He is Vice-Admiral Sir William George Tennant M.C.B., C.B.E., M.V.O., while 1/2/2 the Captain of the Sheffield is Captain M.G. Markness, D.S.C, R.M.

H.M.S. Theffield is a fown class cruiser, similar to the Birmingham which called here during the War.

Of 12,000 tons displacement, she is 591 ft. long, 61 ft. beam and draws 212 ft. Her main armament was originally twelve 6-inch guns in four triple turrets, but now the third turret has been removed leaving nine 6-inch guns. Then there are four pairs of 4-in. A.A. guns and a number of smaller size. She has six 21-in Torpedo tubes three in a mounting each side.

Completed in 1937, her engines were designed to give 75,000 h.p., driving her at 32 knots. A speed of 32 knots is equivalent to 36 miles an hour on land. I suppose the many owners of motor-cycles in Stanley have been able to find a stretch of road where they can

speed up to 36 m.p.h.: I have found it difficult in a jeep. But they might reflect next time they do, that twelve thousand tons of steel, guns and machinery, can be driven through the water at the same speed.

In appearance the Sheffield is very similar to the Uganda, except that whereas the latter had upright masts and funnels, the Sheffield's afe raked, which improve her looks greatly, at least in my opinion.

Her complement is 44 officers and 688 men. Of course not all of them can come ashore at once. I expect though that they will be given such a welcome here that only those who are obliged to remain on board on duty will not come ashore whenever they can.





War Record of H.M.S. Sheffield



H.M.S. Sheffield is a cruiser of the "Southampton" class. She was built on the River Tyne by Messrs. Vickers-Armstrong and was launched by Her Royal Highness the Duchess of Kent on 23rd July, 1936. A description of the ship is given in the "Sheffield Booklet".

During the war H.M.S. Sheffield had more than average opportunity to engage the enemy and earned more battle honours than other ships of her class.

When the Germans invaded Norway in April. 1940. H.M.S. Sheffield put detachments of Royal Marines ashore at Namsos to secure the harbour and road bridges in preparation for the larger British military force which landed two days later.

The ship next came prominently into the news in 1941 when she was in company with H.M. Ships Renown, Malaya, Ark Royal and light naval forces of the famous Force H. On February 9th, the warships steamed towards the port of Genoa to open a concentrated bombardment of military targets. More than 300 tons of shells were fired, causing great damage and confusion in electrical works, power stations and warehouses. Harbour works were also smashed and many fires raged when the ships retired.

In May of the same year, H.M.S. Sheffield took part in the long pursuit and final destruction of the German battleship Bismark. The ship was detached by Admiral Sir James Somerville, G.C.B., K.B.E., D.S.O., flying his flag in H.M.S. Renown, with orders to contact and shadow the Bismark. Late on the afternoon of May 26th, after aircraft from the aircraft earrier Ark Royal had sighted the enemy, H.M.S. Sheffield made contact and twenty minutes later a striking force of naval aircraft from H.M.S. Ark Royal launched a torpedo attack. The Bismark sank at 1101 on the morning of May 27th.

When serving in the Mediterranean in September, 1943, H.M.S. Sheffield took part in the naval bombardment of Salerno during the operations in southern Italy.

Three months later, on December 26th, 1943. II.M.S. Sheffield was in the Cruiser Squadron which first engaged the German battle cruiser Scharnhorst. The Squadron, which was under the command of Vice-Admiral R. L. Burnett (now Admiral Sir Robert Burnett, K.C.B., K.B.E., D.S.O.) in H.M.S. Belfast, was escorting a convoy in a position south-east of Bear Island, when in the half light of an Arctic dawn Scharnhorst was sighted proceeding at 28 knots in the direction of the convoy.

The convoy was diverted to the northward and the cruisers opened fire, causing the Scharnhorst to take evasive action and proceed at maximum speed to the north-east.

Several hours later H.M.S. Sheffield and the other ships in her Squadron engaged the Scharnhorst and forced her to the south, and eventually to flee at speed to the nearest refuge on the Norwegian coast. H.M.S. Sheffield continued to shadow the Scharnhorst thoughout the afternoon, reporting her position to the battleship H.M.S. Duke of York, which was moving up from the south-west to intercept. H.M.S. Duke of York took up the fight and closed in after darkness.

During the war H.M.S. Sheffield also took part in an important action against a vastly superior enemy force which attempted to attack an important Russian-bound convoy.

For security reasons, the names of British ships involved were not published at the time, but H.M.S. Sheffield's part in this operation is now fully acknowledged.

