Lloyds List Energy Day, in the Internet has the following information: "YPF drops Falkland hint. Proven basins are Argentine Priority. Argentina's largest oil company, YPF, has said it will consider participating in exploration activity off the Falkland Islands in the South Atlantic but for the time being will concentrate on proven sedimentary basins. "We do not rule out our possible future participation in the Malvinas," YPF chief executive Roberto Monti told the state news agency Telam. "But in the short term, we will focus on the exploration of more well-known sedimentary basins. Currently YPF has no great experience in deepwater exploration," he said."

"A joint licensing round covering waters between Argentina and the islands has been slated for launch this year but a variety of concerns remain to be resolved. "

BUSINESS BULLETIN Aberdeen CofC, Dec/Jan 1998

In the Chamber News Section: Forty-seven per cent of service sector respondents to the Aberdeen CofC and Deloitte and Touche quarterly Oil and Gas Survey, reported an increase in confidence, and none said they were less confident than at the end of June this year. However, the strong increase in optimism demonstrated by Grampian's oil production companies throughout 1997, came to an end, with more than 71% reporting no change in confidence, and the remainder equally divided between rising and reduced confidence. Both service and production sectors showed increasing concern over difficulties in finding suitably skilled manual, technical and managerial staff, with 60% of service companies reporting recruitment problems as a constraint to business.

WOOL NEWS

Market Report Week Ending 9.1.98 from Peter Marriott

"GENERAL This first week of trading following the Christmas/New Year holiday period has been very quiet with clients confirming new orders are very rare indeed and the sales of stockpile during this period, a measure of world wool market activity, have been very low.

No one expected more than firmness in the opening markets with buyers everywhere anxious about the impact of the Asian situation. The impact may be temporary but, against a hand to mouth trading background and uncertainty about how the Chinese demand will develop in primary markets in the opening weeks of the new year, the anxiety remains.

Theoretically, wool prices ought to rise to ofsett the currency impact but it will be a few weeks into the New Year before the actual pattern is established."

"As you may know, in the United Kingdom and in Europe legislation is in force protecting employees in the event of the sale of the business or undertaking in which they are employed. Councillors are considering whether any such legislation should be introduced in the Falkland Islands. They have not come to any decision one way or the other, but have agreed that I should write to representatives of employers and to the General Employees Union." 2. "A particular reason for the Government considering, at this juncture, the possible enactment of "transfer of undertakings" legislation is that, as you know, the recent report from Coopers and Lybrand advises Government to consider whether any of the activities it at present carries on can and should be transferred to the private sector, so as to reduce the economic dominance of Government." OIL DEPARTMENT

Extracts from Newsletter Jan/Feb 1998

Joint Operator's Meeting, Eighteen oil industry reps plan to attend a meeting in Stanley with Falkland Islands Gov officials on Tues, 27th Jan. Members attending will update the meeting on their activities and progress with preparations for offshore drilling expected to begin by mid-year.

The next Environmental Forum is planned for late March.

The drilling EIA has been printed for public comment in the Falkland Islands Gov Gazette. Representations from the public have been received by the Governor and have been passed to the oil companies to reply. It is expected that Exec Council will consider the drilling EIA, written representations and an external review commissioned by FIG, at a meeting in late Jan.

Equipment for the Exploration Drilling Programme, 4000 tonnes of supplies and equipment for the oil industry are due to arrive on the Hogg Robinson charter vessel in mid-February followed by a further shipment in March. The vessels are loading the items directly from Aberdeen dock. Mr Phil Gallimore, GM for Stanley/CSM will arrive in Stanley in time to attend meetings with oil companies and FIG during the week of the joint meeting in Stanley.

HSE and Dolphin Drilling Reps, Mr Robert Paterson and Mr Bill Miller of the Aberdeen Offshore Division of HSE will undertake training of Fisheries, Police and Fire Service officers during the first week of Feb. Dolphin Drilling reps will also assist HSE with the training of local staff. Mr David Lesley, Dolphin Drilling's Technical Superintendent, will be in the Islands in late Jan. Mr Lesley will be the Dolphin rep resident on the Islands during the drilling programme. Mr Per Johansson, Rig Manager and Mr Alan Grindlay, Drilling Project Engineer will be in Stanley in early February and will join HSE at the public presentation.

WOOL NEWS

For week-ending 16/1/98 from Peter Marriott, GENERAL: "A little business has been placed this week and some traders think more could come if prices could be agreed and confidence in a firmer market returned. Traders locally have left prices unchanged, despite Australian easing. The currency factor, the Australian Dollar against Sterling offsets wool price weakness. Asian problems are seen as a threat in various ways. There are frustrated orders in raw material, being diverted at cut price and undermining world market levels. The UK manages to soldier on in the face of these difficulties and there is hopeful talk of what would happen if currency or the market led to a price rise for wool, but the relative euphoria of 1997 at its best seems very distant today."

