

FACKLAND ISLANDS.

Sir,

With reference to my telegram of the 6th of February, 1929, I have the honour to inform you that I left Stanley for South Georgia in H.M.S. "Despatch" as the guest of the Commander-in-Chief of the America and West Indies Station, Vice-Admiral Sir Cyril Fuller, K.C.B., C.M.G., D.S.O., in the early morning of Saturday, the 9th of February. On the way we met a few icebergs and were delayed by fog so that we reached Grytviken late on Tuesday the 12th of February, or one day after the date scheduled on the Itinerary of H.M.S. "Despatch". We were met on arrival by whaling catchers dressed with flags and were escorted by them into harbour. Thereafter the Commander-in-Chief, his staff, a number of the officers of H.M.S. "Despatch", and myself proce at once in a whaling catcher to Husvik Harbo where the second annual South Georgia sports bear ing was held.

2. The ground was decorated gaily with bunting and the sports themselves were keenly contested before an audience of some eight hypersons collected from the several whaling s

I presented the prizes to the winners in a crowded
hall. I shall not fail in due course to forward
you a detailed account with full list of results,
but I am glad here to testify to the growing popularity of the sports and to the gratitude felt by the
Whaling managers for the pains to which this Government
has been but to stimulate interest in them and to
assist in their organisation. We returned on the
evening of the same day to Grytviken where the
Commander-in-Chief gave a dinner party on board his
flagship to the Whaling Managers.

- J. On the next day Wednesday, the 13th of February, a reindeer hunt was arranged for the Commander-in-Chief and the officers of H.M.S. "Despatch". Heanwhile I inspected the whaling station maintained at Grytviken by the Compania Argentina de lesca which I considered to be satisfactory in every by. In the evening the Commander-in-Chief gave a futher dinner party to the Whaling Managers.
 - 4. On the day following, Thursday the 14th of Febriry, a second reindeer hunt was arranged from partituation in which I was personally prevented being contined to bed with a chill. In the afternoon a footbal team from H.M.S. "Despatch" defeated the winning stains team at the sports and in the evening the Whaling Managers gave a return dinner party on show to the Commander-in-Chief.
 - 5. We let Grytviken for Stanley on

15th of February, arriving early in the morning of Monday the 18th of February. During the passage the six-inch guns of H.M.S. "Despatch" had practice firing at icebergs which they hit every time.

- 6. I can say without exaggeration that the visit of H.M.S. "Despatch" to South Georgia was generally most successful; in particular the Norwegians were delighted to see among them a British Commander-in-Chief.
- 7. In the course of the visit I learned that the pelagic whaling factory the s.s. "Lancing" recently hit an iceberg close to South Georgia an route for Europe. She called for assistance but was able eventually to proceed under her own steam. So great is the shock said to have been that all on board were thrown down.
