Sir,

With reference to your despatch No. 337 (A 7435/8/51) of October 17th last, I have the honour to inform you that His Majesty's Ships "Norfolk" and "Exeter" arrived at Buenos Aires on February 7th and remained until February 14th, when they left for Mar del Plata. His Majesty's Ship "Exeter" left the latter port for the Falkland Islands and Chile on February 20th, whilst the Flagship "Norfolk" remained until the 24th when she sailed for Rio de Janeiro.

2. The visits were, I consider, successful in spite of the fact that the Ships' stay at Buenos Aires unfortunately coincided with the Carnival holidays and that four out of the seven days spent here were accordingly festival days. This made it difficult to draw up a programme as most of the Argentine officials and society, as well as a great number of the British colony, were away from town. The entertainments were, therefore, on a smaller scale than usual but were nevertheless successful and appreciated. As this was the first visit of both the Commander-in-Chief and Commodore Evans, I gave a dinner party of twenty in order that they should meet the Minister of Marine and other highly placed Argentine Naval Officers. The subsequent visit to Mar del Plata was perhaps more successful inasmuch as it was possible to introduce the Admiral and his Officers to many Argentines with the

result

result that a considerable amount of mutual entertaining took place. I myself was at Mar del Plata for a part of the visit but my thanks for most of the local arrangements are due to Mr. Graham, Divisional Engineer of the Southern Railway for the Mar del Plata area, who spared himself no trouble in order to make the visit a success.

3. Some difficulty was experienced on the departure of the "Exeter" for Port Stanley in obtaining a Bill of Health, as the local Naval Authorities at first refused to issue this document on the grounds that the Falklands were Argentine territory. The matter was, however, satisfactorily settled, and I have since arranged with His Majesty's Consul-General that in future, when His Majesty's Ships clear from Argentine ports for the Falklands and Chile, no mention shall be made of the former.

Sir,

I have the honour to make the following report on my visit on board N.H.S. "Ajax" this month to : outh Georgia and the South hotlands.

2. The "Ajax" left Stanley on the 3th and arrived at King Edward Cove, South Georgia on the 11th. A considerable number of icebergs were passed within the last 350 miles of the journey. The danger from them is far less than is apprehended and with precautions the waters present no undue danger to His Majesty's ships.

5. I laid a wreath on Sir Ernest Shackleton's grave, which is well cared for in the Argentina de Pesca cemetery, on the 12th instant. On that and the following days I visited and inspected the factories at Grytviken and Leith Harbour, the unused factories at Husvik and Strommens and the seal reserve. I also spent one day at a reindeer shoot.

4. The weather had been almost continuously bad up to my arrival and though whales were numerous far out, they were not coming near enough to the island to be of the best economic advantage. However uniformly fine weather provailed during the week and encouraging reports were received of the closer approach of whales. The factories appeared to be very efficiently managed and the most made of the material. I was particularly interested/

2 RIGHT HONOURABLE W. G. ORMSBY GORE, P.C., M.P., EECRETARY OF STATE FOR THE COLONIES. interested in the production of guano which should be evailable at a low rate for gransland improvement in the Falklands. The Agricultural Advisor is being given full particulars.

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5. Mr. Hansen who has been managing at Leith Harbour for more than 25 years has no apprehension regarding the prospect of whales being wiped out in outh Coorgia waters. He considers also that the great increase in the number of scale and reindeer will ensure the prosperity of the island. I am not aware of the use to which the latter can be put but the numbers have increased to about 3,000. The very extensive natural pastures of the highly prised tuesac grass should be sufficient to support several hundred thousand. They have also increased in size and are I am informed larger than these in Morway.

6. I found the Government staff in South Ceorgia more contented than I had anticipated and in good health. The services of the office of Clerk to the Magistrate could be dispensed with. The present holder Mr. Melson Jones is very efficient but is dissatisfied with his prospects. I have no vacancies in the Golony and have requested earnestly in my despatch No. 134 of the 20th of August, 1935, that promotion should be found for him elsewhere.

7. Early in the morning of the 17th of January while on the return from South Georgia instructions were received from the Naval Commander-in-Chief on the station for the "Ajax" to proceed to the South Chetlands to assist in the search for the missing party from the "Discovery II".

I had not been propared to ask at once for this diversion involving as it did 1,000 miles additional steaming and the rioks to H. M. . "Ajax" of ice and elmost unchartered waters, when a search of a few hours only had been made, but it was a great relief when the orders were received. I had meanwhile telegraphed to the Magistrate, Couth Ceorgia, to ascertain which factories and catchers were available for assistance and to the Consander of the "Discovery II" enquiring whether there steaming at 26 knots arrived at Isther Hurbour at 9 a.m. on the 18th, the R.Y. "Penola" appearing shortly afterwards. The coasts were searched by boats during the day and at about 6.30 p.m. the "Discovery II" found the survey party. I telegraphed to you an soon as it was established that they had survived and were in good health. The "Ajax" departed immediately and reached Stanley in 36 hours.

