Sir,

I am desirous of importing about 20 Rams from Tierra-del-Fuego. on behalf of my firm, for the improvement of the flocks here and have written to the Chief Inspector of Stock to see if the necessary quarantine arrangements can be made for this importation, if they can, I intend going over to Punta Arenas about February next to endeavour to obtain these Sheep, and bring them back in a Steamer belonging to that port.

I shall be glad to know if the vessel can enter at Fox Bay, and if I can clear her from any port in the Islands. I will see that no dutiable articles are imported and that all is done in a straightforward manner.

I also intend bringing over wood, posts, wild mares, tamed cart horses, and should the Government require anything I shall be pleased to quote C.I.F. Falkland Islands for anything that may be wanted.

CART HORSES. Broken to waggon, cart and plough, young, £30. per head C.I.F. East or West, only a limited supply of these obtainable.

Please bear in mind these prices are only quoted provided I can obtain a full consignment of wood, posts and horses for one of their Steamers, and I trust you will give me an order which will enable us all to take advantage of these reduced prices.

Owing to delay which has been caused in communications between here and Punta Arenas, I regret I have been unable to get this offer to you before.