Admiral Burnett, then Rear-Admiral Home Fleet Destroyers, flying his flag in H.M.S. Sheffield commanded the outer screen of the convoy, consisting of H.M.S. Sheffield and another 6-inch gun cruiser, H.M.S. Jamaica, and supporting destroyers under the command of Captain R. St. V. Sherbrook, v.c., p.s.o., R.N., in H.M.S. Onslow.

- H.M.S. Onslow reported an enemy force of one pocket battleship, one cruiser and six destroyers ar proaching the convoy.
- H.M.S. Sheffield and Jamaica altered course and proceeded at maximum speed. Meanwhile, the destroyers fearlessly went in to attack the powerful enemy force and successfully prevented them from making any attack on the convoy.

The arrival of H.M.S. Sheffield and H.M.S. Jamaica took the enemy completely by surprise, for H.M.S. Sheffield fired four salvos at the pocket battleship before her fire was returned. Hits were seen almost at once, and the enemy appeared to alter course under cover of smoke.

Poor visibility and adverse weather conditions made it difficult for the cruisers to maintain continuous contact with the German ships, but in the half light H.M.S. Sheffield suddenly sighted an enemy destroyer on the port bow.

She immediately altered fire to this target, hitting with the first salvo and continuing to hit. Within a few minutes the destroyer was seen to be in a helpless, sinking condition and the Germans later admitted the loss of this destroyer.

H.M.S. Jamaica too had sighted and engaged another destroyer, which immediately turned away and made off at high speed, being lost to view in the poor light.

The two cruisers then took up the chase of the heavier enemy units believed to be the Lutzow and Hipper. They maintained contact for several hours until it was established beyond all doubt that the enemy had had enough and were retiring at high speed towards their base.

H.M.S. Sheffield and H.M.S. Jamaica then returned to cover the convoy which continued without loss or damage to its destination.

On one occasion H.M.S. Sheffield encountered terrific storms during a passage through Northern waters, which lasted for three days. At times the wind reached hurricane force of more than 65 knots—about 75 m.p.h.

The seas became exceptionally heavy and confused, many of the waves reaching to a height of more than 50 feet. Driving spray formed a curtain which reduced visibility to less than a cable (200 yards). So great was the wind pressure on the cruiser's hull and upper works that she hove to with engines running at the minimum speed to give steerage way. During this time a heavy soa stove in the starboard whaler and hurled an accommodation ladder from its sea stowage to the quarterdeck.

Further seas submerged the for'ard gun turret and swept overboard a section of the roof. Depth charges, smoke floats and Carley rafts were washed overboard. After three days, the storms abated with surprising rapidity, and H.M.S. Sheffield was able to set a course for port.



Captain G. B. H. Fawkes, C.B.E., R.N.

Captain G. B. H. Fawkes was appointed in command of H.M.S. Sheffield and as Chief of Staff to the Commander-in-Chief, America & West Indies Station, in December, 1946.

Captain Fawkes who was born in 1903 joined the Royal Naval College, ©sborne, in 1917, Royal Naval College, Dartmouth, in 1918, and after a period in the training battleships Temeraire and Thunderer went in 1921 as a Midshipman in H.M.S. Queen Elizabeth then flagship of Admiral Sir Charles Madden (Commander-in-Chief, Home Fleet).

Promoted Sub-Lieutenant in 1924, he then specialised in submarines being

appointed to H.M. Submarine M.3 (carrying a 12-inch gun) in 1925.

He was promoted to Lieutenant on 31st December, 1925, and with the exception of a year in H.M.S. Torrid (destroyer) in 1928, served continuously in submarines until 1933, having been appointed in command of H.M. Submarine H.50 in 1932.

In 1933 Lieutenant Fawkes graduated at the Royal Naval Staff College, Greonwich, being promoted to Lieutenant-Commander on 31st December, 1933. Lieutenant-Commander Fawkes was then appointed as Staff Officer, Operations (2) to the Commander-in-Chief, Home Fleet, in H.M.S. Nelson (Admiral the Earl of Cork and Orrery) and visited the West Indies in this ship in the Spring of 1934. In 1935 Lieutenant-Commander Fawkes was appointed in command of H.M. Submarine Otus on the China Station and in June, 1938, having been promoted Commander was appointed Staff Officer, Operations, to Admiral (S/M's).

