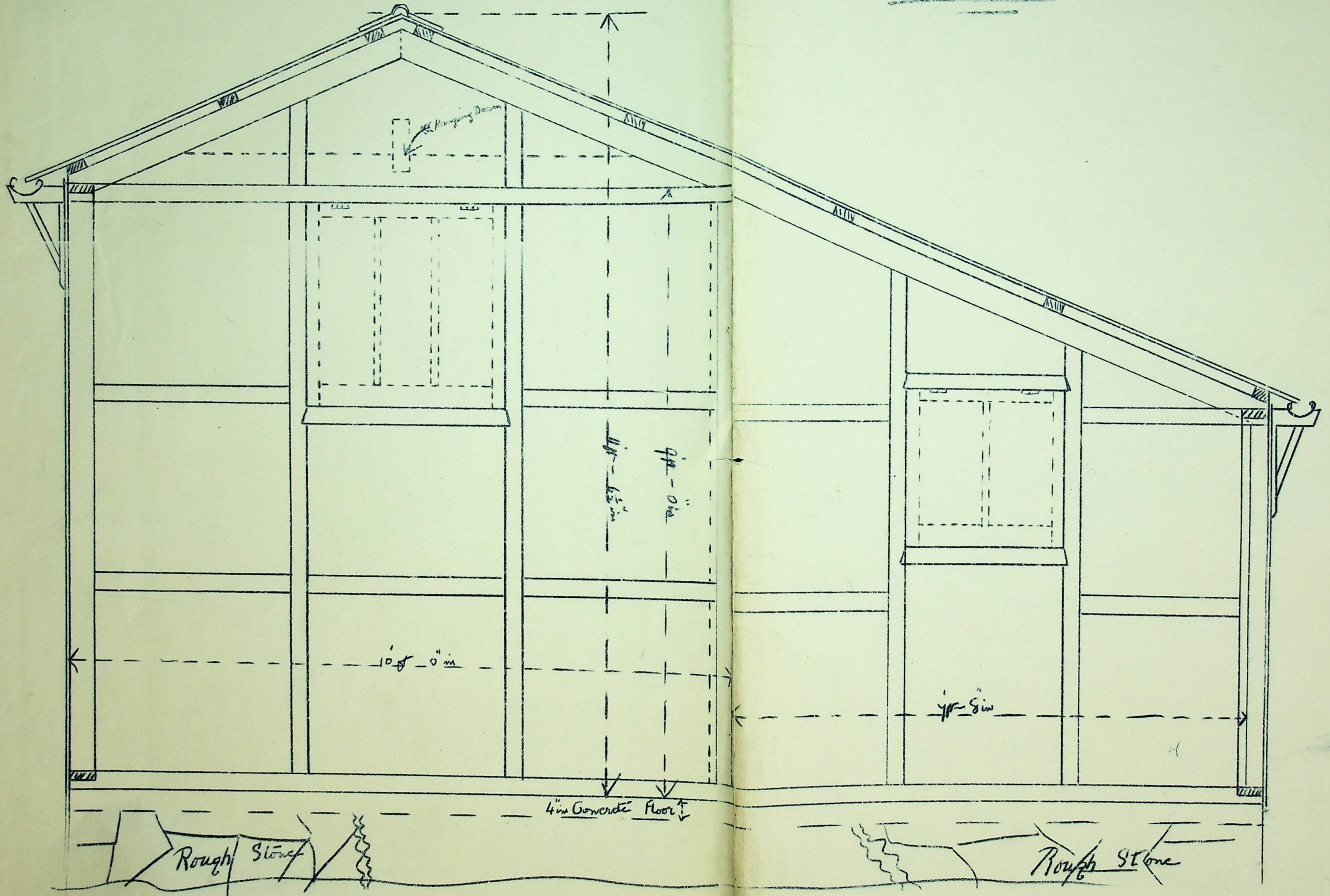

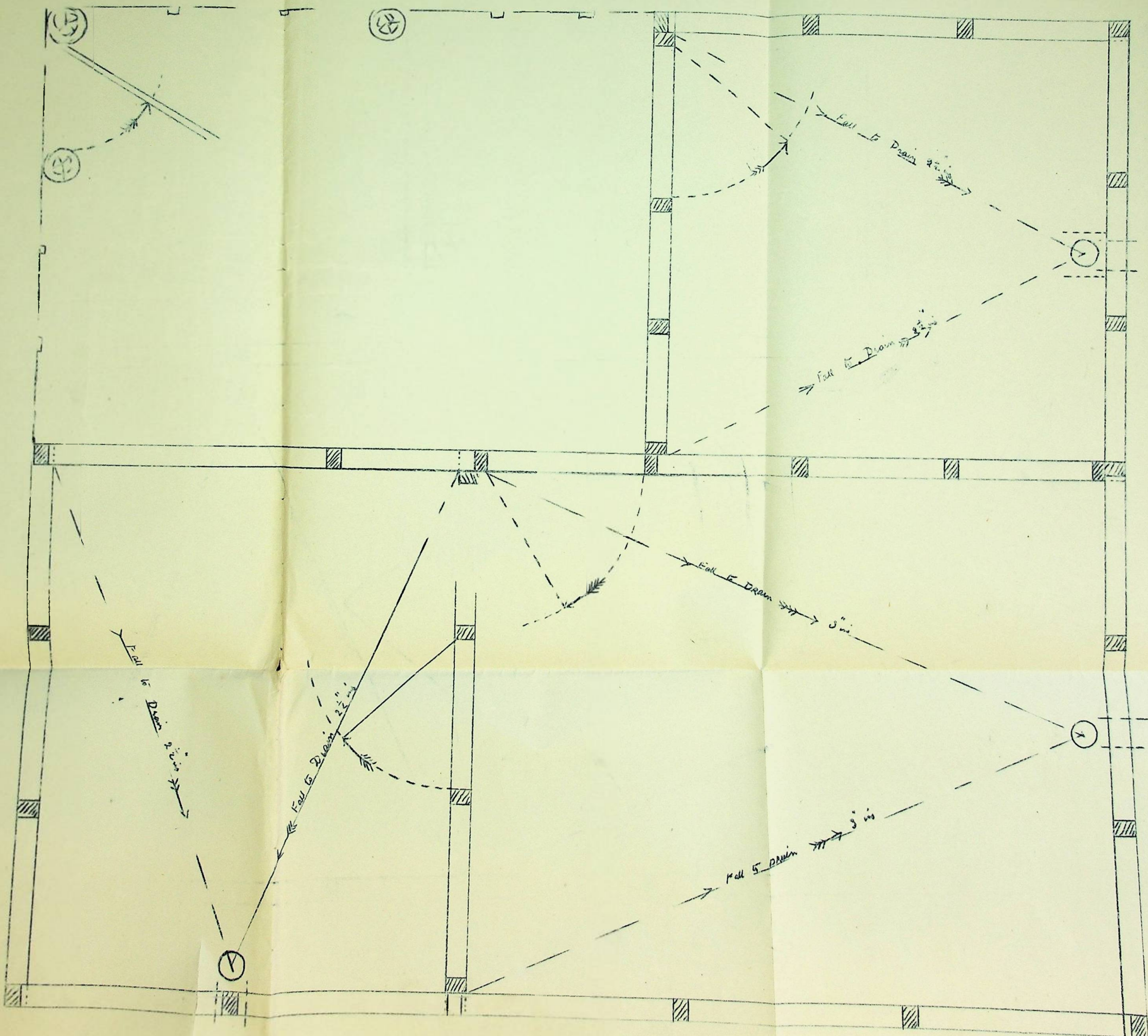
Proposed Slaughter House

Sir.

With reference to our interview of a few weeks ago re the new slaughter house.

I have viewed the site suggested to the East, and taking all things into consideration, the site would not in any way be suitable to carry on business as satisfactorily as I have done hitherto, inasmuch that the position would be very inconvenient from various points of view.

Beef I could not have unless on very rare occasions, it would be a very difficult task to drive wild cattle down there, in fact it is out of the question to entail the risk.

The site being a considerable distance from my residence I would not have the same opportunity of keeping a check on any degradation, as you know is not an infrequent occurrence here in Stanley.

I would strongly advise the site to be to the West of the present one, which would be well clear of the settlement, and even more convenient for driving to than the present one.

I trust you will pardon me if you think I have been long in considering, but it was a matter of vital importance to me and required careful consideration.

Sir,

I am directed by the Governor to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 1st instant asking for a site for a new slaughter house to the west of the building you now use.

2. I am to inform you in reply that if you desire to obtain a site on Crown Land elsewhere than in the locality to the east of the town which has been thought suitable for a new slaughter house, you should send a formal application to me, with a rough sketch plan of the land required. It would then be necessary to proceed with the formalities required by the Lands Ordinance and put the land up to auction after three months notice of the sale had been given. No sufficient grounds exist, in the opinion of His Excellency, to justify the Government in making a Government Reserve for a slaughter house to the west of the town. It is to be observed in this connection that the Government owns no land on the harbour for a considerable distance to the west of the site of your present slaughter house.
