JENKINS FAMILY

NB: The following is prepared from Falkland Islands Registers and files – there may be other family born outside the Falklands. Unless stated otherwise, all dated births, deaths and marriages occurred in the Falklands and all numbered graves are in Stanley Cemetery. Various spellings of names are recorded as written at the time.

James JENKINS was born?

James was married to Mary Jane GRIBBEN (not in the Falkland Islands).

James, a private in the Royal Marines Light Infantry, and his family arrived some time before June 1872 to join the marine detachment.

In 1873 James moved into the Barracks for a while due to a matrimonial disturbance. [B17; 179]

James was granted a judicial order of separation from his wife Thursday 23 September 1875. On Thursday 30 September 1875 Mary was granted alimony of 10 shillings a week from James' pay of 30 shillings on which she had to support seven young children; the eldest was twelve. On Christmas Eve, 24 December 1875, James and Mary elected to live together again. [B17; 120; 176]

- 7. **Arthur JENKIN** born 25 June 1874 in Stanley. His father's occupation was recorded as stonemason and private in Royal Marines.
