

I am very pleased to be able to confirm that the Dina Khalaf sailed from Poole in Dorset at 8.30pm on Monday September 26th.

She has on board 220 animals including :-

1 Ayrshire bull for Tim Dobbyns

1 Ayrshire bull and 12 in-calf heifers for Claude Molkenbuhr

1 Belted Galloway bull and an in-calf heifer for Kevin Kilmartin

1 Jersey bull and an in-calf heifer for Fenton Hirtle

1 South Devon bull for Ron Turner

and 1 Shetland bull and 5 in-calf heifers donated by the Rare Breeds Survival Trust to be looked after by Port Howard Farm.

There are two goats for Maud McKenzie and two for Giles Mercer as well as 2 Saddleback pigs for Claude Molkenbuhr and 2 Oxford Sandy and Blacks for Susan Pole-Evans.

Of the 151 Romney sheep, 6 rams are for Port Louis Ltd, 8 rams for Teal Inlet, 1 ram for Rincon Grande whilst there are 2 rams and 25 ewes for Osmund Smith, 4 rams and 40 ewes for Terence Phillips, 1 ram and 5 ewes for Tony Heathman and 19 rams and 40 ewes for Claude Molkenbuhr.

There are also 16 Jacob sheep - 2 rams and 9 ewes for Peter Goss and 1 ram and 3 ewes for Tim Miller as well as one ram lamb still to be allocated.

There are 20 horses and ponies on board to make up the full compliment of animals and these have been allocated as follows :-

One Arab stallion for Eric Goss and an Arab mare for Ron Binnie, & Dartmoor Stallion and mare for Osmund Smith, one Welsh pony mare for Diana Turner and one for Tony Anderson.

There are 3 Welsh cobs - one stallion and two mares - which, I believe are for Bill Luxton, and lastly there are 11 Exmoor ponies - one stallion each for Tony Blake, Nick Davis and Ray Rohson and mares for Simon Miller, Yona Davis, Pat Short, Adrian Newman, Marshall Barnes, Ronnie Anderson, whilst luck Dave Gray gets the two tamed mares he wanted for the children.

Unfortunately the Shetland filly which was all set to come out here for Sybella Summers was injured by a bull and made unfit to travel after a farm gate had been left open by vandals.

The ship is due to arrive here about the 25th or 26th of October.

I will be contacting the prospective owners in the very near future about arrangements for the arrival of their animals.

Latest news is that the contract has been signed for the "Diha Kalaf" to ship 214 assorted animals from U.K. to the Falklands. She is due to sail on the 20th September from Poole in Dorset and so will arrive here approximately one month later.

The Falklands Appeal says that the ship has her own animal handlers as part of the crew but there have been many applications from other people who want to accompany the animals. I happen to know that Jim Lellman is one of those people !

The shipment includes 4 goats, 4 pigs, 26 cattle, 168 sheep, 2 Arab Horses, 11 Exmoor Ponies, 2 Dartmoors, 1 Shetland, 2 Welsh Cobs and 2 Welsh ponies.

When I receive full details of all the horses I will set about the unpleasant task of deciding who does not get exactly what they asked for. Lets hope the Appeal can find enough money for the rest of the horses to follow.

The dogs are still due to come out in November. But firstly we have the "Andalucia Star" with cats and budgies which will be here in a fortnight or so.

NOTES ON NOAH'S ARK.

2 Arab horses are due to come on the Noah's Ark - one stallion named Mirific and one mare named Jozannah. These horses were offered to the Appeal by the same person at about £2000 less than the normal price.

Originally 8 Arabs had been requested by people in the Islands - 4 stallions and 4 mares but cost and space limitations in the Ark have reduced number of Arabs to 2.

System of pieces of paper in a hat and random numbers from a statistical table means that the allocation of the Arabs is :-

The Stallion - Mr Eric Goss. The mare - Mr Ron Binnie.

Let's hope there is a chance for the remaining Arabs on a later shipment.

The allocation of Exmoor ponies is not yet complete but all those people who asked for one should get one.

There are two Dartmoor ponies on the Ark for Osmund Smith of Johnsons Harbour. And two Welsh ponies - one for Diana Turner of Rincon Grande and the other for Tony Anderson of Goose Green.

NEWS FROM NOAH'S ARK.

Latest news from the Falkland's Appeal in London indicates that the cats and budgies have just sailed and are being shipped courtesy of the Ministry of Defence.

The main shipment of animals is still planned to leave on the 20th September and if all goes well it will carry 29 cattle, 4 goats, 4 pigs, 167 sheep and 15 ponies.

The dogs will be aboard two successive ships leaving in October.

Unfortunately, there have been problems at the other end not least amongst them has been the cost of the project - and it is possible that no other horses may be sent.

Needless to say I will be very sorry if this happens but will keep you informed as soon as I hear any further news.
