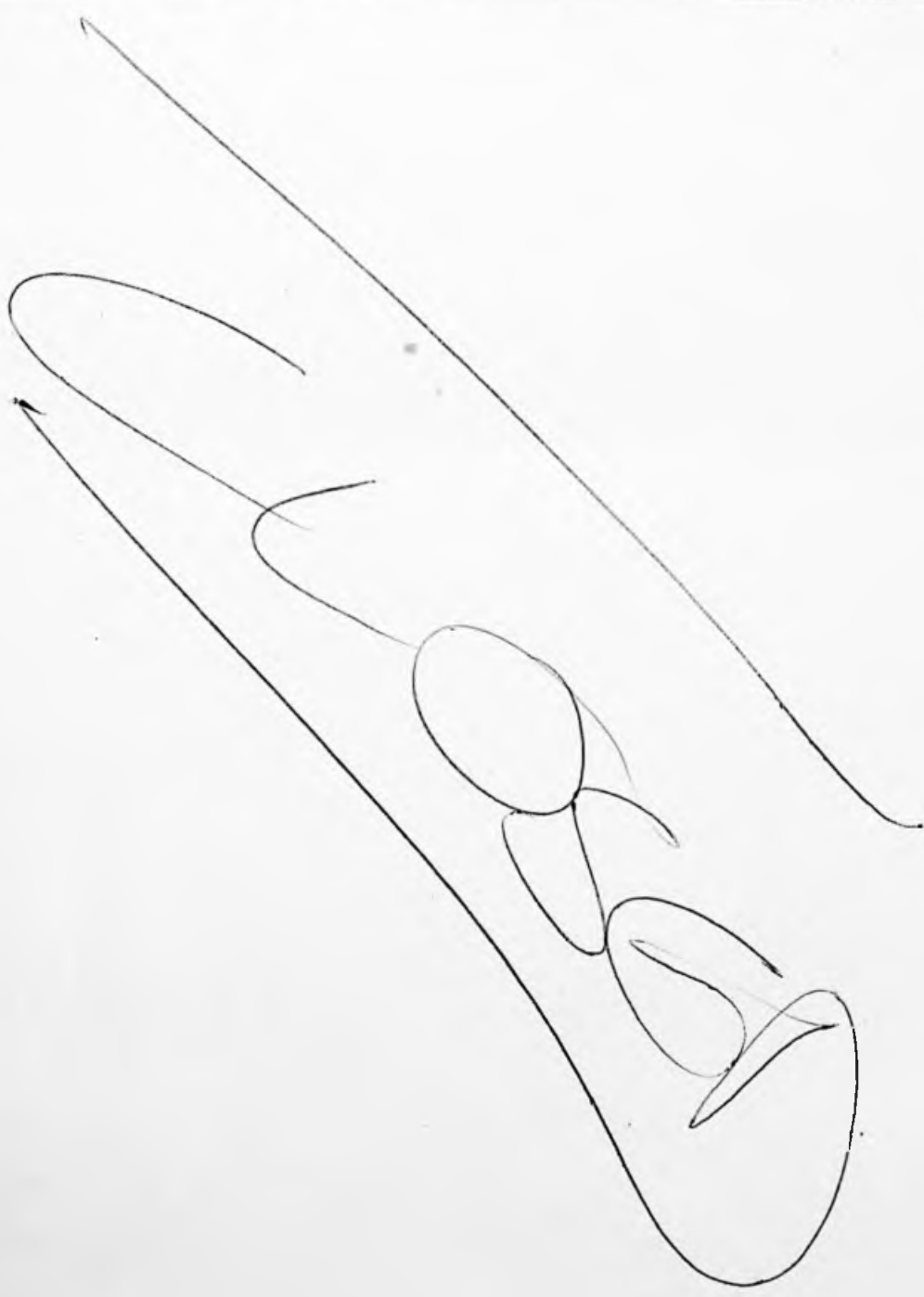


Dear Sir,

Recently Mr. A. Short of Bleaker Island asked me if I thought there was any chance of you or one of your men going to Bleaker Island some time to have a look at a mare there. This horse has been in tussuc all winter and is in no better condition now than when she was put there at the end of dipping. I think the trouble is with some of her back teeth, as sometimes she gets wads of chewed grass stuck between her teeth and cheeks. I expect you would have proper files for horses teeth. This mare is 17 years old and very useful on Bleaker, and should be good for a few years yet if she keeps in reasonable condition.

We would be very grateful if you were able to do something for her, or failing that if you could send ~~you~~ horse teeth files to Bleaker, with any instructions necessary, I have no experience of filing horses teeth, I only presume this is the trouble.

I have a bit of worm trouble here at Keppel, and I am wondering if you can help me with it or if you could send me anything to get rid of them I would be very much obliged.

I have a calf with tape worms short white ones like I had before when you sent me that capsule.

also I have a horse with worms these I would not call tape worms they are brown colour vary in size up to about 2 inches long and one end tapers off to a very sharp point. the horse is fairly old but not in a very bad condition.

I am also wondering if the tape worms in calves are likely to be harmful to humans such as milking the cow after the calf sucking the tits of the cow.
