EXTRACT FROM LETTER FROM THE MANAGER, FOX BAY EAST, DATED THE 28th OCTOBER, 1939.

It would seem that the main objection to the German prisoners coming here, as voiced by the men working on this Station, is that a rumour has spread that there are men going to South Georgia for the whaling season, and the camps are to be left to get along as best they can.

I cannot think that the rumour is true, or that the Government has so little regard for the farming industry, as to let potential labour leave these Islands for employment elsewhere, when they might be employed with greater advantage to the farms.