At the end of 1940 Commander Fawkes was appointed in command of the 8th Submarine Flotilla at Gibraltar until July, 1941, when as a member of the British Military Mission to the U.S.S.R. he served as Acting Captain with the Russian Black Sea Fleet based at Sebastopol in the Crimea. When the Crimea fell, Captain Fawkes returned to England and served for three months as Chief Staff Officer to Admiral (S/M's) | Rear-Admiral Sir Max K. Horton) before joining H.M S Maidstone in July, 1942, as Captain 8th Submarine Flotilla. The 8th Submarine Flotilla which was responsible for the secret landing of U.S. General Mark Clark in North Africa and the evacuation of the French General Giraud from the South of France, operated in the Mediterranean and later from Ceylon.

Captain Fawkes was confirmed in the rank of Captain in December, 1942 and in May, 1944, was appointed as Chief of Staff to Admiral (S/M's) where he served till June, 1946.

Vice-Admiral Sir William George Tennant

K.C.B., C.B.E., M.V.O.

Vice-Admiral Sir William Tennant relieved Vice-Admiral Sir Irvine Glennie as Commander-in-Chief, America & West Indies Station in October, 1946, and is flying his flag in H.M.S. Sheffield. He is 57 years of age and entered the Navy as a Midshipman in 1906.

At the beginning of the late war he served as Chief Staff Officer to the First Sea Lord, in the rank of Captain. He was sent from Admiralty to be Senior Naval Officer, Dunkirk, and to organise the naval evacuation under the late Admiral Sir Bertram Ramsey, K.C.B., K.B.E., M.V.O. (then Flag Officer-in-Charge, Dover). He crossed the Channel and was among the last to leave France. For his services in this operation he was awarded the C.B.

After Dunkirk, Captain Tennant took Command of H.M.S. Repulse and he was in this battleship when she was sunk by the Japanese in the Pacific in December, 1941.

On promotion to Rear-Admiral in February, 1942, he became Rear-Admiral Commanding the Fourth Cruiser Squadron, and while in this command he was appointed Second-in-Command, Eastern Fleet in January, 1943.

He returned to the European theatre in 1944, and in connection with the invasion of Normandy planned operations Mulberry and Pluto, the names given to the construction of the artificial harbours and shelters, and the force supplying fuel to the Armies, respectively. For his distinguished services in these operations, he was awarded the C.B.E.

In October of that year Rear-Admiral Tennant became Flag Officer Levant and Eastern Mediterranean and he was promoted Vice-Admiral in July 1945. He was created a Knight Commander of the Bath in December, 1945, for outstanding services in the war in Europe.

He has been awarded the Legion of Merit, Degree of Commander, by the President of the U.S.A. for Services in the Mediterranean to the Allied Cause.

Sir,

I have the honour to inform Your Excellency that I have received a letter from the Naval Attaché, Brazil, concerning the visit of one of my cruisers and quoting the report of the local Consul. This report, while saying what a success the visit was and how much it was appreciated ended by talking of "the appalling cost of living in his port" and says finally of the British residents that "it will be realised that such a visit will make a hole in their budget which will take months of drastic economy to remedy".

This I need hardly explain is the very last effect that I wish my ships to produce.

The station extends from Pole to Pole and there may recently have been in some ports, where the White Ensign had not been seen for 7 or 8 years, extra impetus to entertaining. In the case of Trinidad and Jamaica, frequent visits will be made and to most other ports visits of a routine nature will now take place annually and biennially. While ships will do some small degree of entertaining onboard as part of their duty and their pleasure, they will not wish to be given any lavish entertainment as hore beyond the means of the local communities.

I shall be very grateful if you will report direct to me with the least possible delay any case which arises in the future of a visit of a ship of my squadron being a financial burden to the inhabitants of a port they visit.



Commander vessel named after fueling to capacity at Montevideo leaves there with maximum endurance 18 days in calm weather at ll½ repeat ll½ knots which will be reduced by heavy weather and additional allowance must be made for raising steam in harbour for distilling in bad weather i.e. On arrival Stanley will have only l4 days fuel in hand.

- 2. It will thus be appreciated that margin for first stage programme is very narrow. I suggest therefore and request that you will support with Admiralty that tanker "Gold Ranger" due Stanley 28th be detained here till mid-February leaving in company "Snipe". She could then join me at Deception should we have encountered bad weather and be running short of fuel, and will also be available to refuel "Snipe" for second stage my tour and again on return prior to departure. This will require some slight modification "Gold Ranger's" programme as detailed in C. in C.'s signal 041601 December to Admiralty.
- 3. Other considerations apart it would be politically most embarrassing had we to be taken intow by Argentine or Chilian vessel.
