- i. S.C.C. has now decided as a matter of United Kingdom policy that postal packets classified as "important" and condemned in United Kingdom shall be dealt with as follows:-
- (a) All repeat all innocuous mail to be released except correspondence suspected of conveying secret messages or connected in any way with cases.
 - (b) All repeat all terminal mail to be released except: correspondence to or from statutory list firms and outgoing personal letters between 1939 and 1941 attempting financial transactions to secure escape of persons from enemy territory (these 2 categories in effect cover the whole correspondence recommended for condemnation by TED). Letters recommended for condemnation by TED will be destroyed.
 - (ii) Correspondence considered to be required by procurator general for evidence in Prize Court cases. Those considered to be required by procurator general will be retained for the time being.

Circular No. 151. With reference to my telegram No. 129 circular. Disposal of condemned postal packets. It has now been decided as a matter of policy that, except as provided below all postal packets classified as "important" should be released. The following exceptions have been made in case of postal packets condemned in the United Kingdom.

- (1) Transit mails. Correspondence suspected of conveying secret messages or connected in any way with espionage cases.
- (2) Terminal mails. (a) Correspondence to or from statutory list firms and outgoing personal letters between 1939 and 1941 attempting financial transactions to secure the escape of persons from enemy territory (these two categories in effect cover the whole recommended for condemnation by TED) letters recommended for condemnation by TED) letters recommended for condemnation by TED will be destroyed. (b) Correspondence considered to be required by the procurator general for evidence in the Prize Court cases. Those considered to be required by the procurator general will be retained for the time being. (c) Correspondence condemned on behalf of security services and service departments retention of which is still considered by them essential in the interests of security. Relevant submissions will be examined by the respective advisers in conjunction with censorship department.

All papers and documents detained in the United Kingdom from travellers will be released whenever a forwarding address has been given.

In so far as is relevant and practicable it is desirable that this procedure should be followed in all Colonial territories.

Separate instructions have been issued to colonies concerned with regard to correspondence required in Frize Court cases.


