Herewith my comments and suggestions re the Sir Winston Churchill Issue.

- (a) Denominations. I suggest 16p and 20p. 16p is a genuine air mail rate and 20p can be allied to a number of minor rates - both local and external.
- (b) First Day Cover. The suggested C/A design, is I feel, too large. A smaller envelope would be more appropriate to a two stamp issue.
- (c) Souvenir Sheet. I think a folded sheet would be more suited with the Coat of Arms appearing on the outside and the stamps affixed inside. There is a printing error on the attached specimen sheet - "RIRTH".
- (d) Quantities. These are very difficult to estimate but I would say 50,000 of each value would be sufficient for local requirements. This figure includes our estimate requirements of FDCs and Souvenir Sheets i.e. 6,000 FDC and 4,000 Souvenir Sheets.
- (e) Selling Price. I would suggest the following. First Day Covers 45p and Souvenir Sheets 43p.
- (f) If at all possible we should press for despatch by sea. RRS "John Biscoe" is a possibility. We should keep in touch with C/A on this point, especially nearer the actual sailing date.
- (g) The introduction of a Souvenir Sheet is something new in our stamp dealings. I have no idea of production costs and perhaps it would be advisable to seek C/A advice regarding my quantity and price suggestion.

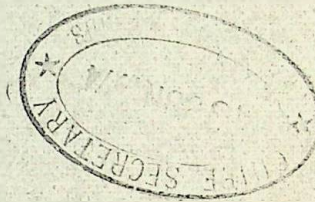

CENTENARY OF THE BIRTH OF CHURCHILL

We refer to your savings-gramme No.84 in connection with the above to the Foreign and Commonwealth Office and our interim reply of the 19 April 1974.

2 As explained in our letter we commissioned one of our artists, Julian Vasarhelyi, to produce two rough stamp designs and a speculative souvenir sheet design for this issue along with the usual first day cover design. In order to save time Mr Vasarhelyi has produced the stamp designs as finished artwork but will be pleased to make any alterations that you may require. The souvenir sheet design has, of course, been produced as a rough as this is a speculative design.

3 The portraits of Sir Winston Churchill are deemed to be very lifelike and in order that the portrait can accommodate the majority of the space, the Royal Cypher instead of the usual portrait of HM the Queen has been utilised. It is hoped that this will meet with your approval.

4 At the present time the designs do not feature a value tablet and it is felt that this could be inserted, probably white-out in the bottom righthand corner of each denomination.

5 The speculative souvenir sheet design is quite simple and merely features the Coat of Arms of Sir Winston. We trust that you will agree that this makes a very attractive issue of stamps but naturally we await your comments before proceeding further.

6 When returning the two pieces of finished artwork and the rough designs to us, perhaps you would be kind enough to advise the denominations to be used and the quantity of stamps required for local sale. At the same time perhaps you would be kind enough to advise as to whether you wish the souvenir sheet to be included in the issue and again to indicate the requirements for local sale.

7 A simple first day cover design featuring the Churchill Coat of Arms has been produced for the first day cover design. At the present time it does not include the Territory title (Falkland Islands) but this could be accommodated vertically along the lefthand side of the envelope.


8 When returning this design to us, we would be grateful to learn the quantities required by yourselves for local sale and we will add to this quantity the number of first day covers required for sale by the Crown Agents Stamp Bureau.

9 With regard to the stamps required for fixation to the covers, perhaps you would be kind enough to include the quantity required for your own supplies ~~to~~ the quantity of stamps required for local sale, and we will then add to that quantity the extra stamps required for the Crown Agents Bureau supply. When advising these quantities we would also be grateful to learn the selling price of the first day covers in order that the Crown Agents Stamp Bureau can sell at the same price as yourselves.

10 We look forward to hearing from you in connection with this issue as soon as possible in order that the anticipated release date of 30 November 1974 can be maintained. We do, however, feel that it is only fair to point out at this moment that shipping opportunities may not avail themselves and in view of this, despatch by airfreight may have to take place. We will, of course, keep you advised of this situation as it arises.

With reference to your letter ref: HLD/FALK IS 4/12297/1 and /2 of 30 May addressed to the Chief Secretary, I now return the art-work which I consider to be admirable, particularly the one showing the battle cruisers in the background.

2. I am happy that the Royal Cypher is used instead of a potrait of Her Majesty The Queen.

3. I have the following further comments:-

(a) Denominations

I suggest 16p and 20p.

(b) First Day Cover

The suggested design we feel is too large and a smaller envelope would be more appropriate to a two-stamp issue.

(c) Souvenir Sheet

We consider the folded sheet would be more suitable with the Coat of Arms appearing on the outside and the stamps affixed on the inside. You have no doubt noticed the printing error on the specimen sent to us - ie "rirth" instead of birth.

(d) Quantities

We estimate 50,000 of each value would be sufficient for local requirements. This figure includes our estimated

requirements of FDCs and Souvenir Sheets, that is 6,000 FDCs and 4,000 Souvenir Sheets.

(e) Selling Price

We suggest First Day Covers should sell at 45p and Souvenir Sheets at 43p.

4. In regard to despatch, perhaps the stamps could be sent out by sea as the RRS "Biscoe" (the British Antarctic Survey ship) might get here on time. In any case we will be in touch with you nearer the actual sailing date.

5. We have had very little experience of Souvenir Sheets and, therefore, have no idea of production costs. We would welcome your advice regarding the quantities and prices as suggested above.

2. It is proposed that the release date for the issue will be 30th November 1974.

Thank you for your letter of 18 June regarding the above.

✓ I am having the First Day Cover size reduced from 110mm x 220mm to 114mm x 162mm as this is the smallest size available (and is also the smallest size which we can have the design, stamp and address on).


... ✓ In view of the fact that you have had very little experience in the field of souvenir sheets, I am enclosing an example for your perusal.

✓ The stamps and souvenir sheets are printed at the same time on a ^{single} sheet and ~~are~~ not a presentation folder. These sheets can be stuck, whole, on envelopes and used for postal purposes. I hope that this helps you realise what souvenir sheets are.

✓ Souvenir sheets usually sell for the face value of the stamps, in this instance 36p, and cost c £20 per thousand to produce, although this varies according to the number of colours on the souvenir sheet and the quantity required.

I hope that this information is of help to you.

Following my brief acknowledgment of your letter of 18 June 1974 in connection with the Sir Winston Churchill issue of postage stamps I thought you might be interested in a few more details concerning first day covers and souvenir sheets.

In this respect I have spoken to John Watts, my colleague on the philatelic marketing side, who is of the opinion that whilst it would not be unreasonable to charge an additional 9p for the First Day Cover, provided the design is good value for money - as it undoubtedly is - ~~but~~ we could hardly justify deviating from the standard practice of selling souvenir sheets at face value.


In my letter of 4 July I mentioned a rough figure of £20 per thousand souvenir sheets for printing costs which when compared with a face value of £360 per thousand shows a relatively small outlay for a more than reasonable return.

We reckon that you might sell up to 75% as many souvenir sheets as ordinary stamps to collectors so whatever printing costs are incurred we can be virtually certain that they will be well covered.

One further point I would like to make is that "souvenir sheets" are entirely different from "presentation packs" although, in the case of the coinage issue, the souvenir sheet will be contained inside a card cover. Where presentation packs are produced it would be OK to charge over face value because of the additional packing etc.

The thing to bear in mind is that whilst your return on souvenir sheets, first day covers and presentation packs would be proportionately less than for purely mint stamps it would represent additional revenue, provided of course that it was not overdone when ~~of course~~ the law of diminishing return might take over.
