





The quantity sold is estimated at 57,000 bales, of which the Home Trade secured 29,500 bales, while 27,500 were taken for the Continent. The carry forward of Australian, New Zealand and Cape Wools is 60,500 bales, of which 48,000 bales were not offered.

During the early days of the series merinos were well competed for by Continental buyers, but the Home Trade was reserved and for a time the market was barely steady. Latterly more support has been forthcoming from all sections and closing levels are in slightly sellers' favour compared with those noted at the opening, but must be quoted 15/20 per cent. below September.

In the crossbred section both greasy and sliped descriptions had to be marked down further this week and here, too, rather wider support was evident in the closing days. Full recovery to opening levels, however, was not accomplished and we now quote fine, medium and coarse sorts 25/30 per cent. below September levels on average.

It is not yet possible to say whether the better tone prevailing in the last few days can be attributed to some commencement of a return of confidence, or to the necessity of completing orders available from the limited quantity offered. There can be no doubt, however from a glance at the figures on the opposite page that wool is again at a level which should encourage rebuilding of stocks as well as restimulate consumption.

# BUXTON, RONALD, DU CROZ & CO.'S WOOL REPORT.

### LONDON.

26th November, 1937.

The sixth series of wool auctions for this year opened here on 16th instant, and was brought to a close to-day, having occupied nine selling days at a daily average of 8,152 bales.

About 57,000 bales were sold, including 27,500 bales for export. The quantity of Australasian and South African wool held over and withdrawn amounts to 60,500 bales.

The firm close to the September series had given rise to the hope that the fall in values had been arrested, but as October went on it became clear that confidence had not been regained, and that the adjustment of values was by no means complete. With Japan and America virtually out of the market Europe could not maintain the pace set during the Summer, and with the political horizon still dark business declined to a minimum. It was no surprise therefore that at the opening of the series there was a substantial decline in prices, with competition only fair. As the sales progressed even this level could not always be maintained and the close saw values for most sorts lower than at the outset.

#### MERINOS.

GREASE.—There was quite a good offering of new clip wools from Queensland and New South Wales though the latter frequently showed signs of a difficult season. At the opening values showed a decline on September rates of 15 to 20 per cent., competition coming chiefly from the Continent. This basis was held to the close for the better lines, but ordinary topmaking sorts fell away a further 5 per cent. The best price was 20d. for Victorians. Queenslands made 17½d., Sydneys 17d., Adelaides 15d., and West Australians 14¼d.

SCOURED.—A fair selection was catalogued. At the opening prices for fleece wools were some 15 per cent. cheaper than in September, and this level was held throughout. Faulty pieces, bellies, etc., however, were an irregular market, and with poor competition closed a full 25 per cent. cheaper than during last sales. The best price was  $27\frac{1}{2}$ d. for Queenslands. West Australians and Victorian skin wool reached 25d., Sydneys  $24\frac{1}{2}$ d. and Adelaides 21d.

#### SOUTH AFRICAN.

There was a better show of greasies than for some time past and several well grown Graaff Reinet clips were offered. With good competition these were about 15 per cent. cheaper than in September. The best price was 14\frac{3}{4}d. Only a few scoureds were shown. Prices showed a fall of about 20 per cent., the best price being 23d.

#### KENYA.

823 bales were offered. Competition was hesitating and prices were about 25 per cent. below the September level. The best price was 12½d.

#### CROSSBREDS.

About 29,200 bales were offered.

- GREASE.—There was fair competition for the small quantity offered. After opening 20 per cent. below the September level prices during the second week eased off again, and by the close a further 10 per cent. had been lost.
- SCOURED.—The small quantity catalogued met quite good competition. The better lots showed a fall of about 25 per cent., while discoloured pieces, etc., depreciated rather more.
- SLIPES.—These were offered in large quantities, but met only moderate competition, and withdrawals were rather heavy. Lambs wool of good length opened at a decline from the September basis of about 25 per cent., while the shorter lines of sheeps' wool seconds, etc., fell 30 per cent. During the second week values all round suffered a further loss, and for the shorter wools closed 10 per cent. below the opening.

