

FELL FAMILY

NB: The following is prepared from Falkland Islands Registers and files – there may be other family born outside the Falklands. Unless stated otherwise, all dated births, deaths and marriages occurred in the Falklands and all numbered graves are in Stanley Cemetery. Various spellings of names are recorded as written at the time.

William FELL was born 14 October 1826 in Roxburghshire, Scotland to **James FELL** and **Isabella FELL** formerly **KYLE**.

Ann FRASER was born 13 July 1825 in Culloden, Scotland.

William FELL and **Ann FRASER** were married in Scotland 29 December 1850.

William FELL, age 31, **Ann Fraser FELL**, age 29 and their children **James FELL**, age 7, **Isabella FELL**, age 5, **Margaret FELL**, age 4, **Anne FELL**, age 2 and **Elizabeth FELL**, an infant, left The Thames, London 23 November 1859 on board the *Sunrise*, arriving in Stanley 8 February 1860. [E3, pg 160; H16, pg 468, 493] William, a shepherd from Scotland, was engaged by the Falkland Islands Company Ltd.

William worked for the Falkland Islands Company Ltd February 1860 until 20 March 1867. He started work again for them in August 1868.

On 21 September 1880 the Falkland Islands Company Ltd granted William a lease for pastoral purposes of Bleaker Island and of Halt Island for the term of twenty one years from 1 June 1879 at the rate of £15 for the first seven years, £20 for the next seven years and £25 for the final seven years, payable in advance. [Reg Vol II, pg 141-142]

On 29 September 1897 William purchased Crown Grant 266, being quarter of an acre on the south side of James Street extending up to Fitzroy Road, from Charles Williams for £350 (*20 & 22 James Street? – sold by his grandson, William in 1934*) [Reg Vol IV, pg 229]

William and Ann retired to Stanley in 1897 and celebrated their golden wedding anniversary 29 December 1900. [FI Magazine Feb 1901]

William, age 77 and a sheep farmer, died 2 August 1906 and was buried 5 August 1906 in Grave Ai 173. [Obituary FI Magazine Sep 1906] Ann, age 80, died 20 September 1908 and was buried 24 September 1908 in Grave Ai577. [Obituary FI Magazine Oct 1908]

In William's will, dated 7 April 1892, he left his farm on Bleaker Island equally to his wife and sons John, William and Duncan. To his son James he stated that "*I intend to make him an immediate payment of a sum of money sufficient to enable him to further himself in business as I consider the farm insufficient to maintain my widow and the whole of my sons*" and to his daughters Isabella, Margaret, Ann, Elizabeth and Elliot he left equally any money possessed by him at his death. [Reg Vol V, pg 195-196]

On 20 July 1910 John Fell, his wife Fanny and their three children arrived in Stanley from Bleaker Island and in 1910 Arthur Frederick Cobb was granted a 21 year lease of Bleaker Island.

FIRST GENERATION:

Children of William and Ann FELL:

1. **James FELL** born 8 January 1852 in Ardersier, Invernesshire, Scotland. James started work for the Falkland Islands Company Ltd November 1864 and worked for them until 20 March 1867. He started work again for them in August 1868. On 14 October 1870 James was living at C Chilla Alta, East Falkland. James, a shepherd living at Darwin, was married to **Agnes McCALL**, minor (*under 21*) and living at Darwin, 13 May 1876 at Stanley according to the rights and ceremonies of the Presbyterian Church by Anthony Yeoman. The witnesses were James Campbell and Ann McCall. James' father was recorded as William Fell, overseer and Agnes' father was recorded as William McCall, shepherd. In 12 September 1892 James, a shepherd living at North Arm, appointed William Hope, sheep farmer of Santa Cruz Territory, Argentina to be his attorney to secure for him leasehold land in the Argentine Republic. [Reg Vol III, pg 341] James finished working for the Falkland Islands Company Ltd 16 February 1901 and he and his family departed for Punta Arenas 18 May 1901 on board the *Yorkshire*. James died in 1901 after catching a heavy cold going to the funeral of his father-in-law and was buried in Punta Arenas 13 July 1901. *"We regret to have to announce the death of Mrs. Agnes Fell of North Arm Station, at the age of 58 years, which took place in Liverpool on the 18th of December last, and tender our sympathies to her bereaved relatives and friends."* [15 February 1917] *Magellan Times*
2. **Isabella FELL** born 16 October 1853 in Scotland. Isabella, who was living at Darwin, was married to **Thomas WATSON**, shepherd from Scotland living at Darwin, 23 July 1872 at Darwin, according to the Presbyterian form, after banns by Rev. A Yeoman, Minister. The witnesses were William Fell and George Clark. Isabella's father was recorded as William Fell, overseer, and Thomas' father was recorded as James Watson, missionary. Thomas, a returning shepherd, Isabella and their children Maryann, William and Andrew left Southampton, England on board the *Guadiana* 24 September 1877, arriving in Stanley 4 November 1877. (Thomas first started working for the Falkland Islands Company Ltd in November 1866). In 1889 Thomas opened a shop selling drapery goods and general stores. [FI Magazine Jul 1889] By September 1895 Thomas was advertising confectionery. [FI Magazine Sep 1895] Thomas was reported as progressing towards recovery after a severe illness. [FI Magazine Sep 1906] Thomas, age 62 and a merchant in Stanley, died 22 February 1909 and was buried 24 February 1909 in Grave H702. Isabella died 8 July 1928 and was buried 12 July 1928 in Grave D981.
3. **Margaret FELL** born 19 May 1855 in Scotland. Margaret was married to **Andrew KYLE**, carpenter from Scotland living at Darwin, 7 August 1873 at Darwin, according to the Presbyterian form, after banns by Rev. A Yeoman, Minister. The witnesses were John Weir and Anne Fell. Margaret's father was recorded as William Fell, overseer and Andrew's father was recorded as A Kyle (*no occupation recorded*). Andrew had arrived in the Falkland Islands 23 July 1870 under a five year contract with the Falkland Islands Company Ltd. Margaret, Andrew, nine of their children and four dogs departed Darwin for San Julian 4 November 1892 on board the *Fair Rosamund*, arriving 18 November at 7.30pm. [FI Magazine Dec 1892] Margaret died 6 August 1893 in San Julian, Patagonia. [FI Magazine Oct 1893] Andrew, a widower and farmer living in San Julian, Argentina, was married to (2) **Dempster SIME** of San Julian, Argentina, 2 June 1900 in Punta Arenas, Chile according to the rites and ceremonies of the Church of England by J Williams. The witnesses were Donald Munro and James Charles Robins. Andrew's father was recorded as Andrew Kyle, deceased and Dempster's father was recorded as Alexander Sime, deceased.
4. **Anne FELL** born 16 March 1857 in Killdrumsie, Nairnshire, Scotland and came to the Falkland Islands with her family on board the "Sunrise" which left the Thames, London, England 23 Nov 1859 and arrived at Stanley 8 February 1860. Ann, a minor living at Darwin, was married to

