I am directed to communicate to you the terms upon which a number of volunteers for service in His Majesty's Forces have been calisted in this Colony.

2. The Government considered that it was imperative that the garrison of the Falkland Islands should be strengthened temporarily by an overseas contingent with some military training, to meet an impending contingency. An offer of service from a number of British subjects in the Argentine was therefore gladly accepted. For the reasons set forth below the maximum term of service has been fixed at six months.

3. The contingent which arrived on the 27th of September was composed almost entirely of members recently belonging to Officers Training Corps and ex regulars, all of whom would in the ordinary course be eligible for commissions and there can be no doubt that their services will be so sought for at a later date in a wider field. For this reason the Governor has approved of their enlistment in the Defence Force for a period of six months only (subject to boat sailings).

4. As His Excellency does not consider that it would be justifiable to retain the contingent in the Colony for any length of time after the danger of an early attack has passed, an undertaking has been given that the members of the party will be released from duty/ duty in the Colony after three months if circumstances so warrant.

If they are not present when called up, explanations may be required as to the reason.

In order to avoid possible complications I suggest that it is advisable to ask the Governor of the Falkland Islands to release them from their engagement in his Defence Force and return them here before the end of November.

Replacements for them could be found immediately.
