**GEORGE BONNER,**

To The Acting Colonial Secretary.

Stanley.

14th July 1942.

Sir,

In view of the present necessity of accomodating troops in the Colony I would be glad if you would advise His Excellency the Governor and Commander in Chief that if it would be of any assistance to billet small sections of troops in the Camp I should be glad to co-operate on this Station.

Owing to labour shortage there are a few rooms available in the Cookhouse and it should be possible to accomodate men in these, provided they were in charge of an Officer or N.C.O. and some assistance was available to the Farm Cook for the extra work involved.

I am making this suggestion in case it is thought advisable to get the troops accustomed to the general terrain of the Islands and also in view of any proposed road making which I should be glad to assist by any means in my power.
