

Order of His Excellency the Administrator in Council relating to Postage.

In pursuance of the powers in him vested by "The Post Office Ordinance, 1898," His Excellency the Administrator, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, is pleased to order that on and after the 1st day of October, 1907, the following rates of postage and fees shall be in force.

Letters.

Sent from the Colony to the United Kingdom, British Possessions, and Egypt, 1d. per ounce.

To all other parts of the world 2½d. per ounce and 1½d. for every additional ounce, or fraction of an ounce.

Post Cards.

To all parts of the world 1d., Reply Post Cards 2d.

Books and Newspapers.

Newspapers, books, private papers, commercial papers, patterns, and samples, ½d. per 2 ounces, with a minimum rate of 2½d. for commercial papers, and 1d. for patterns or samples.

Registration.

To all parts of the world 2d.

Parcels.