- William COUTTS**, shepherd from Scotland living at Darwin, 3 December 1874 at Darwin, according to the Presbyterian form, after banns by Rev. A Yeoman, Minister. The witnesses were William Fell and James Campbell. Ann's father was recorded as William Fell, overseers and William's father was recorded as John Coutts, gamekeeper. William, age 78 and a retired head shepherd from Scotland, died 22 January 1925 on Lively Island and was buried at Darwin. Ann died in Stanley at the home of her daughter Mrs T Smith Friday 1 February 1946 and was buried in Grave P1314. [Obituary FI Weekly News 7 Feb 1946]
5. **Elizabeth FELL** born 6 May 1859 in Kildrummie, Nairn, Scotland and came to the Falkland Islands as an infant with her family on board the "Sunrise" which left the Thames, London, England 23 Nov 1859 and arrived at Stanley 8 February 1860. Elizabeth, a minor living at Darwin, was married to **James CAMPBELL**, a Scottish shepherd living at Darwin, 19 April 1877 at Darwin according to the Presbyterian form after banns by Rev A Yeoman, Minister. The witnesses were William Simpson and Elliot Fell. Elizabeth's father was recorded as William Fell, overseer and James' father was recorded as Hugh Campbell, shepherd. James died at Camilla Creek, Darwin 20 February 1907, age 58, from lymh sarcoma asthenia and was buried 23 February 1907 at Darwin. [Obituary CM Mar 1907] Elizabeth died in Stanley 25 March 1931, age 72, and was buried 29 March 1931 in Gave A1017. [Obituary Penguin 28 Mar 1931]
6. **Elliot FELL** born 7 April 1861 at Darwin Harbour and baptised 19 November 1862 by Holy Trinity Church. Her father's occupation was recorded as shepherd. Elliot, of full age and living at Bleaker Lodge, was married to **Thomas MYLES**, a sailor from Ireland living at Bleaker Lodge, 4 August 1887 on Bleaker Island according to the rites & ceremonies of the Presbyterian Church by Governor's Licence William Hill Philip Minister. The witnesses were John Fell and Margaret Coutts. Elliot's father was recorded as William Fell, sheep farmer and Thomas' father was recorded as Thomas Myles, sailor. Elliot died Sunday 5 December 1915 from heart failure and was buried 8 December 1915 at Darwin [Obituary FI Magazine January 1916] (her son Thomas was buried in the same plot six months later). Thomas died 4 July 1935, age 81, and was buried in Grave N1080.
7. **John FELL** born 24 April 1864 at Bluff Creek and baptised 18 December 1864 by Holy Trinity Church. His father's occupation was recorded as shepherd. John, a shepherd, was married to **Fanny Maria Grant SIMPSON** from Scotland, 30 July 1903 at Horn Hill, Lafonia, by Special Licence by C K Blount MA Assistant Colonial Chaplain. The witnesses were Duncan Fell and Elspet Coutts. John's father was recorded as William Fell, sheep farmer and Fanny's father was recorded as James Grant Simpson, coachman. [Account of wedding FI Magazine Sep 1903] On 20 July 1910 John, his wife Fanny and their three children arrived in Stanley from Bleaker Island. On 7 December 1910 John purchased Primrose Villa on Philomel Street from George Hurst for the sum of £600. [Reg Vol V, pg 391] John and his family went to the UK in 1914 for a visit which was prolonged by World War I. On 20 December 1920 John sold Primrose Villa to Mary C Hardy for £700 through his attorney George I Turner. [Reg Vol VIII, pg 14] John, age 75 and a retired shepherd living at the Toll House, Mosstodloch, died 30 April 1939 outside the Speymouth Parish Church in Scotland. [FI News Weekly 27 Jul 1939]
8. **William FELL** born 22 December 1866 at Bluff Creek, Choiseul Sound and baptised 26 March 1867 by Holy Trinity Church. His father's occupation was recorded as shepherd. William, a shepherd on Bleaker Islands, died in Stanley 18 October 1895 from phthisis and was buried 23 October 1895 in Grave A56. He died intestate and his father was granted letters of administration. [Reg Vol IV, pg 104]
9. **Duncan FELL** born 24 September 1868 at Darwin Harbour and baptised 7 March 1869. His father's occupation was recorded as shepherd. Duncan, a farm servant, emigrated to Punta Arenas, Chile in 1922.

