Sir,



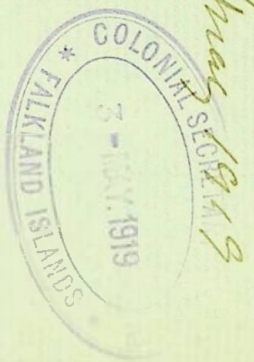