Stronger Controls for Sheep Dip Pollution, BAN8/39/1 The Environment Agency has warned UK farmers that it will be taking an increasingly tough line on the careless use and disposal of toxic sheep dip after new regulations come into force in 1998. Research by the agency presented to a national sheep farming conference recently shows that synthetic pyrethroid (SP) dips have severely damaged river life in sheep farming areas, including stretches totalling more than 150 kilometres (90) miles in Cumbria, north-west England, alone. General: "In the wool market falling prices tend to discourage anyone with new business to place the usual approach is to buy only when needs become pressing. There were times this week when it looked as though currency factors might turn round sufficiently to push up wool prices, however, and this is one reason for the occasional exceptions to a generally difficult market picture locally. More recently, though the dollar softened again, and with wool steadily drifting down, attempts to keep quoted prices steady have not been so successful. Most quoted prices are a little lower than a week ago. The Asian crisis looms over the wool markets. Analysts see little chance of any worthwhile and prolonged price recovery resulting from stronger world demand."

- 2. In this regard, the Government proposes to adopt the following policy:

"The Falkland Islands Government, with respect to operations on the FIPASS facility, expects all contractors and users of the facility to conduct their activities in a safe and healthy manner with due consideration for other users of the facility and the general public who may visit the facility.

When users of the facility carry out their activities they must consider the following:

- That the health, safety and welfare of persons at work is secured
- That the persons other than persons at work are protected against risks to their health and safety arising out of, or in connection with the activities of persons at work
- That the handling, keeping and use of explosive, highly flammable substances, radioactive sources and other dangerous substances is controlled
- That emissions of harmful, noxious or dangerous substances into the atmosphere are controlled"
- 3. The Falkland Islands Company Limited which currently provides management services to the Government in relation to FIPASS has prepared a draft Safety Management System for operations at FIPASS which the Government is likely to endorse. A copy of the draft Safety management System is available upon request from the marine Officer (Jon Clark Tel 27260) or the FIPASS Manager (Mike Weir Tel 22671)
- 4. Users of FIPASS or any interested parties are invited to comment upon the above proposals including the draft Safety Management System prepared by the Falkland Islands Company. Comments should be sent to the Principal Crown Council, (Robert Titterington Tel 27273) Attorney General's Chambers, Cable Cottage, Stanley before the end of February 1998.

WARNING

Recently, two associates from US Precision Lens were travelling to Belgium on Sabena Belgium World Airlines, which is affiliated with Delta Airlines. They were seated in row six of the plane where seats contain tray tables in the armrest section of the seat. They set up their tray tables and proceeded to use their laptop computers. During the flight, both PCs began to experience problems, and soon they were unable to use them. Apparently the tray tables were magnetised, so that tray tables would not make noises while stored in the armrests. The magnetised trays corrupted the hard drives of both laptops.

On this particular Belgium flight, the aircraft happened to be a new Airbus 340, which explains why this has not surfaced until now. The problem seems to be with a specific European aircraft seat manufacturer. US Airways, NorthWestern and United have no plans to utilise these magnetised trays in their new Airbus aircraft. Boeing and McDonald Douglas also have no plans to use them in the new aircraft. There have been no reported cases of other types of aircraft experiencing this problem

If the tray table appears to be magnetised (use a paperclip to see if it sticks), then do not use your laptop computer on these trays.

TRAINING NEEDS ANALYSIS

"In response to the expression of widespread concerns about the lack of opportunities for vocational training in the Falkland Islands the Chief Executive has asked me to prepare a structural plan for vocational education, training and development in the Islands encompassing both the public and the private sectors. As part of this exercise the Education Department has commissioned a Training Needs Analysis. The details of this are as follows:

The Team. The team carrying out the analysis will be Dr Steven Johnson and Dr Robert Baldock, both of the Centre of Enterprise and Economic Development Research (CEEDR) at Middlesex University. The CEEDR has a wide range of experience in research relating to business and local economic development and Dr Steven Johnson, the team leader, has been involved in a number of studies involving skills surveys and training practices.

Visit Dates: Drs Johnson and Baldock will visit the Islands between Friday 6 and Saturday 28 March 1998. During this time they will carry out the research and prepare the report. The draft report will be available for consultation before they leave and they will not be returning.

Objective: The CEEDR team aims to carry out a Training Needs Analysis which will consist of the following components:

- A comprehensive picture of the educational background & qualifications, vocational skills & qualifications and training experiences of the current working age population of the Islands.
- A study of the current skill needs, skill shortages and anticipated future skill needs of employers on the Islands, together with an analysis of current training provision by employers.
- An overview of the current vocational training provision (on and off the Islands) and funding mechanisms for vocational training.
- Analysis of the way in which future economic, social, demographic and technological trends are likely to affect the requirements for vocational skills, training and qualifications over the coming years.

