

The Public Health Ordinance, 1894.

Bye-Laws made by the Board of Health for the East Falkland Island under sections 18 and 19 of the Public Health Ordinance, 1894.

I. These Bye-laws may be cited as the "Board of Health (East Falkland Island) Consolidated (Amendment) Bye-laws, 1929," and shall be read and construed as one with the Board of Health (East Falkland Island) Consolidated Bye-laws, 1894.

Short Title.

2. No horse, cow, sheep, pig, fowl, duck, goose or other similar domesticated animal or bird shall be kept within a distance of thirty feet from any dwelling house or in any place where in the opinion of the Board it is or is likely to become a nuisance or injurious to the public health.

Animals.

3. The Back premises of any house or building in the Town of Stanley and the passage or passages leading to the same shall be maintained in a clean and sanitary condition and shall be properly drained to the satisfaction of the Board. If in the opinion of the Board the back premises or passage are or is in a dirty or insanitary condition or improperly drained or of such construction as to render a dirty or insanitary condition likely to exist the Board may serve upon the owner or the occupier of the premises or the passage a notice in writing requiring him to remedy the said condition or defect in drainage or construction within a time to be specified in the notice and if the owner or occupier as aforesaid fails to comply with the notice or with any part thereof he shall be guilty of an offence against these Bye-laws.

Yards.

4. The occupier of any premises in or on which there is any escape of night soil, urine or filth of similar description from any latrine, closet or urinal shall be guilty of an offence against these Bye-laws.

Escape of night soil prohibited.

5. Any person who deposits any night soil, urine or filth of similar description in any ashpit or in any hole or place or digs or constructs any hole or place for the reception of any night soil, urine or filth of similar description except with the permission of the Board in writing or throws any night soil, urine or filth of similar description or allows any night soil, urine or filth of similar description to be deposited or to flow on any yard, plot, street, footpath or public place or into any drain not constructed for the reception of night soil, urine, or filth of similar description shall be guilty of an offence against these Bye-laws.

Disposal of night soil prohibited.

6. Any persons who throws or deposits or causes to be thrown or deposited any accumulation of dust, refuse, garbage or decaying animal, vegetable or other noxious matter in or upon any street, footpath, or other public place shall be guilty of an offence against these Bye-laws. The presence of any such accumulation in the immediate vicinity of any home, building or premises shall be evidence *prima facie* that it has been there thrown or deposited by the occupier of such home, building or premises.

Disposal of refuse prohibited.

7. Any person who makes any quarry, excavation, or hole in the ground of such description as is likely to be injurious or dangerous to the public health or safety without the permission of the Board in writing shall be guilty of an offence against these Bye-laws. Where the permission of the Board is given as aforesaid

Quarries and Excava-

such quarry, excavation, or hole in the ground shall be made subject to any condition with regard to the fencing, lighting, filling up, or otherwise making secure thereof which the Board may consider necessary in the interest of the public health and safety.

Damage to Streets and Watermains.

8. Any person who wilfully or negligently damages or otherwise interferes with any public street, footpath, watermain, drain or sewer in such a manner as to cause injury or danger to the public health shall be guilty of an offence against these Bye-laws.

Amendment to Clause 41.

9. Section 41 of the Board of Health (East Falkland Island) Consolidated Bye-laws, 1894, is hereby amended by the substitution of the words "Two Pounds" for the words "Five Pounds."

Repeal.

10. Sections 10, 12, and 34 of the Board of Health (East Falkland Island) Consolidated Bye-laws, 1894, are hereby repealed.

Minutes of Meeting of Building Sub-Committee. 13. 2 30.

The committee inspected the piggeries at theeast end of Stanley the property of Mr. A. Steel, 13. 2. 30. The committee is of the opinion that this property if in a very unsatisfactory sanitary condition in so much as the ground is all mud, there are no proper pigsties, no drainage, and the whole of the property covered with offal the breeding place of millions of bluebottles.

The committee does not recommend the extension of lease of Crown land as it considers this unnecessary for the continuance of this industry and also because fluid filth would then drain on to the F.I.Co's property.

The committee recommends that the pigs should be kept in properly constructed pigsties.

A pigsty, in the opinion of the committee should be constructed of wood, or wood and iron with an impervious floor sloping from the pig-house to pig yard with a chanel leading into a main drain. The roof should slope away from the yard, and have a gutter to collect water which should discharge through a channel into main drain, and thus flush it.

Construction should be to the satisfaction of the Board of Health.

Pigs should not be allowed to roam at large, and thus convert ground into a filthy, unhygienic state. At present all filth from this ground washes over the main road, and such a state of affairs next to a slaughterhouse is very undesirable.

- 2. The Board of Health requires
 - (i) That pigs be kept in properly constructed pigsties.
 - (ii) A pigsty should be constructed of wood, or wood and iron with an impervious floor (a floor of brick, stone or cement) sloping from the pig-house to the pig-yard with a channel leading into a main drain. The roof should slope away from the yard, and have a gutter to collect water which should discharge through a channel into a main drain and thus flush it.
 - (iii) Pigs should not be allowed to roam at large, and convert ground into a filthy state.
 - (iv) Masses of decaying pig food should not be allowed to accumulate on the ground or in pigsties.
 - (v) The construction of pigsties must be to the satisfaction of the Board of Health.
