AIMS AND OBJECTS.

THE OBJECT OF THE FUND, Incorporated under Royal Charter, is to secure more efficient aid for the Marine Benevolent Institutions throughout the Empire which have done so much for the Mariner in the past, and whose resources which were greatly strained by the calls made upon them through 1914-18 War are now faced with the calls of this War.

The Fund is in no way intended to interfere with subscriptions and donations going directly to the Institutions they now benefit.

APPEAL ON BEHALF OF SEAMEN AND THEIR DEPENDENTS

by

LORD BALDWIN

Sunday, 17th December, 1939. 8.40 p.m.

Every penny received as a result of this Appeal will be administered by King George's Fund for Sailors in immediate grants to those Nautical Societies which most need it to help seamen of all ranks and ratings, in the Royal Navy, the Royal Naval Reserve, the Royal Naval Volunteer Reserve, the Mercantile Navy and the Fishing Fleets, and the widows of those killed in the War and their children.

The Fund is a Central Body, acting in respect of the Nautical Charities in the same way that King Edward's Hospital Fund does for the Metropolitan Hospitals. You may, therefore, rely upon it that your gifts will go straight to where the need is greatest.

The Duke of Kent, who is President of the Fund, has sent me a message :—

"The Broadcast which Lord Baldwin is making to-night, has a very real and personal interest for me as President of King George's Fund for Sailors. Already there are many families who are suffering because of the War, the brunt of which has so far been borne by the Navy and the Merchant Fleets, and I would like therefore to commend this Appeal to the generosity of all listeners at home and in the Empire Overseas."

Who are the men for whom in this short five minutes I am asking this help ?

Little is known at home of the details of the conditions of climate and weather, night and day, incessant. But now and again, by a lightning flash, as it were, the darkness is illuminated. Twice this has happened in the last few days and in the momentary blinding light emerge two unforgettable pictures. One, of a battle in the summer of the Southern hemisphere, where the traditional courage, incredible audacity and seamanship of our sailors decided an action that may well become historic. The other of a destroyer going down as in a moment in the stormy seas of the North, carrying with her nearly all her complement of officers and men.

"If Blood be the price of Admiralty
Lord God we ha' paid in full."

Of the merchant ships, proceeding on their lawful occasions, in convoy, by strange routes over strange seas, little again is known by us. In Arctic latitudes the curtain is raised for a moment and we see the *Rawalpindi*, ablaze, plunging into the icy waters after a fight in which Sir Richard Grenville, himself, might have played his part. And, from time to time, we are told that *this* ship has struck a mine and *that* has been torpedoed and that so many men are missing. The rest is silence.

And the minesweepers ! You cannot say that any one man's work is more important than another's ; each individual plays his essential part in the one great whole which is the defence of our island, and the maintenance of our sea ways. But I confess that not a day goes by that my thoughts do not turn to those men who every time they go down to the sea perform their task at the very gates of death.

These are the men for whom I Appeal. What is common to them all ? Their work goes on without rest or pause, for by far the greater number of them, in winter seas, with all that that means in constant peril from weapons only perfected in my life time and in an age that prided itself till recently on its accumulated knowledge and civilisation. And these weapons themselves are used daily in contravention of international agreements ratified by our enemies no less than by ourselves. But unless these men had freely offered themselves for our service and reckoned their very lives as not a scruple in the balance when weighed against what they have seen as their Duty, *then* our factories and mills would be slowly but surely closed down, and you and I would be on short rations which would get shorter and shorter. In fact they hold our lives in their hands.

Now what can we do ? Something to-night. To all men who face danger comes one urgent question, "What will happen to my wife and children if I am taken from them ?" So far as we can, let us give the answer "*We* will see that they are cared for." Many most generous gifts are already coming in. But whatever total sum may be raised, I should like to see the number of GIVERS run into millions. Make it truly national. The next meal you sit down to remember it is by the daily sacrifice of these men that you eat your daily bread and send along your thank-offering to Earl Baldwin, King George's Fund for Sailors, Trinity House, London, E.C.3.

His Royal Highness the Duke of Kent, K.G., President of King George's Fund for Sailors, authorises me to enclose to you a copy of the letter in which he expresses his approval of the appeal which is now being made by the Fund throughout the Empire, and I am desired by the Council to ask for your co-operation in inviting the contributions of the citizens of

The appeal is being made on behalf of the great Nautical Charities for the work which they are doing for the Officers and men of the Royal Navy, Mercantile Navy, Mine Sweepers and Fishing Fleets who are incapacitated in the present war, and for the widows and orphans of those who lose their lives.

King George's Fund was formed in 1917 as a permanent memorial to the Imperial services rendered by our seamen in the Great War when acting as the living link between the Dominions Overseas, the Home Country and the battle front. Ever since that date the Fund has by its grants enabled the various Nautical Charities to carry on their great work of caring for those who suffered through the last war, and from the ordinary perils of the sea. The toll that the present war is taking of our gallant seamen makes it essential that further help should be forthcoming.

