PROVISION OF 12 PDR. GUN TO BE SITED AT MOUNT LOW TO PREVENT ENTRY OF HOSTILE VESSELS INTO BERKELEY SOUND.

MINUTES.

Extract from analysis of the Exercise carried out by H. M. Ships "Exeter" and "Ajax" and the F. Is. Defence Force, on 9th and 10th November, 1938.

- 51. Sheltered waters and landing places in the vicinity of Berkeley Sound should be rendered unsafe for hostile ships by the placing of a suitable gun in a position to command these places.
- 63. Entry into Berkeley Sound is not however guarded against, and a gun is required there to prevent a raider from hoisting out boats or recovering air-craft.

Subject to Treasury approval of transfer of gun and mounting, Admiralty recommend our chase outfit of ammunition, comprising 200 rounds of H.E. D.A. ammunition fuze No. 45 P. plus 50 tounds of practice ammunition, which could be supplied by Admiralty at approximate cost of £743 exclusive of transport charges and freight. Do you concur?

With reference to signal from the Commodore, South America, dated 2130/12/11/38, I am to inform you that the Treasury have approved of the grant of a 12 pounder 12 cwt. gun on a P.1*mounting to the Government of the Falkland Islands as a free gift for installation to cover the waters of Berkeley Sound. There are two Q.F. 12 pounder 12 cwt. guns and P.1* mountings at Port Stanley and one of these should be allocated for this purpose.

2. It is recommended that an outfit of ammunition consisting of 200 rounds of H.E. shell with No.45 P fuzes and 50 rounds of practice ammunition together with the necessary fuzes etc. should be supplied at an approximate cost of £743 inclusive of 12% Departmental Expenses, but exclusive of 5% surcharge, transport and freight charges. The Colonial Office and the Governor of the Falkland Islands have concurred in this recommendation.