### FALKLAND ISLANDS, PUNTA ARENAS Etc.

No Falkland Islands wool was offered during the series, and about 200 bales of Punta Arenas, many of these being bought in, so our quotations are on a nominal basis.

Order dated November 11, 1939, amending the Oilseeds, Vegetable Oils and Fats and Marine Oils (Control) Order, 1939.

Now, therefore, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon him by Regulations 53 and 55 of the Defence Regulations, 1939(a), and of all other powers him enabling the Minister of Food hereby orders as follows:—

- 1. The Oilseeds, Vegetable Oils and Fats and Marine Oils (Control) Order, 1939(b) (hereinafter referred to as "the Principal Order"), shall be amended by deleting Article 5 thereof.

## EMERGENCY POWERS (DEFENCE) Raw Materials

THE CONTROL OF WOOL ORDER, 1939, DATED SEPTEMBER 1, 1939, MADE BY THE MINISTER OF SUPPLY UNDER REGULATION 55 OF THE DEFENCE REGULATIONS, 1939.

Whereas it appears to the Minister of Supply to be necessary for maintaining supplies and services essential to the life of the community and expedient that this Order should be made.

Now, therefore, the Minister of Supply, in pursuance of Regulation 55 of the Defence Regulations, 1939(2), hereby order as follows:—

1. No person shall acquire or dispose of, or agree or offer or invite an offer to acquire or dispose of, any raw wool, tops, broken tops, noils, or combing laps situate in the United Kingdom on or at any time after the date when this Order comes into force.

Provided that nothing in this Article shall be taken to prohibit or to restrict the delivery to and acceptance by a person carrying on the business of a carrier or warehouseman of any goods as aforesaid in the ordinary course of that business or the delivery by and acceptance from such a person of any such goods in the ordinary course of such business.

- 2. Every person owning or having power to dispose of or being in possession of any wool, mohair, alpaca, cashmere, or camel hair, or any derivative thereof, shall, upon being requested so to do by the Minister of Supply and within such time as the Minister may direct, furnish to the Minister of Supply such returns and other information relating thereto and to the business (if any) of that person as the Minister may require.
- 3. Every person whose business or part of whose business it is to produce goods of which wool, mohair, alpaca, cashmere or camel hair, or any derivative thereof, is a constituent part, or any articles or material required for, or in connection with, the production of such goods, shall, upon being requested so to do by the Minister of Supply, and within such time as the Minister may direct, furnish to the Minister of Supply such returns and other information relating to the business of that person as the Minister may require.

- **4.** In this Order the expression "raw wool" includes raw wool which has been subjected to any of the following processes, that is to say, the processes of washing, scouring, carbonising, or willeying, by whatever name the process of willeying may be described in any particular district, but not to any other process; and the expressions "acquire" and "dispose of" include respectively the taking or giving of possession.
- 5. This Order shall come into force on the first day of September, 1939, and may be cited as the Control of Wool Order, 1939.

Whereas it appears to the Minister of Supply to be necessary for maintaining supplies and services essential to the life of the community and expedient that this Order should be made:—

Now, therefore, the Minister of Supply, in pursuance of Regulation 55 of the Defence Regulations, 1939(a), hereby orders as follows:—

- 1.—(I) No person shall dispose of, or contract to dispose of, any wool, except under the authority of a licence granted by the Minister of Supply.