SECOND GENERATION:

Children of James (1) and Agnes FELL:

1. **William FELL** born 25 August 1877 at Darwin. His father's occupation was recorded as shepherd. Departed with his family for Punta Arenas 18 May 1901 on board the *Yorkshire*. William, a sheep farmer living in Gallegos, was married to **Agnes RUDD**, living in Gallegos, 15 February 1910 in the Hotel Londres, Gallegos according to the rites of the Church of England after civil marriage the same day by Edwin Coupland Aspinall. The witnesses were John Rae Fell and Annie Maria Rudd. William's father was recorded as James Fell, sheep farmer and Agnes' father was recorded as John Edward Rudd, sheep farmer. Agnes died 14 July 1929 at sea en route to Buenos Aires, Argentina. On 21 March 1934 William, farmer on North Arm Station, Magallanes, sold Crown Grant 266 (*purchased by his grandfather in 1897*) on James Street to James Willison Miller, farmer of Estancia Punta Loyola Ter, Santa Cruz, Argentina for £550. [Reg Vol VIII A, pg 333-334] William died 26 February 1950 in Gallegos.
2. **Ann FELL** born 24 April 1879 at Norton Inlet. Her father's occupation was recorded as shepherd. Ann, age 20 and living at North Arm was married to **Evander MORRISON**, age 22 and a shepherd living at North Arm, at 2pm 28 September 1899 in the house of Mrs James Fell at North Arm, Lafonia according to the Rites & Ceremonies of the Established Church by Licence by Edwin Coupland Aspinall Canon & Camp Chaplain. The witnesses were William Fell and Margaret Coutts. Ann's father was recorded as James Fell, second overseer, North Arm and Evander's father was recorded as Donald Morrison, carpenter. [Account of wedding FI Magazine Oct 1899] Evander died from exposure near the Mappa, North Arm 18 July 1901 and is buried there. [Obituary FIM Aug 1901]
3. **James FELL** born 17 March 1881 on Bleaker Island and baptised 22 February 1883 in the house of Mr Kyle, Darwin by the Tabernacle. His father's occupation was recorded as shepherd. James finished working for the Falkland Islands Company Ltd 6 May 1901 and departed with his family for Punta Arenas 18 May 1901 on board the *Yorkshire*. James accidentally drowned 1 January 1903 at North Arm Station, Patagonia and was buried in Punta Arenas next to his father and grandfather. [Obituary FI Magazine February 1903]
4. **John Rae FELL** born 27 July 1888 at Hawk Hill and baptised 31 March 1889 by Holy Trinity Church. His father's occupation was recorded as shepherd. Departed with his family for Punta Arenas 18 May 1901 on board the *Yorkshire*. John was married to **Dora DAVIDSON** (*not in Falkland Islands*).
5. **Agnes Jane FELL** born 17 November 1891 at Hawk Hill, Lafonia and baptised 8 May 1892 by Christ Church Cathedral. Her father's occupation was recorded as shepherd. Departed with his family for Punta Arenas 18 May 1901 on board the *Yorkshire*. Agnes was married to **William BAYBUT** (*not in Falkland Islands*).
6. **Duncan Fraser FELL** born 12 July 1895 at Hawk Hill and baptised 24 November 1895 by Christ Church Cathedral. His father's occupation was recorded as shepherd. Duncan died 31 January 1900 from tubercular meningitis and was buried at North Arm.