Methodology: Having carried out background and preparatory research in the UK the team will involve themselves in survey research in the Islands. Three distinct surveys are envisaged:

- 'Key informant' interviews with individuals on the Islands who have a specific knowledge of the vocational training and skills situation and/or have a view about likely future needs for vocational skills and how these might be met.
- A survey of a sample of employing organisations on the Islands.
- A survey of a sample of individuals of working age.

A survey will be followed by the analysis and reporting of results after which the team will consult with interested bodies and individuals.

Participation: If the Training Needs Analysis is to be a worthwhile exercise and have a successful outcome it will need the enthusiastic participation of a wide variety of people. The purpose of this memo is both to alert you to the fact that this activity is now about to get under way and to seek your co-operation in making the venture a success. Many thanks for any help you can give.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT, AGM 4TH MARCH 1998

It is my pleasure to welcome you here this evening and to thank you for the support given to the Council and Chamber over the year. I am also obliged at this time to inform you of the work we have been carrying out on your behalf during the last twelve months.

We in the Chamber Council are very aware of our responsibilities to you, which is one of collation and distribution of accurate information, seeking opportunities to improve your business skills, making representation on your behalf to ensure that you are given the best possible chance to operate, expand or stabilise your business in the most friendly and appropriate environment. How is this achieved?

The office provides the infrastructure and facilities (just) for the collection, storing and passing of information. This is then distributed to you by way of the weekly bulletin, fax, telephone or referring to the material within our ever expanding library. All of which is superbly administrated by our Office Manager, May Dempster. There is of course an additional and supplementary tool for the promotion of your interests. The Business Directory (thank you FIDC and Synergy for their contribution to this very important document).

Improving business skills basically falls under the heading of Training. This can be academic, vocational or practical. It is our duty to continue to plan, promote and provide these opportunities for A better trained and skilled business community makes for a more efficient, effective, competitive and robust Private Sector.

Representation is made on your behalf to members of Legislative Council and Senior members of Administration with the aim of tasking them with the responsibility of ensuring they will provide you with the framework and facilities to conduct business in a democratic, free market structured way. Most of the present Legco are active in the Private sector themselves, therefore it would not be unreasonable that we expect them to understand this concept.

Other opportunities are made available which allow us to canvass your intentions or needs in a more international/Global front. Visiting Politicians, FCO staff, Media and Businessmen are the sort of visitors I refer to. On this point I would like to thank members who have taken time out to attend functions which requires them to fund from their own pockets.

The increased workload over the year has resulted in the Council meeting every month, these meetings are preceded by topical discussions with FIDC (introduced by this Council) the duration of these meetings have increased from 11/2 hours to 4. There is also the planning and arranging of informal or formal meetings with Legislative council and Administration. Operating the DHL service (ever expanding) formulating and organising Sub-committees to contribute to the Island Plan, Immigration policy, Privatisation etc.

We have sought individual members to take on roles with Environmental, Educational and Transport connotations. To those who have accepted. Thank you very much.

The DHL agreement signed in March 1996, which runs for 5 years, needed some fine tuning and we successfully negotiated with DHL this week.

We have also been working with FIDC on the new multipurpose building project. This concept is not simply a matter of having a bigger office. Administration will operate in an area not much larger than it presently works in, but we also have a need to provide good clean, safe and secure floor space to handle the increasing volume of DHL ins and outs. Additionally, it is felt we should have an area within the building which will lend itself to holding meetings and functions in a comfortable atmosphere for our membership and your guests. I expect the next AGM to be held in the new building and I am sure you will all be very proud of it.

Looking forward apart from the regular work, the Council will need to continue to work hard on highly important issues such as Privatisation, Immigration and the wider Island Plan. But you must guide us, it is not acceptable to us to put words in your mouth, nor reasonable that you remain silent.

A quick glance back and then forward again. Government should understand that if the Private Sector is to be successful in bringing new business to the Falklands they will have to accept a little less of the market share to create competitiveness.

I would like to congratulate all our membership for their dedication, hard work, commitment and not a little risk taking. In providing employment, training, opportunity and services for the better lifestyle of our Country's community. Your contribution to the Islands' economy should also be more widely appreciated.

Finally, I see the potential for many of you to work together, whether it be in joint ventures, arms length relations or co-operation. Think about it. Happy trading and good luck.

Week ending 13.3.98 from Falkland Islands Wool Marketing, Peter Marriot.