Now, therefore, the Minister of Supply, in pursuance of Regulations 55 and 98 of the Defence Regulations, 1939(2), hereby orders as follows:—

- 1. As from the coming into force of this Order the Schedule to the Control of Wool (Amendment) Order, 1939(b) (as varied by the Control of Wool (No. 4) Order, 1939(c), the Control of Wool (No. 6) Order, 1939(d), and the Control of Wool (No. 8) Order, 1939(e)), is hereby further varied by adding at the end of the said Schedule, and as Part II thereof, the words and figures set out in the Schedule to this Order.
- 2. Nothing in this Order shall be taken to prohibit or restrict the entering into and carrying out of any transaction between the Minister of Supply and any other person upon such terms and conditions as may be agreed between the Minister of Supply and that person.
- 3. This Order shall come into force on the 15th day of December, 1939, and may be cited as the Control of Wool (No. 9) Order, 1939.

In relation to items Nos. 42-89 the maximum prices set out above are for good clean washed or light greasy wool, delivered F.O.R. within a reasonable distance, if required. In the case of intermediate or inferior wools the prices applicable shall be in proportion. The maximum prices for willeyed locks; the maximum prices for washed or greasy locks, brokes, fallen or gathered wool and tailings; and the maximum prices for daggings and clarts; shall be in proportion to the prices paid for fleece wool. The expression "in proportion" in relation to the price applicable to any goods has the meaning which is commonly given to that expression in the wool industry.

In the preceding paragraph the expression

- (a) "fleece wool" means the fleece removed entirely by shearing or clipping of sheep or lambs;
- (b) "locks" means any wool other than daggings or clarts which may have become detached from the fleece at the time of shearing or thereafter;
- (c) "brokes" means short wool obtained from the edges of the fleece in clipping;
- (d) "willeyed locks" means daggings or clarts from which the dung or earth has been extracted by washing or by other process;
- (e) "fallen wool" means wool removed from the skins of sheep or lambs which have died a natural death;
- (f) "gathered wool" means wool left by living sheep on hedges or other places;
- (g) "tailings" means wool clipped from britch end of live sheep; and
- (h) "daggings" or "clarts" both mean wool naturally clotted with dung or earth.

# STATUTORY RULES AND ORDERS 1939 No. 1792

## EMERGENCY POWERS (DEFENCE)

### Raw Materials

The Control of Wool (No. 10) Order, 1939, dated December 13, 1939, made by the Minister of Supply under Regulations 53 and 55 of the Defence Regulations, 1939.

Whereas it appears to the Minister of Supply to be necessary for maintaining supplies and services essential to the life of the community and expedient that this Order should be made:—

Now, therefore, the Minister of Supply, in pursuance of Regulations 53 and 55 of the Defence Regulations, 1939(a), hereby orders as follows:—

- 1. Notwithstanding anything in any licence or direction which may, before the coming into force of this Article, have been granted or issued by the Minister of Supply, no person shall dispose of, or agree or offer to dispose of, any of the specified material situate in the United Kingdom: except to the Minister of Supply.
- 2. Every person owning, or having power to dispose of, or being in possession or control of, any of the specified material situate in the United Kingdom at the coming into force of this Article shall:—
  - (a) forthwith hold that specified material at the disposal of the Minister of Supply;
  - (b) forthwith send to the Controller, the Wool Control, Bradford, England, a written declaration stating the description, quantities, qualities and condition of that specified material, and the name and location of the premises or place in or at which it is situate; and
  - (c) comply with any special or general direction issued by the Minister of Supply as to the removal, transport, keeping, storage, disposal or delivery of that specified material.
- 3. Nothing in this Order shall be taken to prohibit or restrict the delivery to and acceptance by a person carrying on the

