It is proposed by omnibus gazette notice to grant Kings emergency commission in general list to all holders of Governor's commissions in Colonial local forces who do not already hold Kings commissions. These emergency commissions would have effect from 3rd September 1939 or date of first appointment to Governor's commission if such date was later than September 3rd 1939. Such officers will not (repeat not) be entitled to army pay or other pecuniary benifit under pay warrants etc. The grant of emergency commissions carry an Imperial liability to serve outside Golonies concerned. In view of delay which would be involved it is not proposed to obtain prior acceptance of individual officers before publishing gazette notice, but in case any officer being unwilling to accept such liability his emergency commission will then be cancelled. All officers concerned should therefore when the time comes be advised accordingly and any such case should be notified to the War Office through the usual channels. Army Council would reserve the right to terminate such emergency commission if it became no longer possible for any reasons to utilize an officer's services in Colonial Force. When gazette notice has been published, as to which I will notify you later, nominal role of officers (state Christian names) granted commissions and date of such commissions should be forwarded to me.

Please telegraph whether any objection is seen to this procedure. Grant of these commissions does not imply any intention on the part of the War Office to remove officers concerned from service in local defence force so long as they are needed with these forces.

No. 101. My telegram of August 23rd and subsequent correspondence King's Emergency Commissions. Steps are being taken to issue an omnibus Gazette notice on the following lines begins:-

All present holders of a Governor's Commission in Colonial Forces not holding a King's Commission are appointed to Emergency Commission in General List British Army with effect from September 3rd 1939 or date of appointment of a Governor's Commission if such date was later than September 3rd 1939.

As from date of Gazette notice, the grant of a Governor's Commission carries with it an appointment to an Emergency Commission in General List British Army with effect from the date of grant of Governor's Commission.

The grant of such Commissions will be subject to the conditions that govern commissioning during the present emergency. ends.

Scheme embraces all officers holding local Governor's Commiss%ions and there are no age limits.

All first appointments to Emergency Commissions are in the rank of 2nd Lieutenant, excepting in cases where the chadidates have three years or more previous service reckonable under Article 3 Royal Warrant for pay 1940 when they are appointed direct in rank of Lieutenant. All higher ranks is acting when they are approved War establishment vacancies.

I will inform you when the notice has been published meanwhile please forward to me the nominal roll showing full name and date of appointment of Governor's Commission of all officers concerned.
