Recd (30) There is at present about £300 in British Currency notes on hand, plus a quantity of silver coin, but half crowns are scarce.

I have much doubt whether it will be possible to supply the full £1500 required by the Staff Paymaster, as far as notes are concerned. These seem to have disappeared gradually from circulation, due possibly to hoarding by the Troops themselves, also see my Minute Recd 1/2/43. I suggest that in order to measure

that the Troops have sufficient currency for their requirements that they should indicate to the War Office the convenience of sending along an adequate amount of British Currency notes with the Transport, for their account. The Treasury is not interested in having on hand British Treasury notes in any appreciable quantities.

With ref. to discussion of this morning.

1. I have, in the draft telegram, referred back to (35) because reference to (69), which is nothing to do with the case, may cause confusion.
2. I think this should be a Secret telegram. as (35) was & to conform with our recent instructions about statistical information. (S. 12/43 L/W).
3. Our ~~total~~^{total} ~~balance~~^{vault} balance at the moment is £26,000. of which £17,750 is in 7-1 notes. O.K.T. I think we should not make withdrawing more than £10,000. If there were was S. of £. I may prefer a definite figure I have put it at £10,000. We can always repeat the process.
4. By amending as suggested we aim at working with drawals in notes, but retaining the individual check for cancellations & destructions. This is, I think, 4.E's intention. It is a mixture of the alternative processes envisaged in the model, but I think it will suit us best.

The detachment should bring all money required. Suggest that Canadian dollar and cents should be made legal tender in conjunction with sterling and a fixed rate of exchange between the Falkland Islands pound and dollar established. Bearing in mind that 25 cents and one shilling are generally interchangeable the rate might locally have to be fixed at \$5 for £1 Falkland Islands, if that is possible.

As there is practically nothing here to spend money on one can assume that most of the pay would be saved either in regimental accountant's office or in savings bank therefore no more than four months' pay plus payment for outside labour need be provided for in dollars but silver is of paramount importance and £10,000 at least in varying denominations would be needed, which might be obtained from Trinidad. Copper up to £500 also would be required.

In connection with money and accounts safes should be also brought as well as sufficient number of forms and books.

No. 18. Most Secret. Your telegram No. 6 last paragraph. Importation of Canadian Currency. On general principle it is preferable not to establish any non-Falkland Islands Currency, particularly a non Sterling Currency, as legal tender and it would be better if practicable to make arrangements by which the troops would use local currency. Arrangements may be made similar to those made elsewhere for remittance to Canada of such part of their pay as the troops might wish remit, and details of these arrangements can be communicated to you.

Apart from objection on the general principle, rate of dollars 5 to the £ which is suggested would hardly be practicable as the official rate for Canadian dollars is dollars 4.47 to the £. This would be an inconvenient rate for simultaneous circulation but anything widely divergent from it would hardly be acceptable to Canadians. Am I to understand that difficulty is anticipated in shortage of local currency? if so, would it not be preferable to try and increase stocks of such currency as rapidly as possible? what are present stocks, present circulation and anticipated period which stocks would last in normal circumstances.

Presume that you intend that the additional silver required should be sterling/



No. 19. Most Secret. With reference to your telegram No. 18 most secret currency position here tonight is as follows:-

(a) notes in circulation £37,500 with £100,000 in two equal shipments already en route and £10,000 unissued in vault.

(b) coin in treasury: silver £206 and copper nine shillings.

The shortage of coin is automatically met by in payments during the month, but there is a steady drain.

In addition the Treasury holds £1000 on Admiralty account in coin.

All notes mentioned above are local currency.

Normally the stocks of notes including the unissued £10,000 would last a year and the £100,000 en route were ordered for the specific purpose outlined in my telegram 72 of June 9th. The coin situation is always precarious but with a £1200 margin it is possible to carry on with the co-operation of the merchants and naval authorities though there is and always has been hoarding of silver by the public, but with the advent of a considerable body of men the situation would be impossible and there would follow local depreciation of the notes - illegal but inevitable and difficult to deal with

If the detachment were to be provided with a sufficiency of notes to meet their full payment for four months the matter would be solved. These notes could be Falkland Islands currency but the amount I cannot determine as I do not know the size of the detachment. I would ask you to arrange this extra printing with the Crown Agents.