It was for this reason that Earl Baldwin of Bewdley broadcast on December 17th the moving appeal containing a message from our President His Royal Highness the Duke of Kent, which I have the honour to forward with this letter. The response has been wonderful, but the Council feel sure that those who live overseas would appreciate an opportunity of helping this essential work.

The Council look with gratitude for your valuable advice and assistance in raising funds in the Falkland Islands and would be very grateful if Your Excellency could have the appeal brought to the notice of the various bodies through whom support may be forthcoming.

It would be of much assistance if you could instruct that the names of those bodies should be supplied to the Headquarters of the Fund here at an early date.

WAR FUND

THE WAR FUND was started on 17th December, 1939, by a B.B.C. Broadcast Appeal made by the Right Hon. Earl Baldwin of Bewdley, K.G., P.C.

H.R.H. the Duke of Kent, President of King George's Fund for Sailors, was, in January, 1940, graciously pleased to approve of an appeal being made to all those living overseas. The First Lord of the Admiralty, the Right Hon. A. V. Alexander, P.C., CH., M.P., made a further broadcast appeal on 14th December, 1941.

The purpose of the WAR FUND was the relief of distress caused by the present War to Officers and Men of the Royal Navy (including Fleet Air Arm), Mercantile Marine, Minesweepers and Fishermen, to their families, and to the dependants of those losing their lives in the War.

The Fund is administered by King George's Fund for Sailors, without any charge, by grants to those Nautical Societies which deal with the individual cases. Certain Societies were asked to act as almoners for the Fund, and arrangements were made to ensure that, as far as possible, no cases of distress should be neglected. Assistance is also given to Seamen's Hospitals, and to the various Seamen's Orphanages which are caring for war orphans.

No money received in grants by the Societies can be treated as capital for investment, but must all be available, without administration charges, for dealing with the cases of distress.





WAR FUND

THE WAR FUND was started on 17th December, 1939, by a B.B.C. Broadcast Appeal made by the Right Hon. Earl Baldwin of Bewdley, K.G., P.C.

H.R.H. the late Duke of Kent, then President of King George's Fund for Sailors, was, in January, 1940, graciously pleased to approve of an appeal being made to all those living overseas. Further broadcast appeals were made by the First Lord of the Admiralty, the Right Hon. A. V. Alexander, P.C., C.H., M.P., on 14th December, 1941, and the Minister of War Transport, the Right Hon. Lord Leathers, P.C., C.H., on 19th July, 1942.

The purpose of the WAR FUND is to give assistance to all officers and men of the Royal Navy, Merchant Navy and Fishing Fleets, their families and the dependents of those who lose their lives, who may at any time due to the present war be in need of help.

The Fund is administered by King George's Fund for Sailors, without any charge, by grants to those Nautical Societies which deal with the individual cases. Certain Societies were asked to act as almoners for the Fund, and arrangements were made to ensure that, as far as possible, no cases of distress should be neglected. Assistance is also given to Seamen's Hospitals, and to the various Seamen's Orphanages which are caring for war orphans.

No money received in grants by the Societies can be treated as capital for investment, but must all be available, without administration charges, for dealing with the cases of distress.

WAR FUND

THE WAR FUND was started on 17th December, 1939, by a B.B.C. Broadcast Appeal made by the Right Hon. Earl Baldwin of Bewdley, K.G., P.C.

H.R.H. the late Duke of Kent, then President of King George's Fund for Sailors, was, in January, 1940, graciously pleased to approve of an appeal being made to all those living overseas. Further broadcast appeals have been made by the First Lord of the Admiralty, the Right Hon. A. V. Alexander, P.C., C.H., M.P., on 14th December, 1941, and 11th July, 1943, and by the Minister of War Transport, the Right Hon. Lord Leathers, P.C., C.H., on 19th July, 1942.

The purpose of the WAR FUND is to give assistance to all officers and men of the Royal Navy, Merchant Navy and Fishing Fleets, their families and the dependents of those who lose their lives, who may at any time due to the present war be in need of help.

The Fund is administered by King George's Fund for Sailors, without any charge, by grants to those Nautical Societies which deal with the individual cases. Certain Societies act as almoners for the Fund, and arrangements have been made to ensure that, as far as possible, no cases of need should be neglected. Assistance is also given to Seamen's Hospitals, and to the various Seamen's Orphanages which are caring for war orphans. Donations may be nominated by the donors for special work of Societies.

No money received in grants by the Societies can be treated as capital for investment, but must all be available for dealing with the cases of need.

A new undertaking by the Fund is the maintenance of the Merchant Seamen at the Rest Homes at Limpfield and Allendale, which are administered respectively by the National Union of Seamen and the Missions to Seamen. Allowances are paid to the wives while their husbands are in the Homes.




