I am directed by His Excellency the Acting Governor to draw your attention to an application made on 26th August to the Master of the Black Hawk by Mr. Lewis for the shipment of a few packages in the Mail Schooner on the occasion of her last trip to Stanley, which was refused by your Agent at Mount Vidro on the plea that the whole ten tons of merchandize allowed the public of Stanley was already engaged and further that it was entirely at the option of the Falkland Islands Company to receive cargo, that is, that they are not present bound under the same conditions, as they were formerly when running the Mail, when the old contract was in force.

His Excellency is aware that in the Mail Contract there is no provision made for priority of application, but in view of the fact that this was the third occasion on which Messrs Howard & Coy had applied for space (and this ten days before the arrival of the Mail Schooner) he does not think that your agent was acting in accordance with the spirit of the Contract, when he shut out Messrs Howard & Coy's goods in order to keep the space reserved for the public, for cargo which was expected to arrive by the Mail Steamer, for Messrs Holmsted and Blake, for whom you act as agent.

His Excellency considers that, as the money for the support of Mr Wilson's child was to be paid through the Court as shown by letter, it was your duty to have seen that payment was made regularly. By your neglecting to do so, you have already deprived Mr Wilson of four weeks subsistence money for her child.

As Rendall refused to pay according to your notes, His Excellency is unable to see that you had authority as Acting Police Magistrate to permit him to defer payment, and under the circumstances it was your duty to have enforced the law as provided for by the Statutes 718 Vict. c. 101 and 8 Vict. c. 10.

I am also directed in returning your Book, to draw attention to the imperfect manner in which the cases that came before you on the 18th inst are recorded, particularly as there is no account of the data on which you formed your judgments, and to suggest that in future it would be advisable that you should not make official statements regarding the proceedings in the Police Court, which are not substantiated by the Minutes.

A kind of bass or mullet, which is rather insipid, is most plentiful. There is also at certain seasons of the year a good supply of a large smelt - about the size of a mackerel - called peccarey, which is delicious. A small species of rock cod and a sort of sardine are also occasionally caught.

There are no pearl or oyster fisheries in the Falkland Islands.

Of shell fish there are only mussels, clams and limpets, which are abundant, and easily gathered on the beach at low water.

In summer a small green trout without scales, is caught in the rivers and inland lakes

I am directed by His Excellency the Governor to report for the information of the Board of Trade the wreck of the British Barque "Craigie Rosa" (O. N 50251) of Dublin - A. Winter, Master - which took place near Cape Porpoise, East Falkland Island about 11 o'clock on the evening of the 26th ult.

The vessel which was bound from Malden Island for the English Channel for orders was laden with a cargo of guano and I am informed by the master of her, intended to call at this Port for provisions.

Fortunately the master and crew were able to land by the ship's boats early the next morning and after some little time fell in with a small house at Tanny Cove occupied by David Hewitt, a shepherd in the employment of the Falkland Islands Company. Hewitt who is only a working man entertained the whole of the crew (15 hands all told) at his small house for several days, and perhaps the Board of Trade may think it desirable to make him some recompense for his humane conduct.

The casualty was reported to His Excellency the Governor by Lloyd, Agent at this Port late in the evening of the 29th ult. and as there was no other means of bringing the crew into Stanley he considered it his duty to charter a schooner and send for them as soon as possible.

For this purpose the schooner "Fairy" belonging to the Falkland Islands Company was chartered for the sum of £30 - which was a moderate charge

charge - and the master and crew were landed by her at Stanley on the 7th inst. Under the circumstances His Excellency trusts that you may be pleased to sanction this payment, which is included in the account current forwarded by this Mail.

The master remains here for the present as he hopes to be able to save some portion of the vessel and cargo. Ten of the crew for whom I have been unable to find employment in the Colony are despatched to Monte Video, in route to England by the Mail Schooner "Black Hawk" which leaves to-day.

I have to report for the information of His Excellency the Governor that Anton Scapenich supposed to be a native of Austria who arrived here in the Steamer Hannu on the morning of the 23rd inst from Fox Bay where he had been in the employ of Capt. R. C. Poole committed suicide this evening by hanging

At a quarter past seven this morning the Constable on duty brought William Southfield and James Welsh to me. Mr Southfield stated that he saw the deceased hanging close to a wall in front of Dr. Deane's Forge and that he cut him down I sent for another Constable who came we all proceeded to the place where he lay he was dead. I had the Corps brought to the Dock gate and placed in the Theatre where it now is

The Deceased was last seen at or about One o'clock this morning by Peter Surtzema in the passage of the Stanley Arms Hotel, Surtzema went to bed but heard the deceased moving about the house for about half an hour

he fell asleep and heard no more
about him till he was told some time
afterwards that Scopemuch had hung
himself.

I informed the Colonial Surgeon
who saw the body

I have also acquainted the
Coroner who has fixed 12 noon tomorrow
for the Inquest

fail to proceed to the Falkland Islands, or, within the period of Three
Years from the date of his arrival in the said Colony, either quit the said Colony without leave or relinquish his
appointment, or be dismissed or removed from his appointment in consequence of misconduct, he the said
Samuel Hamilton will refund and repay to
the Colonial Secretary of the Government of the said Colony for the time being or to the Crown Agents for the said Colony,
in London, for the time being, the amount paid for his passage to the Colony and for the passage of any member or members of
his family.

Provided always that nothing herein contained shall bind or oblige the said Samuel Hamilton
