I have the honour to submit for approval the following suggestion:-
"That when the Board destroys the balance of the centenary stamps a number of high value stamps of the present issue to be destroyed at the same time. At present these stamps are in my safe and are of no use to collectors. The values are 5s., 10s., and 21 and have been accumulating since the year 1929. Formerly these defective stamps of high value were used for legal purposes but at present they are not required by that Department.