Children of Isabella (2) and Thomas WATSON:

1. **Maryann WATSON** born 17 May 1873 at Camilla Creek. Her father's occupation was recorded as shepherd. Maryann returned to the UK with her parents, later to return with her family, leaving Southampton, England on board the *Guadiana* 24 September 1877, arriving in Stanley

- 4 November 1877. Mary Ann was married to (1) **Alphonse Edward Falkland FLEURET**, widower and gardener, 28 May 1903 at Christ Church Cathedral, Stanley by C K Blount MA Assistant Colonial Chaplain. The witnesses were Elizabeth Watson and Duncan R Watson. Mary's father was recorded as Thomas Watson, merchant and Alphonse's father was recorded as August Nicolas Fleuret, gardener. Alphonse, a publican, died 15 May 1909 from acute ascending myelitis of the spinal cord and morbus cordis and is buried in Grave C255. Mary Ann married (2) **Sydney SHANNON**, manager, 20 October 1914 at Stanley Arms Hotel, Port Stanley by C McDonald Hobley, Assist Chaplain. The witnesses were D Russel Watson, Victor J Lellman and Isabella Fraser Lellman. Sydney's father was recorded as John Shannon, deceased farmer. Mary Ann died age 63 from drowning and melancholia with delusions 31 December 1936 and is buried in Grave K1104.
2. **William WATSON** born 26 November 1874 at Camilla Creek. His father's occupation was recorded as shepherd. William returned to the UK with his parents, later to return with his family, leaving Southampton, England on board the *Guadiana* 24 September 1877, arriving in Stanley 4 November 1877.
 3. **Andrew WATSON** born 23 November 1876 at Camilla Creek. His father's occupation was recorded as shepherd. Andrew returned to the UK with his parents, later to return with his family, leaving Southampton, England on board the *Guadiana* 24 September 1877, arriving in Stanley 4 November 1877. Andrew died 26 January 1952 and was buried 28 January 1952 in Grave 1473.
 4. **Elizabeth WATSON** born 30 September 1878 at Cantera. Her father's occupation was recorded as shepherd. Elizabeth was married to **George Isaac TURNER**, clerk, 28 April 1904 at Christ Church Cathedral, Stanley by C K Blount MA Acting Colonial Chaplain. The witnesses were Duncan R Watson and Isabella F Watson. George's father was recorded as George Turner, carpenter. Elizabeth died 25 January 1906, age 27, from puerperal maina and is buried in Grave D689. (John George TURNER's ashes were buried at the foot of the grave – died 30 May 1966 *not in Falklands*).
 5. **Duncan Russel WATSON** born 13 August 1880 at Cantera. His father's occupation was recorded as shepherd. Duncan, a merchant, was married to **Catherine Charlotte YULE** 24 July 1922 at Christ Church Cathedral by John Tyerman AKC London, Clerk in Holy Orders, Acting Chaplain. The witnesses were Mary Layton and F G W Deane. Duncan's father was recorded as Thomas Watson, merchant, and Catherine's father was recorded as George Yule. Catherine died 23 August 1934, age 53, from chronic bronchitis and was buried 27 August 1934 in Grave K1070. Duncan, a retired merchant, died 13 April 1959 in Stanley and was buried 16 April 1959 in Grave S1630.
 6. **Isabella Frazer WATSON** born 8 July 1886 at Cantera. Her father's occupation was recorded as shepherd. Isabella was married to **Victor Joseph LELLMAN**, commercial, 11 March 1914 at Christ Church Cathedral by Special Licence by C McDonald Hobley. Assistant Chaplain. The witnesses were Mary Fleuret, Violet E Lellman, Franz F Lellman and D Russel Watson. Isabella's father was recorded as Thomas Watson, commercial and Victor's father was recorded as Joseph Francis Lellman, carpenter. Victor, a civil servant, died 26 February 1941, age 56, from cerebral thrombosis and multiple thrombosis of veins and was buried 28 February 1941 in Grave L1179. Isabella died 4 April 1942, age 55, from chronic inanition and was buried 6 April 1942 in Grave L1214.
 7. **Thomas Darwin WATSON** born 6 October 1892. His father's occupation was recorded as merchant (handyman outfitter and haberdasher). Thomas, a storekeeper, died 22 January 1954 from lung cancer and was buried 25 January 1954 in Grave Q1527.

Children of Margaret (3) and Andrew KYLE:

