

Articles of Agreement made and entered into the thirtieth day of October One thousand eight hundred and seventy eight Between John M<sup>c</sup> Niece of 46 Clifden Road, Clapton Middlesex, of the one part and William Charles Sargeant Downing Street London, in the County of Middlesex Esquire. C. M. G. one of the Crown Agents for the Colonies, for and on behalf of Her Majesty of the other part.

Whereby it is mutually agreed between the said parties as follows.

- 1 The said John M<sup>c</sup> Niece for the consideration hereinafter mentioned agrees, so soon as thereunto required by the said Crown Agent for the Colonies to proceed to Falkland Islands as Chief Constable, in the Police Force of the Government of that Colony and to act in all respects according to the directions and instructions given to him by the Government of Falkland Islands through its properly qualified officers, and the said John M<sup>c</sup> Niece hereby agrees that he will faithfully and honestly fulfil the duties required of him by or on behalf of the said Government of Falkland Islands for the term of Six Years from the date of arrival in the Colony.
- 2 And it is hereby further agreed that in consideration of the services so to be rendered to the said Government of Falkland Islands by the said John M<sup>c</sup> Niece the said Government of Falkland Islands shall pay the said John M<sup>c</sup> Niece the annual sum of One hundred pounds in monthly payments of Eight pounds six shillings and eight pence

to be made in the Falkland Islands such pay to commence and begin from the date of the said John Mc Niece embarking from England for Falkland Islands.

3 And it is further agreed that the Government of Falkland Islands will provide the said John Mc Niece with quarters and garden free of charge to him and allow him to supply himself with sufficient Peat gratuitously from Crown Lands for the purpose of Fuel

4 And it is further agreed that passages to Falkland Islands shall be provided for the said John Mc Niece and his family at public cost and the said John Mc Niece if he shall have given to the Government of the Falkland Islands three months previous notice in writing of his intention to leave the Force at the expiration of his six years service shall be entitled to <sup>second class</sup> passages back to England for himself and family.
