I have the honour to inform you that the Battle Cruiser Equadron, consisting of His Majesty's Ships "Hood" and "Repulse", and the 1st Light Cruiser Equadron, comprising His Majesty's Ships "Delhi", "Danae", "Danatless", "Dragon" and "Danedin", are proceeding on a world cruise leaving Devemport on the 27th of Movember.

2. The programme of the cruise includes visits to various places in africa, the Far Hast, Australasia, and the American Continents. The ships are due at San Francisco on the 7th of July 1924; and while the Battle Cruiser Squadron passes through the Pansaa Canal and visits Jamaica, the hight Cruiser will proceed via Cape Horn.