1. **Ann KYLE** born 13 November 1873 at Darwin and baptised 10 December 1874 by Holy Trinity Church. Her father's occupation was recorded as carpenter. Annie, age 19 and living at Darwin Harbour, was married to **William HOPE**, sheep farmer of Patagonia 15 September 1892 at the house of Mr Chaplin according to the Rites and Ceremonies of the Established Church by Licence by Lowther E Brandon MA Dean & Colonial Chaplain. The witnesses were ? and Mary Ann Watson. Annie's father was recorded as Andrew Kyle, carpenter, and William's father was recorded as Duncan Hope, shepherd. Annie and William left on board the *Ramses* 17 September 1892. Ann died 18 August 1893 at San Julian, Patagonia. [FI Magazine Oct 1893]
2. **James KYLE** born 18 July 1875 at Darwin and baptised 26 September 1877 by Holy Trinity Church. His father's occupation was recorded as carpenter. Departed Darwin for San Julian 4 November 1892 on board the *Fair Rosamund* with his family, arriving 18 November at 7.30pm. [FI Magazine Dec 1892]
3. **Andrew KYLE** born 11 June 1877 at Darwin and baptised 26 September 1877 by Holy Trinity Church. His father's occupation was recorded as carpenter. Departed Darwin for San Julian 4 November 1892 on board the *Fair Rosamund* with his family, arriving 18 November at 7.30pm. [FI Magazine Dec 1892]
4. **William KYLE** born 8 April 1879 at Darwin and baptised 21 November 1879 by Holy Trinity Church. His father's occupation was recorded as carpenter. Departed Darwin for San Julian 4 November 1892 on board the *Fair Rosamund* with his family, arriving 18 November at 7.30pm. [FI Magazine Dec 1892]
5. **John KYLE** born 7 March 1881 at Darwin and baptised 23 November 1881 by Holy Trinity Church. His father's occupation was recorded as carpenter. Departed Darwin for San Julian 4 November 1892 on board the *Fair Rosamund* with his family, arriving 18 November at 7.30pm. [FI Magazine Dec 1892]
6. **Jessie KYLE** born 3 April 1883 at Darwin and baptised 11 July 1883 the United Free Church (Tabernacle) at Darwin. Her father's occupation was recorded as carpenter. Departed Darwin for San Julian 4 November 1892 on board the *Fair Rosamund* with her family, arriving 18 November at 7.30pm. [FI Magazine Dec 1892]
7. **Duncan KYLE** born 2 July 1885 at Darwin and baptised 25 July 1885 by the United Free Church (Tabernacle) at Darwin. His father's occupation was recorded as carpenter. Departed Darwin for San Julian 4 November 1892 on board the *Fair Rosamund* with his family, arriving 18 November at 7.30pm. [FI Magazine Dec 1892]
8. **Jane KYLE** born 25 July 1887 at Darwin and baptised 13 October 1887 by the United Free Church (Tabernacle) at Darwin. Her father's occupation was recorded as carpenter. Departed Darwin for San Julian 4 November 1892 on board the *Fair Rosamund* with her family, arriving 18 November at 7.30pm. [FI Magazine Dec 1892]
9. **Margaret KYLE** born 29 April 1889 at Darwin and baptised 11 June 1889 the United Free Church (Tabernacle) at Darwin. Her father's occupation was recorded as carpenter. Departed Darwin for San Julian 4 November 1892 on board the *Fair Rosamund* with her family, arriving 18 November at 7.30pm. [FI Magazine Dec 1892]
10. **George KYLE** born 3 September 1891 at Darwin Harbour and baptised 11 October 1891 by Holy Trinity Church. His father's occupation was recorded as carpenter. Departed Darwin for

San Julian 4 November 1892 on board the *Fair Rosamund* with his family, arriving 18 November at 7.30pm. [FI Magazine Dec 1892]

11. **Thomas KYLE** born 9 August 1893 and baptised 5 June 1900 by the chaplaincy of Punta Arenas. His father's occupation was recorded as farmer at Darwin Station, San Julian.

Children of Ann (4) and William COUTTS:

1. **Margaret COUTTS** born 7 February 1875 at Black Rock. Margaret was married to **Thomas SMITH**, carpenter, 1 June 1910 at Bleaker Cottage, Port Stanley by Robert Johnson, Nonconformist Minister. The witnesses were Duncan Fell and Lizzie Smith. Thomas' father was recorded as James Smith, carpenter. Thomas died 1 October 1941, age 71, and is buried in Grave L1195. Margaret died 27 June 1966 and is buried in Grave T2058
2. **Ann COUTTS** born 5 March 1876 at Laguna Isla. Ann was married to **Andrew REIVE**, shepherd living at Port Sussex, 29 June 1899 in the house of Mr Coutts at Cantera, East Falkland according to the Rites & Ceremonies of the Established Church by Licence by Lowther E Brandon MA Dean & Colonial Chaplain. The witnesses were John David Evans and William Hawill. Ann was living at Cantera. Andrew's father was recorded as Peter Reive, shepherd.
3. **Jessie COUTTS** born 13 May 1877 at Laguna Isla. Jessie was married to **Robert REIVE**, age 33, widow and shepherd living at San Carlos South, 25 August 1900 in the Parish Church according to the Rites & Ceremonies of the Established Church by Licence by Lowther E Brandon MA Dean & Colonial Chaplain. The witnesses were William Coutts and John Coutts. Robert was living at San Carlos South at the time and Jessie in Stanley. Robert's father was recorded as Peter Reive, shepherd. Robert died 27 February 1936 in Stanley and is buried in Grave K1092. Jessie died, age 69, 24 June 1946 and is buried in Grave P1324.
4. **Jane COUTTS** born 24 June 1878 at Laguna Isla. Jane was married to **Sydney Markham GLEADELL**, navy, 3 March 1928 at the Registrar's Office, Stanley by Special Licence by M Craigie Halkett, Ag Registrar General. The witnesses were M Smith and F Gleadell. Sydney's father was recorded as Edward Gleadell, deceased. Jane died 6 September 1938 at Elephant Beach, Port San Carlos and is buried there. Sydney remarried (*see (8) (1) Ann Phillips*). Sydney shot himself 3 November 1954 and is buried in the small plot next to Darwin Cemetery.
5. **Elizabeth COUTTS** born 2 April 1880 at Laguna Isla. Elizabeth was married to **Adam SMITH**, age 33, shepherd living at Campa Verde, San Carlos S, 15 August 1901 in the house of Mr Coutts, Cantera according to the Rites & Ceremonies of the Established Church by Lowther E Brandon MA Dean & Colonial Chaplain. The witnesses were John Smith and Hugh Campbell. Adam's father was recorded as James Smith, navy. Adam died 6 July 1944 and is buried in Grave P1277.
6. **John COUTTS** born 21 July 1881 at Laguna Isla. Farm manager, Lively Island. John was married **Margaret MIDDLETON**, domestic servant, 29 August 1924 at Darwin Harbour by Governor's Licence by Alex Moir, Deputy Registrar & JP. The witnesses were Peter Coutts and Isabella Middleton. Margaret's father was recorded as Lindsay Middleton, shepherd. Margaret died 29 March 1948 and is buried in Grave P1375. John died 20 October 1962 in Stanley and is buried in Grave Q1724.
7. **Elspet COUTTS** born 5 January 1883 at Laguna Isla. Elspet was married to **William REDMOND**, blacksmith, 3 February 1911 at Cantera by Special Licence by Patrick O'Leary Roman Catholic Priest. The witnesses were C N Foley and William Coutts. William's father

