Owing to the present shortage of pigs (I understand at the present time the number of pigs in the Colony to be 5) I hereby make application for a special permit to His Excellency the Governor, to import some pigs for breeding purpose from South America. There are many householders both in Stanley, and the Camps who have keenly urged me to make this application and these people are willing to purchase the young pigs for their own use and to sell when killed as fresh pork. It has been the custom in the past here for circulating this article of food.


