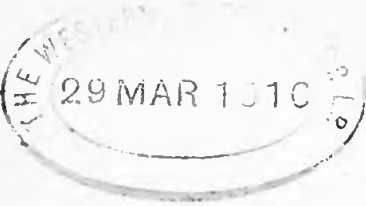

Sir,

I beg leave to thank you for your telegram of to-day, informing me that the mails and passengers have been safely landed from the Steamer "Orissa" of the Pacific Steam Navigation Company.

2. The rumour was current here on the 10th February that the "Orissa", which left here on the 5th January with mails and passengers and was due to arrive at Liverpool on the 31st January, had been sunk by a German submarine off the coast of France. As numerous inquiries were being made of me as to the truth of this rumour, I ventured to cable to you for authoritative information.

3. Later in the day a telegram was received here reporting that the "Orissa" had met with an accident and that the passengers had landed.

4. I need hardly say that it is a relief to the people of the place to learn from your telegram, which I have published, that both passengers and mails have been safely landed.
