

SILVER JUBILEE

Thank you for your letter P & T/2/20 of 5 March 1976, concerning the Silver Jubilee Omnibus Issue.

- We regret that it is not possible to allocate the various scenes as suggested in paragraph 3 of your letter.
- 3 The proposal is that when the stamps from all the participating Territories are arranged in strict alphabetical order then they will tell the story of the Coronation in chronological order, and it is, therefore, essential that the Falkland Islands, South Georgia, and British Antarctic Territory retain the subjects we have already proposed.
- We enclose herewith three draft designs for postage stamps plus one FDC rough design for the British Antarctic series. That for South Georgia is already with you and the Falkland Islands designs will follow in a few days, when they are received from the Artist. The enclosed designs have been seen by the Foreign and Commonwealth Office and the only design which we feel needs amending is the 'fifteen' design; the Portraits on the other two stamp designs will of course be much improved at finished artwork stage. We feel that in view of the various claims to Sovereignty for this area, it would probably be unwise to feature that part of the Oath relating to Her Majesty's Sovereignty over the various countries of the Commonwealth. We feel that there are only two alternative choices; either show only the second part of the wording which relates to law and justice, or else to show a scene from The Coronation where Her Majesty is actually at the altar signing the copy of the Oath used during the actual Service. Either of these could, of course, be fitted into this basic framework.
- On balance, we feel that the Oath with only the short extract is perhaps preferable, although as this would take up a much smaller area of the stamp it might well be possible for the Artist to show the signing as a form of inset. Perhaps you would be good enough to approve the designs on this basis and the final decision could rest with the Artist, epending on how he feels this revised subject matter could best be treated.

> 7 As for South Georgia, we feel that the total face value of the set should be about 50 pence, and, therefore, the values shown on these rough designs are about right. Perhaps when you return the rough designs you would confirm the values which you wish to be used, and if possible also indicate the quantities which you will require for sale locally, so that we may proceed with production without any delay.

Silver Jubilee: Commemorative Issue of Postage Stamps British Antarctic Territory

Kindly refer to your letter H1/BAT 4/34943 of 29th March, 1976, enclosing three draft designs for stamps of the above proposed issue and a First Day Cover rough design.

- 2. The design for the First Day Cover is considered very attractive and is approved. We would require 4,000 locally.
- 3. It is felt with regard to the stamp designs that
 - i. 5p Stamp In 1957 when H.R.H. The Duke of Edinburgh visited the Colony and Dependencies (including those now styled British Antartic Territory) he wore a small beard and he should be so depicted on the stamp. The "Britannia's" superstructure is poor and appears more that of a river gun boat than the Royal Yacht and the ship seems to be listing to starboard. Could this be modified?
 - ii. 15p Stamp It is preferred that the Oath as taken by Her Majesty should be shown. If, however, there are over-riding protocol considerations why it cannot be featured, then a scene showing Her Majesty signing the Cath as indicated in your letter would be acceptable.
 - iii. 25p Stamp No comment. This design is approved.
- 4. It is noted that the Portraits will be much improved at the finished artwork stage.
- 5. The decorative scroll work at the top of each of the designs should be deleted.
- 6. The actual denominations of the stamps and quantities required locally will be advised you as soon as the decisions have been taken. Due regard will be taken of the point made in this connection in your letter.
- 7. Could consideration be given to including the year "1977" in the designs as is proposed for the South Georgia issue and is favoured.



Many thanks your signal Your (1). My para 1 referred to Jubliee for BAT FI and Dependencies BAT Whales and Dependencies discovery. Crown Agents today reaffirm all on Bransfield.

Your (2) It is for this reason that I emphasised the point in my para 2. You will recall this very question being discussed at length in stamp coordinating committee. For you information frank for whale issue, which I first understood had been cleared, showed a humpback whale breaching. Have spoken with Crown Agents again today and enlarged slightly upon the franks you indicated toincorporate changeable dates. Franks will now show 'First Day of issue, Base, date and year, British Antarctic Territory. They can thus be used for later issues.

Your para (3). Relaese dates for whales and Jubliee ussues were carefully considered against ship movement expectations and positive requirements, as in past issues there is always the possibility of delay. You do not comment on the Whales release date. The principle here is to release (release) Whales issue outside of Jubilee issue period. It must therefore ne released before the Jubliee issue otherwise there can be no return of requirements to the Philatelic World until 1977/78 season.

The Jubliee release date is virtually common to the commonwealth (ninety percent of all territories have this release date). Whilst it has always been recognised that Antarctic relief conditions sometimes dely we must decide upon issue dates as far in advance as is possible in order that necessary publicity through Crown Agents can be made. To be effective publicity for these issues whould begin now.

Your para (5) Will comply with high commas wish. Please do not however adjust Biggs movements without first consulting BAS Cambridge as they have been carefully coordinated with accommodation availability on ships and bases.