GENERAL: Wool trade comments on the state of the market have been fractionally more cheerful this week. Three large Bradford clients I visited were talking of a rather better call for deliveries, and even mentioned the occasional new orders booked from the export as well as the home trade market. More widely, there is some satisfaction with a steadier and then slightly firmer Australian market these crumbs of wool market comfort have to be set against continuing difficulties in the British sector. The market was well down again at this weeks Bradford sale with only about 34% of the offering sold at the auction itself, increased to nearly 60% at post sale negotiation. Prices are generally lower and confidence limited in this low crossbred sector.

WOOL NEWS

For week ending 20/3/98 from Keith Atack.

GENERAL: "For those in the UK wool trade the budget may have provided some grounds for personal relief, but reactions on currency markets increased the agony for exporters. There are also worries about the greater likelihood of another damaging interest rate rise after recent vacillation by the Bank of England and its advisors. Sterling was already at or approaching new peaks against my European currencies, and these further increases meant that comparisons related to about 10 years ago. The problems of higher export pricing increase with times, as old orders run out and earlier attempts at currency hedging expire.

There is the associated problems of import competitions. This arises at every stage from raw wool onwards, and at the full manufactured end it erodes home market share among retailers.

Since they in turn found sales in February were below expectations, they are in no mood to pay significantly higher prices just because a product is home produced. The small consolation in this new bout of sterling strength is that those forced to sell at cut prices earlier are able to buy replacement wool at slightly lower prices because sterling is also strong against the Australian and New Zealand dollars, and to some extent against the US dollar. Thus prices which in wool terms have tended gradually dearer in Australia, are little changed or even cheaper in sterling terms."

"The contract is currently planned to start its phase-in period in early 1999, this phase-in period is expected to last for approximately 6 months before full contract start-up." "The numbers of equipment that would require supporting on the islands would be in the order of 30, these are mainly forklift trucks of various lifting capacities but it could also include trailers and some agricultural equipment." "We are required to make our first response to the Ministry of Defence by early May 1998 on how we would maintain and support our equipment during the contract. I would therefore appreciate any advice or help that you may be able to give us on obtaining local support in the Islands."

CREDIT CARDS FACILITIES

FIDC has forwarded information from Barclays Bank regarding the above facilities with application form for any business interested in Merchant membership. (It has to be noted that Barclays Merchant Services are not the only source to offer this service.) FIDC wish to point out two points which members should consider when applying for facilities.

- 1. Offering cash facilities through the Card. In general the International Merchant Agreement clause 3.1.4 specifically states that cash cannot be offered via the credit card transactions. If this is done then the liability, should anything go wrong, lies entirely with the Merchant/Trader.
- 2. Accounting and Administration. There are basically two main areas which the Trader has to consider. (a) Sales commission of 5% deducted from the payment made by Barclays to the Trader. This will need to be considered in Sales pricing. (b) The cost of communication with the Authorisation Centre. All expenditure over the floor limit has to be cleared through the Authorisation Centre in UK.

For week ending 27.3.98 from Keith Atack

"General: Trading conditions have still not eased for those involved in wool textiles. Currency is still the main factor depressing prices. This is chiefly through making life difficult on the export side, but there is also at every stage the effect of import competition. It is not simply a matter of losing out to cheaper manufacture products from abroad. Those with sourcing overseas are able to offer semi-manufacturers at prices undercutting the domestic producer, and when there is this sort of two tier pricing it is the lower level which wins. The overseas suppliers price is used as a lever by potential buyers to push down prices for the home supplier, and a lower market level emerges.

The gloomy spell thus continues for the wool trade and attempts to detect light at the end of the tunnel nowadays seem to rely on some shortages on the merino wool supply side for a few months ahead."

Taken from Flight International 28 - 31 March 1998 "Falkland Islands airline ready to launch operations in April. A new UK airline will launch operations from the Falkland Islands in mid-April in support of the region's emerging oil industry. In the longer term the airline has ambitions to become a British Airways franchise. British South Atlantic Airways has signed a short-term deal with Australia's National Jet Systems for the wet lease of a British Aerospace 146-100, which it plans to replace in the second half of this year with a Boeing 737-200. The airline has been set up by Adrian Noskwith, founder of the UK charter company Centreline Aviation, and Falklands Islands entrepreneur Mike Summers.

"We will start weekly flights on 15 April, between Mount Pleasant Airport (East Falkland) and Sao Paulo (Brazil) via Montevideo (Uruguay), under a charter contract to an oil company," says Summers. The first oil rig is due in the area at about the same time the service is launched.

