I have the honour to request that, in the absence of any more highly qualified person, the Sergeant Instructor to the Falkland Islands Defence Force may carry out the trials of any guns mounted in Armed Boarding Vessels at the Falkland Islands in the event of war or emergency.

- 2. It is realised that there is at present no ammunition for such guns in the Falkland Islands and that therefore there can be no great urgency on an emergency first arising.
- 3. I have directed the Commanding Officer, H.M.S. "AJAX" to discuss this question with you and, if you concur, to give the necessary instruction to the Royal Marine Sergeant Instructor.
