Referring to your (2) on MP 189/42 the previous awards, as far as I can ascertain, ignored any "Camp" members and were based on length of service as laid down, attendance at a minimum of 12 drills per annum and qualifying for a 2nd Class in musketry. This, even for the members of the Force in Stanley, does not, to my mind, give an acid test of "efficiency" but the more serious aspect is the bar thereby created for Camp members.

- 2. The problem of finding any hard and fast test was so great that I called into conference my Unit Commanders (i.e. 0.0s Mounted Infantry, Artillery and Infantry) with the Adjutant. As a result, we came to the conclusion that a general standard for the Force would be unfair, as it would be either too simple for the Stanley members or too hard for the Camp members. A different test for each unit was not practicable as there are a number of Camp men now in Stanley and vice versa, and men were originally gumners are now Infantry men.
- 3. After most careful consideration, the conclusion reached that, despite its weaknesses, the only test that would be fai and practicable was that of recommendation by me in consultation, and on the advice of, Unit Commanders and the Adjutant
- l. It is therefore submitted that the awards be made on the recommendation of the Commanding Officer in consultation will and on the advice of, the Unit Commanders and the Adjutant that the names of any men not recommended, together with more their being omitted, should be sent in to His Excellent at the same time. It is submitted that this proposal, if approved, be drafted as an order in Council.







It has been decided that warrant officers, non-commissioned officers and men of the Territorial Army and of the Supplementary Reserve who were serving in the Territorial Army (including the Territorial Army Reserve) or Supplementary Reserve Categories A and B, on 2nd September, 1939, and who were embodied or called out for service under army Order 158 of 1939 shall be allowed to count embodied service during the present war two-fold as qualifying service towards the award of the Efficiency Medal and of the two clasps thereto.
- 2. In the case of these warrant officers, non-commissioned officers and men, service in the ranks with any of his hajesty's forces during the present war, which is of not less than two menths in each calendar year, till be allowed to count as the equivalent of two ennual "trainings", but not more than two "trainings" (including equivalent service) shall be reckened in any one calendar year for the purpose of this Arry Order.
- 3. Continuity of qualifying service will be admitted in the case of any of those marrant officers, non-commissional officers and non, who, having been discharged from the Territorial Army or from the Supplement ry Reserve, during the present war by reason of wounds or illness contracted on service, subsequently during the present period of embodiment, voluntarily re-enlist into the Territorial Army after recovery.
- 4. The necessary amendments to Territorial Army Regulations, 1936, and to Supplementary Reserve Regulations, 1939, will be made in due course.

GEORGE THE SIXTH, by the Grace of God, of Great Britain, Ireland and the British Dominions beyond the Seas, King, Defender of the Faith, Emperor of India, to all to whom these Presents may come, Greeting!

Whereas His late Majesty King George V, by a Warrant under His Sign Manual dated the 23rd day of September, 1930\*, was pleased to make, ordain and establish rules and ordinances for the governance of The Efficiency Medal, reserving for Himself, His Heirs and Successors full power of annulling, altering, abrogating, augmenting, interpreting or dispensing with those rules and ordinances, or any part thereof, by a notification under Royal Sign Manual;

AND WHEREAS WE deem it expedient to make further provision regarding the conditions under which The Efficiency Medal and Clasps shall be awarded;

Our Will and Pleasure is that officers who are serving or who have served as such on the active list of any of our Armed Forces during the present Emergency and who were, on the 2nd September, 1939, serving as officers, warrant officers, iton-commissioned officers, men, or auxiliaries, on the active list of Our Territorial Army or of Our Auxiliary Territorial Service, or of any Auxiliary Military Forces raised in Our Indian Empire, Burma, any of Our Colonies, any Territory under Our Protection, or in any other part of Our Dominions Our Government whereof shall so desire, or in any Territory under Our Protection administered by Us in such Government, and were embodied or called up for service, shall, until Our Further Will and Pleasure be made known, and subject in other respects to the conditions laid down in the Warrant of 23rd September, 1930 (as subsequently amended), be eligible for the award of The Efficiency Medal and Clasps, and be allowed to reckon their service as officers as qualifying service for the

Medal and Clasps, except that officers who before the 2nd September, 1939, had qualified for the award of The Efficiency Decoration shall not be eligible for the Medal and Clasps unless they are qualified the terms of the Warrant of 23rd September, 1930.

Our Further Will and Pleasure is that officers as aforesaid, who were serving as warrant officers, non-commissioned officers or men of Our Supplementary Reserve, Category A or B, on 2nd September, 1939, and who were embodied or called up for service in accordance with Army Order 158 of 1939 shall until Our Further Will and Pleasure be made known, and subject in other respects to the conditions laid down in the Warrant of 23rd September, 1930, be eligible for The Efficiency Medal and Clasps and be allowed to reckon their service as officers as qualifying service therefor.

OUR FURTHER WILL AND PLEASURE IS that any person who under the terms of this Our Warrant receives an Efficiency Medal or Clasps and is or subsequently becomes entitled to an Efficiency Decoration shall not be permitted to wear such medal or clasps with The Efficiency Decoration, except under the conditions laid down in the Warrant of 23rd September, 1930.

Given at Our Court of St. James's, this 10th day of May, in the tenth year of Our Reign, and in the year of Our Lord one thousand nine hundred and forty-six.

My Saving Telegram No. 63 of 28th July.

I have had under consideration the question of counting twofold as qualifying service for the Efficiency Decoration and Efficiency Medal the embodied service rendered during the late war by members of the Colonial Auxiliary Forces. In this connection, I enclose copies of Army Orders 17 and 18 of 1942, in which you will observe that the Army Council have given approval for war-time service performed by members of the Territorial Army during their embodiment, to count as twofold for the earning of these awards. The period during which such qualifying service counts as twofold reckons from the 2nd of September, 1939 to the actual date of disembodiment of the individual concerned.

In order that similar embodied service performed by members of the Colonial Auxiliary Forces may count twofold, I should be glad if you will amend your Regulations for the Efficiency Decoration and Medal accordingly.

I further enclose for your information a copy of the Royal Warrant (Army Order 73 of 1946) which amends the provisions of the Royal

I am writing this on behalf of C. Andreasen Esq. to enquire whether me may be entitled to receive an Efficiency Award. His record is as follows; In 1909 he joined the F.I. Volunteer Force. He was the senior private in charge on Sapper's Hill during the Battle of the Falklands on December 8th. 1914. For his services on this occasion he received a gold watch from the Admiralty and was presented with a five pound note by Admiral Sturdee. The enclosed testimonial from H.E. the Commander-in-Chief was read at a parade of the Corps and given to Mr. Andreasen.

In 1938 he received a Commission and with the labe Major R. Greenshields he helped to organise and train the mounted detachment of the Defence Force in camps at Douglas Station. In 1948 after 39 years service in the Force he was retired on account of his age. He has received the following Decorations: in 1914 a Silver Badge with name inscribed, in 1929 the Long Service Medal and in 1953 the Defence Medal.