was recorded as William Redmond, blacksmith. Elspet died 24 June 1921 from tubercular meningitis and is buried in Grave M862. William died 17 April 1950, age 73, and is buried in Grave M1426.

8. **Elliot Fell COUTTS** born 8 September 1884 at Laguna Isla. Elliot was married to **Albert James PHILLIPS**, labourer, 6 September 1907 at Cantera, Darwin District C Rome Hall, Assistant Cathedral Chaplain. The witnesses were W Coutts, Mary Coutts and H Phillips. Albert's father was recorded as Jesse Phillips, retired foreman. Albert died 19 August 1940 and is buried in Grave L1163. Elliot died 6 June 1960 and is buried in Grave S1669.
9. **Isabella COUTTS** born 11 December 1885 at Laguna Isla. Isabella was married to **Thomas REIVE**, shepherd, 7 September 1905 at Cantera, Darwin by Special Licence by Lowther E Brandon MA Dean & Colonial Chaplain. The witnesses were John Coutts and Elspet Coutts. Thomas' father was recorded as Peter Reive, shepherd. Thomas died 17 December 1941 and is buried in Grave J1201. Isabella died 18 October 1959 in Stanley and is buried in Grave S1651.
10. **James COUTTS** born 30 April 1887 at Laguna Isla. Farm manager. Died 5 March 1949 and is buried in Grave Q1396.
11. **Fell COUTTS** born 2 October 1888 at Cantera. Fell, a farm manager, was married to **Theodora Gladys WILLIAMS** 1 July 1919 in St James' Church, Punta Arenas by John Williams, Acting British Chaplain. The witnesses were James Coutts, Jane E Williams and John W Williams. Theodora's father was recorded as John Williams, Clerk in Holy Orders. Both Fell and Theodora were living in Punta Arenas at the time.
12. **Mary COUTTS** born 7 June 1890 at Cantera. Mary was married to **Arthur PORTER**, labourer, 5 March 1917 at the house of William Redmond, Goose Green by Governor's Licence by Alex Moir, Deputy Registrar. The witnesses were John Coutts and Elspet Redmond. Arthur's father was recorded as Joseph Porter, deceased. Arthur worked on board HMCS "Afterglow". He died 15 November 1970 at Stanley and is buried in Grave P1797. Mary died 6 May 1983 and is buried in Grave P1998.
13. **Charles COUTTS** born 13 November 1892 at Cantera.
14. **Duncan Fell COUTTS** born 29 August 1895 at Cantera. Duncan was married to **Annie Middleton MORRISON** 24 July 1925 at Darwin Harbour by Special Licence by Alex Moir, Deputy Registrar & JP. The witnesses were Peter Coutts and Violet Morrison. Annie's father was recorded as Kenneth Morrison, shepherd. Duncan died 2 December 1927 from tuberculosis and is buried in Grave L972. Annie went to Punta Arenas on holiday in 1928.
15. **Peter Tulloch COUTTS** born 31 May 1897 at Cantera. Peter, a shepherd, died 18 April 1950 and is buried in Grave Q1427.

Children of Elizabeth (5) and James CAMPBELL:

1. **Hugh CAMPBELL** born 16 February 1878 at Camilla Creek, Darwin. His father's occupation was recorded as shepherd. Hugh started work fulltime for the Falkland Islands Company Ltd in the Lafonia area 15 November 1893 on a monthly wage of £3-0-0 and, according to his obituary, worked for them until about 1939. As well as being a shepherd Hugh also tamed horses. Hugh died 3 July 1942 and was buried in Grave O1219. [Obituary FI News Weekly 9 Jul 1942]

