Sir,

*With reference to my telegram of the 19th of October, I have the honour to inform you that a Ceremony was held at the Cenotaph on the 11th November, the Anniversary of Armistice Day, on the lines adopted in the previous years.*

*2. His Majesty the King, accompanied by Their Royal Highnesses the Prince of Wales and the Duke of York, took part in the Ceremony and laid wreaths on the Cenotaph.*

*3. Wreaths were also laid by the High Commissioners of the self-governing Dominions or their representatives. I had the privilege of laying a wreath on behalf of the Governments and Peoples of the Colonies and Protectorates.*

*4. The expenses incurred in the purchase of the wreath, including the contribution to Earl Haig's Fund for Distressed Ex-Service Men, will be apportioned as on the last occasion.*
