It has been the practice to approve applications such as at red (38) provided the firearm is kept out of Stanley. May the necessary permit, similar to red (37) issue, please?

2. I have been asked on several occasions of late why Government considered it necessary to hold private firearms in custody while members of the recently arrived Imperial Force were permitted to retain theirs and use them in the vicinity of Stanley for game shooting. So far as I can gather the Order calling upon all persons in Stanley to surrender firearms to the Chief Constable for safe custody, was issued after Japan's entry into the war, it being considered that the lives of the townspeople would be endangered if as a result of invasion, firearms were found in the houses. However subsequent events have proved that International Law, as practised by the Japanese, is no guarantee that the lives of non-combatants will be safeguarded, and it may now be considered that the release of firearms may ensure a certain measure of self protection to the civilian population should the necessity ever arise.



3. In this Order the expression "firearm" means any lethal barrelled weapon of any description from which any shot, bullet or other missile can be discharged.
4. This Order shall not apply to any firearm issued to His Majesty's Forces or to the Falkland Islands Defence Force for use in the execution of their duties.
5. This Order shall come into force forthwith.