2 business of a carrier or warehouseman of any of the specified material in the ordinary course of that business, or the delivery by and acceptance from such a person of any of the specified material in the ordinary course of that business. 4. In this Order the expression:— (a) "specified material" means:— (i) any raw wool (including fleece wool, locks, brokes, willeyed locks, fallen or gathered wool, tailings, daggings and clarts) produced in the United Kingdom (other than the Orkney Islands, the Shetland Islands and the Outer Hebrides), being, at the time when Article I of this Order comes into force, in the ownership of the person who was, at the time at which the material came from the animal, the owner of that animal: and (ii) any such raw wool produced and owned as atoresaid which has been subjected to any of the following treatments or processes, that is to say: washing, scouring, or willeying (by whatever name the treatment or process of willeying may be described in any particular district) but not to any other treatment or process; (b) "fleece wool" means the fleece removed entirely by shearing or clipping of sheep or lambs; (c) "locks" means any wool (other than daggings or clarts) which may have become detached from the fleece at the time of shearing or thereafter; (d) "brokes" means short wool obtained from the edges of the fleece in clipping; (e) "willeyed locks" means daggings or clarts from which the dung or earth has been extracted by washing or by other process; (f) "fallen wool" means wool removed from the skins of sheep or lambs which have died a natural death; (g) "gathered wool" means wool left by living sheep on hedges or other places; (h) "tailings" means wool clipped from britch end of live sheep; (i) "daggings" or "clarts" both mean wool naturally clotted with dung or earth; (j) "dispose of" includes the giving of possession.

- 5.—(1) Articles 1, 3 and 4 and this Article of this Order shall come into force on the 15th day of December, 1939.
- (2) Article 2 of this Order shall come into force on the 16th day of December, 1939.
- (3) This Order may be cited as the Control of Wool (No. 10) Order, 1939.

# EMERGENCY POWERS (DEFENCE) Food

THE OILSEEDS, VEGETABLE OILS AND FATS AND MARINE OILS (CONTROL) ORDER, 1939. DATED OCTOBER 4, 1939.

Whereas it appears to the Minister of Food (hereinafter referred to as "the Minister") to be necessary for maintaining supplies and services essential to the life of the community and expedient that this Order should be made:—

Now, therefore, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon him by Regulations 53 and 55 of the Defence Regulations, 1939(a), and of all other powers him enabling the Minister hereby orders as follows:—

### 1. In this Order:

"Cooking fats" includes any shortening, confectionery or other fat suitable for human food or for use in the preparation, manufacture or treatment of human food, made wholly or partly from one or more vegetable or animal oils or fats (including fish and marine animal oils or fats) but does not include butter, margarine, animal lard, suet, dripping, the products known as hard butters or any cooking oil.

"Specified oilseeds" means any oleaginous seeds, nuts and kernels of the varieties mentioned in the First Schedule to this Order.

"Specified oils and fats" means any of the vegetable oils and fats of the varieties mentioned in Part I of the Second Schedule to this Order or any of the marine oils of the varieties mentioned in Part II of the said Schedule in any state of manufacture whether crude, refined, deodorised, hardened, pressed or bleached or any residues arising from the refining of any such oils or fats but does not include any cooking fats made from any such oils or fats.

"Trade consumer" means any person using any of the specified oils and fats in the course of his business in the manufacture, preparation or treatment of any article other than margarine or cooking fats.

2. Every person owning or having power to dispose of or being in possession of a quantity exceeding 5 tons gross weight

of any variety of the specified oilseeds or of the specified oils and fats situate in the United Kingdom at the time of the coming into force of this Order is hereby required to place all such specified oilseeds and such specified oils and fats at the disposal of the Minister and to deliver the same to him or to his order. 3. The provisions of the foregoing Article shall not apply to any of the specified oils and fats which are in the ownership or possession or power of disposal of a trade consumer. 4. Every person owning or having power to dispose of or being in possession of any of the specified oilseeds or of any of the specified oils and fats which shall arrive in the United Kingdom after the coming into force of this Order, is hereby required to place all such oilseeds and oils and fats forthwith on arrival at the disposal of the Minister and to deliver the same to him or to his order. 5. Every person owning or having power to dispose of any of the specified oilseeds or of any of the specified oils and fats situate outside the United Kingdom shall comply with such directions as may be given by or on behalf of the Minister for the purpose of securing that the ownership of all such oilseeds and oils and fats or the right to dispose thereof is transferred to the Minister. 6. Every person producing any of the specified oils and fats after the coming into force of this Order at any factory or workshop situate in the United Kingdom is hereby required to place all such oils and fats at the disposal of the Minister and to deliver the same to him or to his order. 7. The provisions of Articles 2, 4 and 6 of this Order shall not apply to any of the specified oilsecds or any of the specified oils and fats which are not in good merchantable condition. If any question shall arise as to whether any of the specified oilseeds or any of the specified oils and fats are or are not in good merchantable condition, that question shall be decided by the Minister whose decision shall be final and conclusive. 8. No person shall, except under and in accordance with the terms of a licence granted by or under the authority of the Minister:— (a) Buy or sell or agree or offer or invite any offer to buy or sell any of the specified oilseeds or any of the specified oils and fats situate outside the United Kingdom if the total gross weight thereof exceeds 50 tons or have any dealings with any other person in any such oilseeds or oils and fats so situate or agree or offer or invite any offer to have any such dealings.