2. **William CAMPBELL** born 21 July 1879 at Camilla Creek, Darwin. His father's occupation was recorded as shepherd. William started work for the Falkland Islands Company Ltd in the Lafonia area 16 September 1897 on a monthly wage of £3-10-0 and worked for them all his life. William died 4 August 1942 in the KEMH and was buried 5 August 1942 in Grave O1223. [Obituary FI Weekly News 13 Aug 1942]
3. **John CAMPBELL** born 27 February 1881 at Camilla Creek, Darwin. His father's occupation was recorded as shepherd. John started work for the Falkland Islands Company Ltd in the Lafonia area 30 November 1896 on a monthly wage of £3-10-0 and worked for them until his death. John died 21 April 1899 from peritonitis and perforation of the bowel and was buried at Darwin.
4. **Ann "Annie" CAMPBELL** born 19 November 1882 at Camilla Creek, Darwin and baptised 25 May 1883 by the United Free Church (Tabernacle). Her father's occupation was recorded as shepherd. Annie was married to **William George CLIFTON**, carter, 10 February 1914 at Christ Church Cathedral by Banns by C McDonald Hobley. The witnesses were Elliot Fell Campbell and James Campbell. William's father was recorded as Harry Clifton, carter and Annie's father was recorded as James Campbell, deceased shepherd. Annie died 7 August 1941, age 58, on Bleaker Island (*no burial record*). William, a cook, died 25 March 1948 and is buried in Grave P1374. [Obituary FI Weekly News 1 Apr 1948]
5. **James McIntosh CAMPELL** born 4 August 1884 at Camilla Creek, Darwin. His father's occupation was recorded as shepherd. James, a "delicate child", died two hours later and was buried at Darwin.
6. **Isabella Fell CAMPBELL** born 30 August 1885 at Camilla Creek, Darwin and baptised 29 October 1885 by the United Free Church (Tabernacle). Her father's occupation was recorded as shepherd. Isabella was married to **Thomas Henry FRASER**, age 23 and a shepherd, 26 June 1907 at Stanley by Cyril H Golding-Bird, Dean. The witnesses were William Campbell and Ann Campbell. Isabella's father was recorded as James Campbell and Thomas' father was recorded as Thomas Fraser, shepherd. Isabella, the widow of Thomas, died 19 June 1958 in Stanley and was buried 21 June 1958 in Grave P1614 (*no record of Thomas' death or burial in the Falkland Islands*)
7. **Margaret Fell CAMPBELL** born 10 July 1887 at Camilla Creek, Darwin and baptised 13 October 1877 by United Free Church (Tabernacle). Her father's occupation was recorded as shepherd. Margaret was married to **Donald FINLAYSON**, overseer, 9 July 1914 at the Registrar's Office, Darwin Harbour by Alexander Moir, Deputy Registrar. The witnesses were William Campbell and May Myles. Margaret's father was recorded as and Donald's father was recorded as Murdoch Finlayson, overseer. [Account of wedding FI Magazine Sep 1914] Donald, an overseer, died 11 December 1921 at Darwin Harbour from tubercular peritonitis and was buried 14 December 1921 at Darwin. Margaret died 23 October 1943 from breast cancer, age 56, and was buried in Grave O1256.
8. **Elizabeth Fraser CAMPBELL** born 30 May 1889 at Camilla Creek, Darwin and baptised 2 September 1889 by the United Free Church (Tabernacle). Her father's occupation was recorded as shepherd. Elizabeth was married to **Roderick FINLAYSON**, (*brother of Donald*) shepherd, 17 August 1911 at Walker Creek, Lafonia, by Special Licence by C N Foley, JP and Registrar. The witnesses were William Finlayson and Margaret Campbell. Elizabeth's father was recorded as James Campbell, deceased and Roderick's father was recorded as Murdock Finlayson, overseer. [Account of wedding FI Magazine Oct 1911] Roderick and Elizabeth went to the UK on holiday in 1951.

