Sir,

I should be glad to know if you could oblige us by allowing the Colonial Engineer to visit the sites of two bridges we propose to put up between here and Port Howard, for the purpose of advising us as to the best means of construction. One of these bridges, on the direct track to Port Howard, would be about 60 feet long, and when erected would enable the Doctor, or any other travelers or stock to get from this station to Port Howard at any time, which is sometimes impossible at present owing to the streams rising after heavy rains.

We should be grateful if the Government could see their way to assist us in some manner towards the expenses of this bridge as in certain ways it would be of some use to the general community.

Mr Blake addressed a letter to you on the subject of these two bridges on June 19th last.