- (e) Treat or permit to be treated any of the specified oils and fats in such manner as to render the same unfit or less fit for use in the manufacture of human or animal food.
- (f) Sell any of the specified oilseeds or any of the specified oils and fats by wholesale.
- 9. Every person to whom Article 2 of this Order applies, and every trade consumer in like manner as if that Article applied to such trade consumer, and every person to whom Articles 4 or 5 applies shall forthwith send to the Minister a return showing the quantity of the specified oilseeds and the specified oils and fats to which those Articles respectively apply which is in his ownership or possession or of which he has power to dispose, as the case may be, the address of the premises at which such oilseeds and oils and fats are kept, or, if they are afloat, the name of the ship in which they have been shipped and such other particulars as the Minister may require.
- 10. Every person licensed in accordance with the provisions of Article 8 of this Order shall keep or cause to be kept at some convenient place accurate records as to his dealings in any of the specified oilseeds or any of the specified oils and fats together with all books, documents and accounts relating thereto and such records relating thereto as may be required to be kept by or on behalf of the Minister and shall permit any person authorised by or on behalf of the Minister to inspect the same and shall furnish to the Minister or to any person so authorised such particulars relating to such dealings as aforesaid as the Minister or any such person may require.

11. The Orders set out in the Third Schedule to this Order are hereby revoked but without prejudice to any proceedings in respect of any contravention of any of such Orders:

Provided that any licence granted under the said Orders or any of them shall continue in force and have effect as if the

same had been granted under this Order.

12. Infringements of this Order are offences against the Defence Regulations, 1939.

13. This Order shall come into force on the 8th day of October, 1939, and may be cited as the Oilseeds, Vegetable Oils and Fats and Marine Oils (Control) Order, 1939.



There have been no definite transactions in cargo lots reported recently. The last report was the sale in October last of the FRANGO cargo to Sweden at U.S.A.\$160 per ton, delivered Norway.

Negotiations which, however, have not terminated in actual business were recently undertaken, and the indication of price which buyers were willing to pay was £30 per ton. There is no public indication yet of the price the Whaling Companies would be willing to accept for this season's catch, or what price, except the reference above, buyers would be willing to pay.

Whale Oil is at present controlled as far as this country is concerned, and any purchases for this country would have to be negotiated through the Ministry of Food.

Sir,

In continuation of our letter of the 13th January, I have the honour to state that we have now been informed by the Colonial Office that a special arrangement has been made between the Ministry of Supply here and the Colonial Government for the Purchase of the Falkland wool clip for the whole period of the War and a year thereafter at a fixed average price of 11.218d. ex store Port Stanley. We understand that the arrangements for the sale of this wool are being made between the Ministry and the Falkland Islands Company and that the Governor will be kept in close touch with the financial results. In the circumstances it appears to be unnecessary for us to continue our periodical report regarding the market price of this commodity and we accordingly propose to cease the practice forthwith.

2. We have also been informed by the Colonial Office that the whole whale oil output by British factories in the Colony is being bought on a cost plus commission basis by the Ministry of Food here. In the case of this commodity also, therefore, it appears that there will be no free market prices for us to report to you.