By September the airline is aiming to have expanded to a twice weekly service to open up the route to Falkland Islands residents. "By then we plan to have introduced a 737-200 on dry lease from British Airways," says Summers. BA's consultancy division Speedwing has been involved in the formation of the carrier, and the new airline is understood to have discussed franchise operations. At the moment the only services to the Falklands from the UK are operated by Royal Air Force Lockheed TriStars via Ascension Island. The airline aims to provide an alternative, linking through Sao Paulo, which BA serves directly from London. The airline believes that it can offer BA "two bites of the cherry" providing it with Uruguay feed as well as traffic from the Falklands. Longer term plans include the development of a regional network from Sao Paulo to points such as Lima in Peru, Santa Cruz in Bolivia, and Asuncion in Paraguay. The only direct air link from the Falklands to South America is operated by LanChile using 737-200s between Mount Pleasant and Santiago via Punta Arenas. Chilean airline Aerovias DAP had previously been serving the Islands from Punta Arenas." This is the full article

WOOL NEWS

For Week Ending 3rd April 1998 from Keith Atack

GENERAL: Despite some fairly large reductions in merino wool prices this week, the market in Australia closed firm and with some hopes that a low point might have been passed. Heavy offerings in the final auctions before the Easter recess accelerated the Australian price decline. Many in the world wool trade had expected and anticipated softness at this stage. Western European buyers were active as prices fell, however, as they identified a possible buying opportunity. Weakness in the Australian dollar underlined the advantage for anyone wanting to cover earlier sales at higher prices. Profitable trading for much of the industry has for many months depended on taking on business at prices well ahead of the market's decline, and waiting to match them with purchases later on. This applied not only with wool itself, but further down in the manufacturing line, and there is hope in today's depressed market that customers in turn are showing more interest as they sense a good opportunity to cover anything oversold and a market low point. The emphasis is still more on home trade opportunities than on anything available on the export side. Sterling strength against Europe makes it extremely difficult to sell there.

In its latest report, the 'think-tank' group argues that although traditional social class differences largely mirror the splits between information-rich and information-poor, there are some steps which The report states that by 2000, 70 per cent of the UK government could take to bridge the gaps professionals, but only 40 per cent of the unskilled poor, will own a personal computer (PC). Advances such as electronic cash could exclude certain groups such as the elderly and the poor from enjoying the benefits, it says. Policy makers need to act swiftly if they are to prevent information exclusion becoming a major problem in the next century.""

If changes are considered they are still likely to be reductions, reflecting continued softness in the Australian and NZ Dollar and the strength in Sterling.

Market Report for Week Ending 8/5/98 from Keith Atack

No General Section this week.

AUSTRALIA: "The Australian wool market rose strongly this week at sales held in Sydney and Melbourne. The eastern market indicator closed the week 24 cents (or 3.9%) higher at 644 cents/kg clean. The indicator rose 15 cents on Wednesday and 9 cents on Thursday. There were not sales in Freemantle this week.

Prices for all combing category indicators rose this week. Of the eastern category indicators the 20 and 21 micron rose 36 and 33 cents respectively, while the 19 and 22-30 micron indicators closed between 16 and 25 cents higher. The 31 micron indicator rose 5 cents. The Merino carding indicator firmed 2 cents while the crossbred carding indicator eased 3 cents.

This week a total of 39,332 bales was offered for sale of which the trade bought 89.5%. Trade clearance rates in Sydney and Melbourne were 91.1% and 88.3% respectively. Trade competition was led by Japanese interests and western European buyers with good support from most sectors of the trade.

Market Report for Week Ending 15/5/98 from Peter Marriott.

General: "Some new orders have been placed as a result of the markets recovery mainly in Merino wool values. Traders, however, are reluctant to follow these increases and booking business at the earlier/lower levels.

When trading is on a hand to mouth basis, and many firms are selling uncovered at severely cut prices in the hope that the price decline will continue for a little longer - they are not in any hurry to improve on their buying levels.

Crossbreds have followed the Merino rise very slowly, but a sale of British wools this week plus a further offering in New Zealand will show whether the firmer tendency is spreading down the line.

Softness in Sterling has raised hopes of better export prospects, but there is a long way to go before ground lost in the past 18 months can be regained.

The international wool textile organisation made the following statement this week. "World wool production has fallen for the eighth successive year to a post second world war low. Prices remain weak because of Australia boosting supplies by selling from a stockpile and depressed by financial problems in Asia, particularly Japan.

Wool Report Week Ending 12 June, 1998

"Wool trade comments locally are as gloomy as ever, and British company results have recently come through indicating about turns from profit to loss.

Deliveries are not going as well as they did, there is intense competition for new business, and sometime it is only the need to keep machinery activity which leads to orders coming through. There is discreet mention of operation on a reduced scale, verging on a short time.

As for the world wool market, Australian market indicators yesterday managed to show fractional upturns, but if allowance is made for weakness in the Australian dollar the price trend has still to be downwards.

