Stanley, Falkland Islands.

owing to a scarcity of pigs in this colony and the expense incurred on imported animals, passing through the port of Quarantine station I would suggest that the ban on importations from the dependencies be removed, and that pigs be imported from South Georgia, without the necessity of passing through port of Quarantine.

Examination prior to dispatch and on arrival in the colony would be sufficient guarantee of general health, and the risk of importing disease would be small, as South Georgia would act as a port of Quarantine station for Port Stanley.

As the managers refuse to dispatch pigs without written authority; in order to facilitate importation, I beg to submit the suggestion for approval.
