Sir,

I have the honour to submit the following report on the 87 horses landed yesterday ex m.v. "Lorega".

The shipment consisted of 1 Stallion, 21 Mares and 65 Geldings. They were on the whole a very good lot showing a decided improvement on the previous consignment.

Unfortunately one of the mares slipped her foal on the voyage over, nothing had been done for the mare during the trip, and owing to the condition of this animal I had to order its destruction.

I would like to mention that two race-horses were included in the number one imported by Mr. A. P. Hardy and the other by Mr. W. Flowers. The stallion, also from racing stock has gone to Mr. Greenshields. Douglas Station.