Hopes of developing improvement depend on better competition for wool, and at least it can be said that a little less was withdrawn at auction this week. Stockpile pricing is also firmer. Coupled with a minor upturn in the Australian dollar yesterday, it is just possible to consider a firmer, or anyway steadier, future for wool regards.

Wool Report Week Ending 19 June, 1998 from Peter Marriott

With the home trade witnessing a slowdown in deliveries and a lack of new business the mood remains grim. Currency again looms large in everyone's assessment of the immediate outlook, not least because the effects of a weak yen on Japans neighbours in Asia. The importance of Japanese demand in world wool trade cannot be over-emphasised, and with Japans economy having now officially entered a recession, the extent of underlying softness plaguing the international wool market is clear.

There is a relatively small volume of wool to offer up to the mid season recess and this factor could lend a degree of short term firmness to the market. Australia now has a secondary stockpile, that held by growers withdrawing wool that failed to meet their reserve. This is estimated unofficially at 800,000 bales with the official stockpile at 1,146,000 bales.

"With combing plants everywhere, all conscious of inadequate demand and the need to keep plants running rather than face the problems of short-time operation, hopes of holding firmly to current already highly competitive levels have receded yet again. Combing plants are unable to keep up seven day working, with five days becoming typical. Where there has been business in the past two or three weeks, volume had been bought at the cost of very low selling prices.

Wool trade leaders met in Dreden for the annual international wool conference, and though the meetings and social life were successful enough, it cannot be said that anyone in the trade, from wool production down to retail, found much to be bullish about."

With machinery activity increasingly difficult to maintain even at below capacity levels, the outset of the holiday season can help to postpone a decision on whether to move to short time working or lay off workers for long periods.

A move of this sort illustrates the depth of the recession. Warehouses are full with undelivered orders with no information when they will be called for - and paid for - when conditions are so difficult.

Market Report for Week Ending 7/8/98 From Peter Marriott

Extract. Press Announcement: Stockpile freeze in wool crisis. Sales from the Australian stockpile have been frozen for 12 months by Australia's federal government. The decision took the industry by surprise. Urgent measures were already being discussed with farmers being asked for the views on how to deal with the stockpile and the wool crisis. It is understood that Wool International, the organisation with the task of stockpile disposal, has already called a halt to sales. What will happen in the next 12 months to their staff and storage is not known. The stockpile amounts to just over one million bales, having started when the floor price scheme collapsed at five million bales. Legislation will presumably be needed to put the freeze into effect officially and since the Australian political scene is precarious uncertainty in the Industry and in the world wool-using trade is considerable. Australian Wool Council president Rod Thirkell Johnson called the move absurd and thought it would create substantial uncertainty in the international market.

From Attorney General's Chambers

"IMPORTED LABOUR

1. At a recent meeting of Executive Council it had before it a Paper in which the possibility of the government engaging overseas labour to undertake a number of capital projects was mentioned. The Paper contemplated that the Falkland Islands Government might wish to engage this labour, not at prevailing local rates for persons locally resident, but at rates which were competitive in the country of recruitment and which might well, there, be substantially lower than those generally prevailing locally even after taking into account the cost to the Falkland Islands Government of food and accommodation which it would provide.

- 2. It was clear that implementation of any such proposal would have a number of possible implications and before taking a decision one way or another, Executive Council wished consultation to take place.
- 3. You may be aware that whenever in recent years the Falkland Islands Government has engaged labour from overseas, it has sought to do so on terms which have had the effect that overall overseas labour costs have been no cheaper than local labour costs would have been, if workers had been available for engagement locally.
- 4. For some years the Falkland Islands Government had inserted a "fair wages" condition in its contracts requiring the contractor to pay wages which, after taking into account the cost of any food or accommodation provided by the employer are not less than those prevailing under the Stanley Wages Agreement. As you know, the Stanley Wages Agreement has now become defunct because the Government's former hourly paid employees are now remunerated in accordance with arrangements which, previously, only applied to "established" staff. I believe that the same rules apply, or at least ought to apply, in relation to labour employed by the private sector and by FIG. There is a choice to have rules of the kind I have mentioned or to have no such rules
- 5. It could be argued that if the Falkland Islands Government were to intervene in this way costs would be artificially inflated above those that they would otherwise be and that this would be aggravated because there is little competition in the local labour market. Equally it could be argued that it is not sensible for the Falkland Islands Government to intervene and cause overseas employees to be paid at rates which are well above those for which they would be prepared to contract.
- 6. There are issues also, of course, in relation to the provision of accommodation for labour recruited overseas to do work in the Falkland Islands. A few months ago a Uruguayan firm had in mind to set up a local company to recruit stevedores in Uruguay which they proposed to accommodate in containers. While I appreciate that in some desperately poor countries persons are accommodated in far worse conditions than that, I personally believe that the Falkland Islands would be open to the greatest criticism if we were to adopt the sort of practices which the Uruguayan company had in mind.
- 7 I have tried, in writing the above, to outline the issues which arise. Other associated issues may occur to recipients of this letter. I invite views on the issues so that I may bring them to the attention of the Executive Council. I would be grateful, therefore, if recipients would write to me with any views they might wish to express and to do so by the end of September.
- 8. I would be happy, if wished by a number of people to do so, to organise one or more meetings to discuss the issues and to attempt to arrange for other appropriate Falkland Islands Government officers to be present at any such meeting.