As regards coins the Treasurer is unchanged in his opinion that £10,000 is necessary with at least £5000 in shillings, £2000 in sixpences and the balance in other denominations.

URGENT. IMMEDIATE. No. 89. Most Secret. With reference to your Telegram No. 87 following will accompany advanced party: £20,000 in Ten Shilling Notes and £1045 in Coin. This should cover the requirements until the main body arrive about a fortnight later.

2. With reference to paragraph 3 of my Telegram No. 74 War Office represent it would be more satisfactory for the local Treasury to take responsibility for all reserves of both Notes and Coin. I have no objection if you see no practical difficulty.

3. In this basis the Paymaster would be instructed that cash both Notes and Coin would be supplied to him on demand by the Falkland Islands Government subject to repayment by the War Office to the Crown Agents for the Colonies on receipt of telegraphic advice supplied.

I understand that H.E. The Governor requires details regarding the situation created by the arrival of the Falkland Islands Force in July of last year, and the effect of this on our monetary system.

To cover the advances made to the Falkland Islands Force since their arrival, until December 31st last, which amounted to £50991. 12. 1., it was necessary to issue new currency notes, totalling £24,796. 10/- during this same period. This new issue has been duly covered by a corresponding investment in 3% Savings Bonds, and as at December 31st last the total currency notes issued to that date amounting to £62,296. 10/- is all covered by corresponding investments.

All sums advanced to the Falkland Islands Force are immediately repayable in London by the War Office to the Crown Agents, and these monies go to swell our funds in London. They are used principally to cover Savings Bank and Note Security Fund investments, and any balance automatically goes to the Colony's General account. Should surplus funds exist in this account they are transferred to Joint Colonial Fund, at call, and earn 1³/₄% interest and are available as and when required.


It is estimated that the normal local requirements of the Falkland Islands Force during 1943 will amount to approximately £120,000, provided that their present policy is continued, but however, should this be changed and such things as essential foodstuffs and certain other supplies purchased by them, now received from the United Kingdom, be purchased from South American countries, this would automatically increase the above amount of £120,000. The £120,000 in question will be paid to the F.Is. Force here in F.Is. currency, and will be credited to us, through the Crown Agents, so we are therefore really transferring funds from here to London to be employed as previously indicated. The amount paid out by the Military authorities will eventually find its way back to the Treasury in the form of Savings Bank deposits, Taxes, Income Tax, and remittances to cover cost of goods purchased by the local community, either from the U.K. or South American countries and which will be effected by the use of our Drafts on the Crown Agents which will be met by funds already accumulated in London. In this connection whatever amounts are paid out to the F.Is. Force will return to the Treasury by devious routes.

Regarding further issues of currency notes, more may be necessary as time goes on, until such time as a "saturation" point is reached, after which it will no longer be necessary to make further issues. Once this "saturation" point is reached, and movement is normal under changed conditions (when I cannot forecast with any degree of accuracy, but possibly not more than a further £20,000 will be required), what with remittances and guarantees for Savings Bank deposits and note issues, we shall not have any undue surplus of funds in London.

At a later date, when conditions again change, with the withdrawal of the F.Is. Force, it will be necessary to change F.Is. notes in possession of the Troops into British currency. This will be done by giving them cheques/

cheques or drafts on the Crown Agents, the necessary funds to cover this will be available by realising Note Security Fund investments for a like amount. This same procedure also applies to Army Savings Bank deposits and the necessary funds for this will be available by realizing Savings Bank Investments.

As far as I can see at present no difficult problem exists, and neither do I anticipate any further difficulties unless, of course, there should be a drastic and unexpected change in conditions, which at present are neither anticipated nor foreseen.