If your requirement of a frank for Argentine Islands indicates postmaster is thinking of diverting official First Day Covers request this not done. Biggs would not be available and base copersonnel fully occupied in relief procedure Base could cope with normal Philatelic requirements but not a large amount of FDC'S.

I have seen highcommas sign 1 to Crown Agents. Grateful you pass my respectful submission signal to Crown Agents. Grateful you pass my respectful submission that C/2334/76 was a BAT origination not BAS and issued by me as bat Accountant. The signal was not intended as a directive but an advice or proposal to be finalised through BAT Postmaster Luxton as indicated in ultimate of para five. We have already written to you on the subject of Silver Jubilee sales in previous correspondence and we feel the time has come to give you more specific information about the progress of sales of First Day Covers and settle a few general points.

FALLED ISLANDS

Franklin Mint This company will produce their eva covers and affix stamps themselves for the project and at the present time we anticipate their requirements as 52,000 full sets of stamps. In order to ensure that maximum sales are made we have undertaken to reserve this quantity from production for their use.

Franklin will give us their firm order for precise quantities in early December when they have completed their first advertising run. We have already agreed in recent correspondence that Franklin will send their covers and stamps to you and you will arrange for their affixing. We will be writing to you further on this matter to give you fuller details.

Franklin Mint will pay for outsard freight and return airfreight for all their supplies will be for your account. We assume that you will not be making any charge for cancellation in view of the fact that they are taking full sets.

Unicover Corporation This firm will also produce their own covers and affir stamps, but of the top two values only (11p and 53p). As with the Franklin project Unicover are unable to give an accurate total of their requirements until early December, but estimate their needs as at least 15,000 of each of the top two values. However, as a safeguard against higher sales, we have agreed to reserve 50,000 of the top two values of each issue for their use on the understanding that Unicover will pay printing costs for all stamps above the first 25,000 if shipment of FDCs has to take place before they make their final decision. Outward shipment costs will be paid by Unicover, as for Franklin but "taking the top two values".

OFFICIAL FIRST DAY COVERS

Recent research we have done on the market for First Day Covers indicates that the biggest market is for a very high quality product and we have arranged that all official First Day Covers in this omnibus will be produced using a high quality heavyweight grey textured paper with the design diestamped. This, of course, is a departure from the traditional First Day Cover style which has tended to be on thin white paper with something like two-colour litho or letterpress printing. There are strong indications that the FDC market for a high quality project is going to get a lot larger in the UK and Europe within the next year or so and as this area develops we will keep you fully informed.

Glendinning UK This company require 7500 First Day Covers with two values (6p and 11p): they will use the Official First Day Cover being produced by us. Affixing of these covers will be carried out by us.

<u>Pobjoy Mint</u> We have negotiated a sale of 5000 Official First Day Covers containing full sets to this firm and we will be writing to you further on this.

Eureau Sales of FDCs to sell approximately 6-7000 of the Official First Day Covers in the Crown Agents Bureau. It is proposed that the Crown Agents will the covers to you: return airfreight and cancellation charges to be for your account.

Your Requirements In your cable of 19 July 1976 you stated your requirements as 4000 First Day Covers. At the moment, we anticipate that the blank supplies should be available for despatch to you in one shipment about the end of November. For your own supplies the costs of production and freight will be debited to your account.

Now, having dealt with the specific sales we are negotiating, there are a few general points that should be made.

We would stress that, whilst we are extremely pleased with the way our sales have progressed so far, we are unlikely to be able to give you firm figures until early December, nor is it likely that the maximum quantities will be taken up. Nevertheless, we are confident that the final outcome will prove to be a most profitable exercise for you.





- 2 The Gazette is published as a supplement to Stanley Gibbons magazine "Stamp Monthly" and is usually produced in black and white. However, on the occasion of the Silver Jubilee and as part of our extensive national and international advertising campaign a colour edition has been planned as a special souvenir. Certain variations in colour between the actual stamps and the Gazette reproductions are noticeable, but unfortunately this was unavoidable as the magazine is printed in 4 colours only whereas most of the stamps employ 6 colours.
- 3 In addition to a circulation of approximately 45,000 with "Stamp Monthly" a further 35,000 copies of the souvenir will be distributed via "Stamp Magazine", the second largest of the UK philatelic magazines. A separate full colour leaflet is also in preparation for distribution to some 80,000 readers of other philatelic magazines, mainly in Germany.
- 4 Publicity albums containing a representative selection of press coverage of your Jubilee issue will be forwarded in due course.
- 5 I also enclose, as a matter of interest, an example of material which has been widely circulated in the USA and the UK by The Franklin Philatelic Society, a purchaser of large quantities of Silver Jubilee stamps for FDC usage. This material is typical of the prestige literature being distributed by a number of similar organisations whose main sales are achieved in the "souvenir" market rather than the established philatelic outlets.
