I have the honour to submit the following report and claim for sulvace, on behalf of avenif and the erew who prevated with me, for services rendered with the Govern out Launch "Perenta" at the stranding of the R.M.S. "Cravia" on the Pilly Rock on the night of Townser lath, 1915.

The distely it becase known that the R. (. T. "Oravia" had not with an action a number of men arrived at the Covernment Jetty and with some of these I had the Covernment whale bout lowered and number, and at the same time ordered ateam to be raised as quickly as consible in the brunch "Fenguin". I then left in the smale boat and imported all steak whalers in the number of the accident, and used them to so as coon as consider to the rescue. For this time steak was raised on the "Fenguin", which, with a smale boat made fast to her, then left for the straight vessel.

On arrival at the "Gravia" starboard graway I went on board and offered Cantain Poole our assistance to travefer passengers to steak whalers lying off at some short distance. Our assistance was accorded after some consideration and we then went round to the port after summay and towed a lifeboat full of women and children to a whaler where they were taken on board and cared for. Again went alongside port side, moved to forward gangway and tok all recalning women and children and filled up with men and then left for Port "tombey where we arrived and turned all passengers over to Covernment Officials and others at the public jetty early on Weinesday morning wow there is the fith, 1915.

All this day the launch "Fenguin" was in attendance in the heathour to massengers and crew of R.M.S. "Oravia".

For the limiter "Queen", which was in the charge and care of the T.I. Government, and got the T.W. "Paul" to tow lighter, erew and self to wreck, where we anchored some distance off and bourded wreck; our crew lowered five lifebouts and filled these with all the narcel self that could be found, with the exception of four base that were washed off the leek of the steamer, and three deck chairs. We then rulled lifeboots off to lighter and fastened all lifebouts to lighter and fastened all lifebouts to stein of "queen".

Our crew also beloed to salve one jully boat, a larve assortment of silver wars, six valuable parts of farconi apparatus, two compasses and an assortment of small articles and cases.

"Paul" towed back to Stanley the lighter "jueen" her crew and contents.
