2 — With a view of establishing a Depot for Naval Stores and Provisions, at this port, I am instructed by the Senior Naval Officer to request your Excellency to inform me what accomodation there is available for such Depot at the Port in the event of its being decided to establish it.

3 — I have directions to inspect the Powder Magazine at Port Stanley, and to report whether it is in a fit condition for storing the Powder, etc. for Her Majesty's Squadron on this Station, and to request your Excellency's permission

permission and assistance in carrying out this object.

4 — Should it be necessary to transfer Powder etc. from this port to Montevideo for the use of any of H.M. Ships, I am directed to ascertain whether the Kosmos Company would undertake the transfer in their steamers: and if so, at what rate for freight. Should they decline doing so, whether it would be possible to send such freight by sailing vessels to Montevideo.

Requesting your Excellency's assistance in carrying out these instructions.

Education Report
Hallsland Islands 1884

The Number of Children on the Rolls in the Government Infant and Senior Schools, Stanley, during the year were 92 and 95 respectively.

The Average attendance was 65 and 70 respectively, thus showing a slight improvement over the previous year.

I had not the opportunity this year of visiting the only other School in the Islands, viz. The Hallsland Islands Company's School at Darwin, but I believe it was continued as usual.

The Army Savings Bank connected the Government Schools continued its operations; at the close of the year there were 88 depositors and £582.13.5 due to them.

I again venture to call His Excellency the Governor's attention to the following
First. That there are many children

in Stanley of School age who
seldom or never enter the Schools and
are receiving no education at home;
this will continue through the neglect
of their Parents until education is
made compulsory.

Second, that as the children attending
the Infant School vary much in age
— from 5 to 13 years of age — proper
attention can not be given to them by
the Infant School-mistress and her
Assistant during the Summer Months
when the attendance has at times
reached 90 children: consequently
during the Summers of 1886 and
1887 a Second Assistant was
paid by private subscription by
permission. (Letter N^o 308, October 28
1886)

Third. The state of education in the country parts of the Islands is deplorable. Nothing whatever having been done during the year either by Government or the Lessees of Crown Lands towards the education of the children scattered through out the Islands; with the exception of the School established in Darwin by the Halfland Island Company where the few children resident in Darwin receive instruction.

BUILT by E. ROWLES, Bristol, 1883. Stern lengthened out by Hills', Bristol, 1885. Length over all 35', beam, 8' 2", depth amidships, 6' 6", build of English Oak, elm and pine, grown oak frame with intermediate bent frames through, fastened with copper and rivetted. Ballast consists of about 7 tons iron (some moulded to fit), 1 ton iron keel. Draft 7'. Cabins are fitted with pitch pine and mahogany, Swing table, Main cabin, Pantry, W.C. After cabin with two berths and washstand. Sails by Lapthorne, Mainsail, Mizzen, Foresail, 3 jibs, 2 topsails, Spinnaker, all in first class condition. Running gear mostly new, 1885, and all in good order. Ash blocks internal stropped, 2 anchors (1 Trotman), 45 fathom chain, side lights and boards, anchor light, copper pump, patent under water line W.C., Atkey's patent Windlass, Rubber main sheet buffer, brass rudder cap, gangway steps, mahogany skylight with brass rods, mahogany lined cockpit, with scuppers above water line. All ironwork galvanized.

This little vessel and all her gear is complete and thoroughly sound, and could be got ready for sea in 3 or 4 days. She is a powerful sea boat, very dry and fairly fast, and has wonderful accommodation for her size.

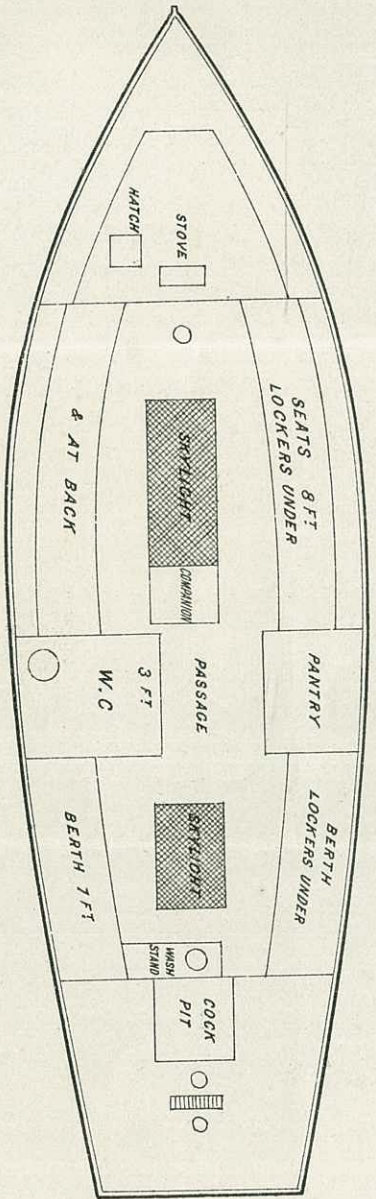
Annexed is a rough sketch of her cabin plan, not to scale.

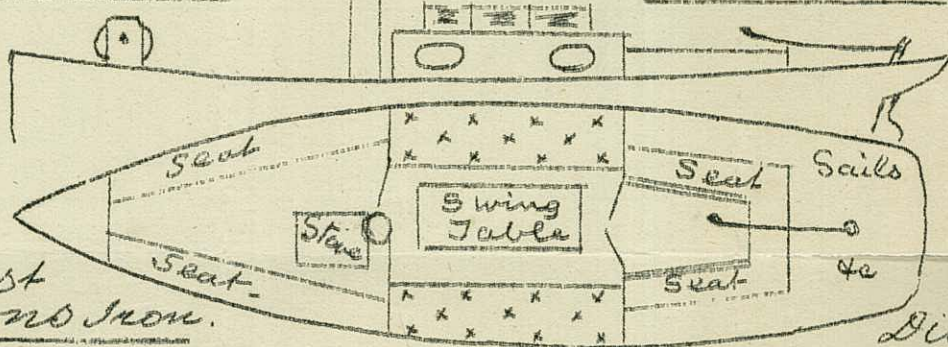