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8. I would ask that the thanks of this Government may be conveyed to the Admiralty for the generous and im ediate response to the call for assistance from the Commander of the "Discovery II". I would also take this opportunity of paying a tribute to the Captain, officers and ship's company of H.M.S. "Ajax". I have never known a warship to evoke goodwill to so marked an extent on brief visits. They entered fully into the life of the ports of stanley and Grytviken. The friendship and edmiration of the Norwegian whalers in South/ South Georgia was particularly marked.

9. I beg to bring to notice that the only matches supplied to H.M.S. "Ajax" and I presume other warships by the Navy, Army and Air Porce Institute are of Swedish manufacture. It is I submit objectionable and detrimental to British trade that only conspicuously foreign inferior matches are available on board His Hajesty's Ships. Apart from the direct loss of trade the impression created in the minds of numerous British and foreign visitors is deployable.

His Excellency Herbert Henniker-Heaton, C.M.G., Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Falkland Islands, Port Stanley, Falkland Islands. VISIT OF H.M.S. "AJAX" TO SOUTH GEORGIA.

Pyiday,8th January. His Excellency and party embarked at Government Jetty at 1.15 p.m. and boarded H.M.S. "Ajax" to proceed to South Georgia. A message had previously been received from the Murrel House that the Sea Plane belonging to H.M.S. "Ajax" had made a forced landing in Berkeley Sound owing to engine trouble and that the Pilot had walked to the Murrel House leaving the W/T Operator with the Plane. A motor lorry was despatched from Stanley to meet the Pilot and the ship sailed sand for Berkeley sound at 2.30 p.m. The Plane was located on a small/beach near "Strike Off" Point. A Whaler and motor boat were lowered from "Ajax" and proceeded to the scene. The Plane was found to have suffered no material damage and was eventually towed off to the ship and taken on board.

A course was then set for South Georgia at about 4 p.m. An easterly wind with a heavy sea was encountered and visibility was poor. <u>Saturday 9th</u>. Easterly wind continued with little or no improvement in visibility.

Sunday 10th. Weather very cold and squally; sea rough. Mumerous icebergs were observed in the vicinity of Shag Rocks which were passed about 2.30 p.m.

Monday 11th. Sea and wind abated. Visibility better. South Georgia was reached at 11.30 a.m.

His Excellency was met by the Magistrate, all Government officials and the Manager of Pesca and his wife.

<u>Tuesday 12th.</u> His Excellency accompanied by the Magistrate and staff the Captain and officers of H.M.S. 'Ajax", and Major the Honourable M. J. Stewart visited Sir Ernest Shackleton's grave where a wreath was laid by the Governor.

The party then proceeded to inspect the Water Dam which supplies the electric power at the Pesca Station.

The Station where whaling was in full progress was also inspected and the party then sat down to an excellent lunch provided by Mr. Abrahamsen.

During the afternoon His Excellency and Major Stewart inspected all Government quarters dining in the evening with the Manager of the Argentina de Pesca. Parties from the ship left in Catchers whale hunting. <u>Wednesday 13th.</u> His Excellency and party left Grytviken at 9 a.m. by the whale catcher "Semla" kindly placed at his disposal by Mr. Hansen the Manager of the South Georgia Company and inspected the three Stations, at Husvik, Stromness and Leith Harbours. The Stations at Husvik and Stromness were not in operation but both were in an excellent state of preservation, whaling operations were in full swing at Leith Harbour. Lunch was kindly provided at Leith by Mr. Hansen after which His Excellency saw the Falkland Islands labourers employed by Messrs Salvesen and Leith.

Dinner was then kindly provided by Mr. Hansen and the party left Leith for Grytviken at 7.30 p.m. visiting the Rocky Penguin Rookery en route.

Football match "Ajax" v Pesca l - l

Thursday 14th. A Reindeer Hunt in Cumberland Bay organized by Mr. Abrahamsen was thoroughly enjoyed though the bag was rather disappointing only 4 deer being taken. Large numbers of Reindeer were observed during the hunt.

Friday 15th. During the morning His Excellency accompanied by Major Stewart visited Pesca Station and saw the Falkland Islands labourers engaged in whaling work on that station.

In the afternoon His Excellency, the Captain of "Ajax" and Major Stewart made an inspection of the Seal Reserve returning at 5 p.m. The whole party embarked from Grytviken Jetty at 7 p.m. and dined on board "Ajax" at the invitation of the Captain.

Football "Ajax" v Pesca 1-2. <u>Saturday 16th.</u> "Ajax" sailed from South Georgia at 5 a.m. in fine weather. On Saturday evening a message was received from Discovery at South Shetlands and asking for II stating that 6 men belonging to the expedition were missing/any assistance which could be given. At 1 a.m. on Sunday "Ajax" was ordered to proceed with despatch to the scene. Course was altered for South Shetlands and speed increased to 28 knots.

Esther Harbour, South Shetlands, was reached at 9 a.m. on Monday, where the Discovery and Penola were met. The search was proceeded with immediately and about 6 p.m. a signal was received from Discovery that the missing men had been seen . "Ajax" returned to Discovery at 20 knots to render such assistance as might be found necessary. The men, however, were found to be in perfect health and were taken on board Discovery by their own boat.

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"Ajax" sailed from South Shetlands at 10 p.m. at a speed of 18 knots - fine weather.