Market Report Week Ending 28/8/98 from Peter Marriott

GENERAL: China is the worlds leading buyer of wool and the limited and occasional demand from there recently is one of the reasons for wools world market problems. Weakness in the Australian & New Zealand Dollar, has cancelled the minor market improvements in Australia offsetting any price increases in Sterling terms. What is badly needed is Europe back to full time working after the summer recess and a period of firm primary markets to encourage clients to look further than immediate requirements. The recovery is seen as precariously based on the stockpile freeze rather than the pull of demand. The latest twist in the saga of Australian Government vacillation in it's wool industry interference may mean that 16,000 bales of stockpile wool will be available before the end of September. Apparently it all depends on how quickly legislation can go through Parliament.

WOOL NEWS

Market Report week ending 18/9/98 from Keith Atack

General: "Wool prices in the main Southern Hemisphere selling centres fell to new low points for the season, and indeed wool is cheaper than at any time for five years. However, price itself is not the real problem - except that falling prices prompt would be buyers to hold off in the expectation that tomorrow may bring an even lower quotation. The real problem is the chronic lack of confidence within the processing industry and the continued lack of substantive international demand at the consumer level. The general unease is inevitably heightened by, on one level, political wrangles in Australia and their possible implications for stockpile sales and wider market stability, and on another level by problems in the world economy. New wool textile business remains very hard to come by, and hardly anyone claims to be trading profitably. Some are processing wool merely to keep machinery active. However the subdued call for deliveries means warehousing are filling up. Shut downs and lay offs are already occurring at an uncomfortable rate.

Further to discussion at Informal Discussion session held on 2nd Sept, the following information has been sent by Mr Andrew Gurr, Chief Executive: "It is our view that we need certain headline information in order to enable central economic planning to take place more efficiently. Therefore what we would need from each business is -

- 1 Turnover broken down by type of activity
- 2 Net payroll costs per type of activity
- 3 Number of equivalent full-time people employed in each activity
- 4 Key job salary ranges"

Mr Gurr goes on to say "I believe that all your members will be able to appreciate the value of this information, particularly with regard to comparisons between the private and public sectors, which are of considerable importance to both of us. In addition to the above information we feel it would be useful to have a quarterly report on business confidence which would be done by means of a simple questionnaire, ticking boxes, asking such questions as whether the business is planning investment in the coming year and whether they are more or less confident than during the previous quarter. This will help to give us a much better feel for attitudes towards the future than we have at present."

Mr Gurr notes that in the UK many small businesses spend a disproportionate amount of their time filling in forms for Government and considers that to be totally unacceptable.

LONDON PRESS SERVICE UPDATE, ISSUE 73, 1 SEPT 1998

Small Companies are 'Reluctant to Update Equipment' ITN 8/73/1. Technological awareness is driving a gap between those that are willing to accept change and those that are not, according to a survey. Research has revealed that two thirds of United Kingdom companies are not willing to change and risk losing out to those competitors who have embraced the information age. Directors from 550 companies were surveyed by BT (formerly British Telecom) which found that the typical company profile of those sceptical of change were those

with the lowest turnover and the least number of employees. Of the third that were using new technologies, a vast number - 88 per cent - used e-mail and the Internet to aid their business. Despite the costs of introducing new systems nearly half of the companies believed that investing in new technologies would improve their competitive edge. E-commerce - selling goods and equipment via the Internet - is also high on many companies' agenda for the future, with 40 per cent predicting that they would be selling goods online within five years. Video conferencing and recruiting via the Internet were also considered a priority. The 'millennium bug' (Year 2000 compliance) continued to be a major concern for British business, with 17 per cent believing that they would still be trying to exorcise the bug by 2003.

ACQUISITION OF CROWN LAND

A paper re the above has been forwarded to the Chamber of Commerce Office by Crown Counsel, A A M Inglis. Extract from Introductory: "Over recent years as land transactions have become more frequent and more complex, FIG has developed systems for dealing with applications for and the allocation of Crown Land. The following is a summary of the normal procedures which FIG requires to be followed by any person interested in acquiring Crown Land, whether by purchase or lease, for residential or commercial purposes. The prices quoted are correct as at October 1998."

