2. In Home units - Infantry. Captains who are not Company Commanders, Lieutenants & 2/Lieut. wear "plus fours". Captains Commanding Companies & Field Officers wear breeches & spurs. I suggest for the F. I. D. F. that all officers from the rank of Capt to that of 2/Lieut. should wear "plus fours" & that only Field Officers wear breeches & spurs.

If however His Excellency prefers complete uniformity I would rather see all officers in plus fours as breeches to me are very uncomfortable to march in & we are seldom if ever mounted.

The blue uniform uniform to remain as at present as it gives more finish to the uniform & all officers will wear spurs.