9. **James CAMPBELL** born 15 May 1891 at Camilla Creek, Darwin and baptised 8 October 1891 by Christ Church Cathedral. His father's occupation was recorded as shepherd. James started work for the Falkland Islands Company Ltd in the Lafonia area 28 November 1907 on a monthly wage of £3-10-0 and was still working for them as at 31 December 1913 (his monthly wage then was £5-0-0). James may have emigrated to Punta Arenas, Chile in 1921, leaving on board the *Oruba* 11 July 1921.
10. **Mary McIntosh CAMPBELL** born 26 December 1892 at Camilla Creek, Darwin and baptised 31 January 1893 by Christ Church Cathedral. Her father's occupation was recorded as shepherd. Mary was married to **Charles Frederick SCOTT**, shepherd, 10 June 1912 in the Nonconformist Church (Tabernacle) by Banns by Robert Johnson, Nonconformist Minister. The witnesses were William Campbell and Elliot Fell Campbell. Mary's father was recorded as James Campbell, deceased and Charles' father was recorded as Charles Rippingale Scott, shepherd. Charles, a cutterman living at Goose Green died 30 October 1935, age 46, from heart failure and was buried at Darwin. [Obituary Penguin 31 Oct 1935]
11. **Elliot Fell CAMPBELL** born 30 June 1894 at Camilla Creek, Darwin and baptised 17 August 1894 by Christ Church Cathedral. Her father's occupation was recorded as shepherd. Elliot was married to **William Henry SEDGWICK**, carpenter, 19 June 1918 at Christ Church Cathedral by Banns by J Stanley Smith, Clerk in Holy Orders. The witnesses were Bertrand A Sedgwick and Agnes Campbell. Elliot's father was recorded as James Campbell, deceased shepherd and William's father was recorded as Henry Horace Sedgwick, foreman. Elliott died 7 November 1960 in Stanley and was buried 9 November 1960 in Grave S1682.
12. **Agnes CAMPBELL** born 23 June 1896 at Camilla Creek, Darwin and baptised 24 July 1896 by Christ Church Cathedral. Her father's occupation was recorded as shepherd. Agnes was married to **Archibald McLEOD**, labourer, 17 September 1925 at Christ Church Cathedral by Banns by J Stanley Smith, Clerk in Holy Orders. The witnesses were Roderick McLeod and Florence Campbell. Agnes' father was recorded as James Campbell, deceased shepherd and Archibald's father was recorded as Norman McLeod, shepherd. Agnes died 18 April 1960, age 63, at Walker Creek and was buried 21 April 1960 in Grave S1664. Archibald died 6 June 1987, age 84, and was buried 11 June 1987 in Grave V3077.
13. **Thomas Watson CAMPBELL** born 3 June 1899 at Darwin and baptised 29 June 1899 by Christ Church Cathedral. His father's occupation was recorded as shepherd. Thomas, a clerk, was married to **Marion Anne Elizabeth BINNIE** 19 July 1923 at Christ Church Cathedral by Banns by J Stanley Smith, Clerk in Holy Orders. The witnesses were Thomas Binnie and Hilda Wilson. Thomas' father was recorded as James Campbell, deceased shepherd and Marion's father was recorded as James George Binnie, mason. Thomas died 14 January 1947 from acute cardiac failure and was buried 17 January 1947 in Grave P1336. [Obituary FI Weekly News 23 Jan 1947]
14. **Florence Duncan CAMPBELL** born 26 December 1901 in Stanley and baptised 28 February 1902 by Christ Church Cathedral. Her father's occupation was recorded as shepherd. Florence, a domestic, emigrated to the UK in 1961.

Children of Elliot (6) and Thomas MYLES:

1. **Ann MYLES** born 29 May 1888 on Bleaker Island. Her father's occupation was recorded as sailor. Ann was married to **James Andrew John RYAN**, foreman navy, 1 August 1912 at Darwin Harbour by Special Licence by Edward J Seymour, Dean & Chaplain. The witnesses

were Mary Myles and John Stanley Ryan. James' father was recorded as Andrew Ryan, deceased labourer, and Mary's father was recorded as Thomas Myles, mariner. James died 15 December 1929 at Darwin from heart failure and is buried there. Anne, a widow, was married to (2) **John Stanley RYAN**, widower & mechanic, 31 July 1935 at the Registrar's Office, Stanley by Registrar General's Licence by A R Hoare, Ag Registrar General. The witnesses were Victor Lellman and Margaret Smith. John's father was recorded as Andrew Ryan, deceased sailor, and Anne's father was recorded as Thomas Myles, sailor. John died 11 June 1968 in Stanley. Ann died 14 October 1972 in Stanley.

2. **Thomas MYLES** born 5 December 1890 on Bleaker Island. His father's occupation was recorded as sailor. Thomas, a labourer, died 9 June 1916 from tuberculosis of the lungs and was buried with his mother at Darwin.
3. **William Bleaker MYLES** born 31 March 1893. His father's occupation was recorded as sailor. William, a manager, was married to **Mildred Edith ETHERIDGE** 3 June 1919 at Christ Church Cathedral by Banns by J Stanley Smith, Clerk in Holy Orders. The witnesses were Gertrude Ethel Etheridge and Arthur Earle. William's father was recorded as Thomas Myles, mariner. William, age 74 and a retired radio operator, died 2 November 1967 in Stanley and was buried 4 November 1967 in Grave T2088. Mildred emigrated to the UK in 1969.
4. **Mary MYLES** born 11 September 1895. Her father's occupation was recorded as sailor. Mary was married to **John Stanley RYAN**, mechanic, 29 June 1917 at the Church, Darwin by Banns by C McDonald Hobley, Clerk in Holy Orders. The witnesses were Thomas Myles, Arthur Earle and Margaret A Morrison. Mary's father was recorded as Thomas Myles, mariner. Mary died 18 October 1926 from tuberculosis and is buried in Grave J948.

Children of John (7) and Fanny FELL:

1. **William James Duncan FELL** born 31 August 1904 at Horn Hill and baptised 12 October 1905 on Bleaker Island by Christ Church Cathedral. His father's occupation was recorded as manager, sheep farm.
2. **John Bleaker FELL** born 11 May 1908 in Stanley and baptised 28 May 1908 by Christ Church Cathedral. His father's occupation was recorded as farmer.
3. **Ivy Dorothy Isabella Grant FELL** born 4 February 1910 and baptised 18 April 1910 by Christ Church Cathedral. Her father's occupation was recorded as sheep farmer. Ivy died 15 April 1996 in the UK.
4. **Daisy Malvina FELL** born 18 January 1914 in Stanley and baptised 8 February 1914 by the Tabernacle. Her father's occupation was recorded as shepherd.
