I have made enquiries and find that the sheds referried to are the back buildings and old stables at Sulivan House. To enable the roof catchment to be collected it will require new tanks and gutters as the present tanks are in very poor condition.

2. The pump will be examined and, if possibe, repaired but I would like to state that/the water in this shallow well is too low to enable water to be drawn by means of a bucket then water pumped up will not be fit for drinking owing to sediment etc.; the foot of suction pipe should be at least 6" to 8" from the bottom of the well, other wise the water will be polluted.