Extract from Residential Land in Stanley: "East Stanley Development. Serviced residential building plots are available for sale within the East Stanley development area at a price of approximately £28,000 per acre. This price includes hardstanding and ranch style fencing. A waiting list for plots within the East Stanley development area is maintained by the Environmental Planning Office. At present plots are being allocated to persons on the priority waiting list. The priority list is open to persons who do not already own more than one house, and who are (1) individuals who are resident in the Falkland Islands and who have status under the Falkland Islands Constitution, or (2) resident individuals who hold a permanent residence permit, or (3) non-resident individuals who have status under the Falkland Islands Constitution and who can demonstrate a definite return date to the Falkland Islands within the next two years."



SMARTQUILL REMEMBERS ALL YOU WRITE STN8/82/1 "A Pen developed by British Telecom (BT) remembers all that its user writes by computerised technology. As its name 'Smartquill' suggests, the device incorporates a personal miniaturised computer - an electronic technology enabling all hand-written notes to be stored indefinitely. Using a mobile telephone network the Smartquill can send a letter or a few notes to a computer anywhere in the world. The pen is described as a miniaturisation of the personal organiser. It was

devised by researchers at BTs Martlesham Heath laboratories, eastern England. Laptop keyboards could not be reduced any further and still accommodate fingers so, in the case of Smartquill, the keyboard has been abandoned altogether. The pen translates hand movements into text by a technique said to be very similar to that used to activate a computer by voice signals. Smartquill - which is expected to be marketed at the cost of a few hundred pounds sterling in two years' time - is one of BT's many research projects which will make personal organisers, communications and computing more mobile and miniaturised than before. The pen can also operate as a diary, calendar and database. Smartquill is expected to be a boon to those writing in languages with characters which traditional keyboards find it difficult to register such as Chinese and Japanese. BT has already filed patent applications to cover the new invention.

Workers will have the right to a national minimum wage, and there will be penalties for non-compliance, and other main provisions coming into effect on that date will give the Gov the power to appoint a statutory Low Pay Commission and the power to appoint an enforcement agency. WOOL NEWS

Market Report for Week Ending 4/12/98 from Peter Marriott

GENERAL. "Any doubts regarding the underlying strength of the primary markets relate to the degree of weakness before and after Christmas. A basis for future wool market firmness after prolonged falls does seem possible, above earlier low points. Farmers have already shown in Australia that they will resist lower auction prices by withdrawing wool before it comes up for the auction, or at reserves during the auction. The private stockpile is now as large as the official one, which is frozen until July, at least. The demand, supply and situation could gradually be turning for the better. However, in the Bradford trade no one at the moment can think of the good times returning in the immediate future & clients are still reluctant to talk about future prices or indeed orders, which continue to be for small weights for prompt delivery. Whether wool markets bottom out or not, there can be no quick return to buoyant & profitable trading further down the processing line. Indeed only today G Modiano Ltd announced the combing plant they have in the UK in Bradford will close at the end of December blaming interest rates, an overpriced currency and a huge overcapacity in the industry."

WOOL NEWS

Market Report for week ending 11.12.98 from Peter

General: "With interest rates down another (sorry cannot read the per cent quoted) it is clear that UK officialdom is recognising the recession more fully. The wool trade knew already how bad things were & how bad they had been, especially on the export side for many months. There are similar problems even between different parts of the wool trade, crossbreds, including British wool, have been looking firmer than merinos just recently. British wools became dearer again this week, again, because of export (Chinese) demand for fleece wool. There has also been demand from the scouring side. All this did nothing to help the topmakers who continue to find little or no interest and are finding competition from cheap imported South American tops damaging. For the moment business remains poor. There is no more than a trickle of interest at extremely low prices. There are remote hopes that a basis may be gradually emerging from which a dearer price trend will develop - what is clear is that it will be after the Christmas recess before this happens. WOOL REPORT

Market Report for week ending 18/12/98 from Peter

General: "At the opening in Australia this week wool prices were firm to dearer and it looked as if the wool markets would end with hopes of a firmer trend continuing. However, on the final day yesterday the market fell back, leaving the main indicator just 5 points higher on the week.

The year has been difficult to the point of disastrous, but if dearer prices should develop after the Christmas recess 1999 could look much more hopeful.

In fact the market moved erratically up and then down. The pre Christmas close could scarecly be more uncertain, but the possibilities of a firmer trend is still there. It is difficult at present to find more than theoretical support in the local trade for this more hopeful forecast for the wool outlook. The demand aspect, does not look encouraging in the UK or Europe. However, Internationally the far east is looking more hopeful with China and other Asian countries said to be buying more in Australia as well as New Zealand."
