2. Iron guttering is not at present in stock. The existing wooden guttering has been examined and it is considered that a coating of pitch on the inside of guttering, as suggested by Mr Atkins, would prevent leaking and would well repay its cost.

3. The cleaning up of the paddock also of the inside of the shed has been put in hand and arrangements have been made for the manure and firewood to be carted to Government House.

4. The broken hay-racks were found to be beyond repair and the work of making new ones was put in hand some days ago: These have been completed and delivered at the Quarantine Station. Repairs to troughs, gratings etc. in the shed have also been done.

From His Excellency the Acting Governor

to The Officer-in-Charge of the Secretariat.

The ag. Chief Inspector of Stock saw me yesterday about work still required to be done at the Quarantine Station: -

- (1) The wooden gutters round the shed leak very badly and very little water reaches the tank. If iron gutters are available it should be put up and the wooden gutters removed. Mr. Atkins suggests as an alternative that ~~the~~ pitch might be put on the wood to prevent leaking.
- (2) There should be a general clean up of the warehouse and all old bits of wood lying about the quarantine paddock. These should be carted up to Port. House.
- (3) The broken hayracks outside the shed should be taken to the P.W. D. for repair.
- (4) The inside of the shed must be thoroughly cleaned out.

I think Mr. Barclay took a note of the last three items but nothing has been done yet.

Sir.

I have the honor to forward for the information of H. E. The Governor. I have inspected the work done at the quarantine station by the prisoner, according to my instruction the hay racks have had 2 coats of paint outside, and 1 coat inside.

There now remains at the station 1 grating scraper, 1 mixer, 1 yard broom & 1 sq. faced shovel, 1 cutch I would suggest that all the woodwork round the station especially doors be painted & bolts & locks oiled before the winter sets in.

The telephone instrument from my residence belonging to the Stock Dept. has been removed by Constable Hooley.
